Dear Mr. McCloy:

In accordance with request by telephone from Colonel William P. Scobey to Major Albert H. Moffitt, Jr., Civil Affairs Division, this headquarters, made on April 6, 1943, there are inclosed letters, this headquarters, dated June 13, 1942 (Incl. No. 1), and June 16, 1943 (Incl. No. 2), and a copy of General Orders No. 25 (Incl. No. 3), this headquarters dissolving the Wartime Civil Control Administration.

An attachment to the letter of June 13, 1942 (Incl. No. 1), is a copy of letter to the Assistant Chief of Staff, Civil Affairs Division, directing the making of all necessary arrangements for the transfer of evacuees from assembly centers to War Relocation Authority relocation centers. This directive by me was made under the provisions of Executive Order No. 9102 which, as you will recall, established War Relocation Authority. My letter of May 23, 1942, and the letters of June 13 and June 26, 1942, established a standard operating procedure to effect the purpose of Executive Order No. 9102 and covered the mechanics of such procedure only.
