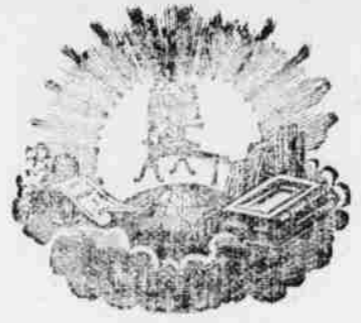

Mr. D. M. CROWLEY proposes to issue a full report of the trial of his libel suit against the Gazette Publishing Co., with commentaries thereon in open letters, in book form.

Messrs. EGAN & GUNN have just received per Australia a full line of black dress and dress gloves, black satin linings, shirts, etc.

The Queen street side of the Government building has been very tastefully draped in mourning, under the direction of Mr. John A. Hassinger, Chief Clerk of the Interior Department.

If the Alameda sailed from Auckland Jan. 25 as reported, she will be due here Friday night, or the day after, January 26 is the date she was to have sailed from Sydney by the new schedule.

HAWAII ENGINE CO. No. 4, of which the late King was an honorary member, has dressed its house on Nuuanu street in full mourning.

The committee of the Armory has meeting this morning presented to their Majesty the Queen Regent and the Queen Dowager the resolutions of condolence, and to His Excellency J. L. Stevens, United States Minister Plenipotentiary, and to Rear Admiral Bown, the resolutions of gratitude, respectively to the American Government and the Admiral, which were passed by that meeting Monday evening.

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE.

Mr. F. A. Schaefer, Vice-President, presided at the meeting of the Chamber of Commerce on Wednesday, stating the object in the following remarks:

This meeting of the members of this Chamber of Commerce has been called for the purpose of giving the members individually and the Chamber as a corporation an opportunity of expressing their feelings of deep sorrow at the demise of His late Majesty King Kamehameha in the prime of life, and of heartfelt sympathy with the bereaved Royal Family; also, for the purpose of expressing to the noble men and women of the United States, and especially of the State of California and of the City of San Francisco, as well as the Admiral in Command of the United States Pacific Squadron, the Captain, officers and men of the United States ship Charleston, the sense of the high esteem the members of this Chamber of Commerce entertain for them for all they have done for the late King while in life and then while death had laid him low.

Brief and feeling addresses were made by other members, and Messrs. A. J. Cartwright, T. R. Walker and W. G. Irwin, a committee for the purpose, reported resolutions to be presented to the Queen, the Queen Dowager, Admiral Bown and the officers of the Charleston. The report was adopted and the resolutions were ordered to be engrossed and presented to the respective persons for whom intended.

ERRORS IN THE MARKET.

The contractors had scarcely begun putting up the frame of the new market, when it was discovered that the walls were of masonry and had been made by the masons of England. No one there thought of the frame and it was not until the walls were up that the error was discovered.

THE KING'S HOPE.

Kalaka's Message to Minister Carter at Washington.

He Was Unconscious When the Good News Reached Him About the Hawaiian Treaty.

Colonel Macfarlane, Chamberlain to King Kalakaua of Hawaii, has changed his quarters and is at present a guest of Claus Spreckels. The Colonel is much grieved at the death of his royal friend and patron, and the fact that His Majesty became unconscious so rapidly adds another pang to his sorrow.

"If he had only retained his faculties a few hours longer," stated the Colonel, "I had news for him that would have lightened his heart during his final moments."

In the few days that preceded his death His Majesty talked with me on different subjects regarding Hawaii. He frequently entertained me regarding his relations with the United States, and he mentioned with great feeling how gratified he was at the kindness and friendliness displayed toward him by the officials and citizens of the United States.

"His last instructions to me," continued the Chamberlain, "were regarding the treaty existing between the two countries. He had me convey special instructions to Mr. Carter, the Hawaiian Minister at Washington, D. C., to ask Secretary Blaine to do everything in his power to set the treaty matter right with Congress."

The King's mind was much exercised over the present condition of affairs on this matter.

"He hoped he could carry back to the islands with him some definite assurance that our relations would not be disturbed."

"Three days after the conversation we had on this subject a message was received by me from Minister Carter to tell the King that President Harrison was going to send a special message to Congress this week urging the advisability of leaving the provisions of the treaty stand as they were."

"I hastened with the good news to His Majesty's bedside, knowing full well the pleasure it would afford him, but I found him unconscious."

The committee of the Kaunakapali meeting had a conference today. They are prepared to report to the adjourned meeting, which will be held at Kaunakapali Church this evening at 7:30 o'clock. A large attendance of the public is respectfully requested.

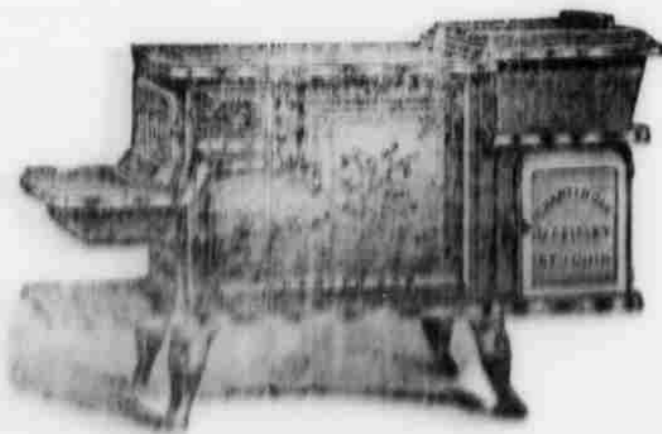

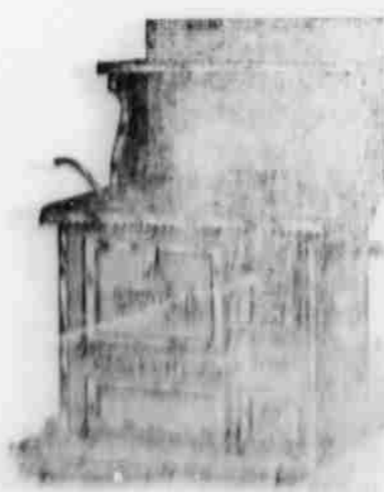

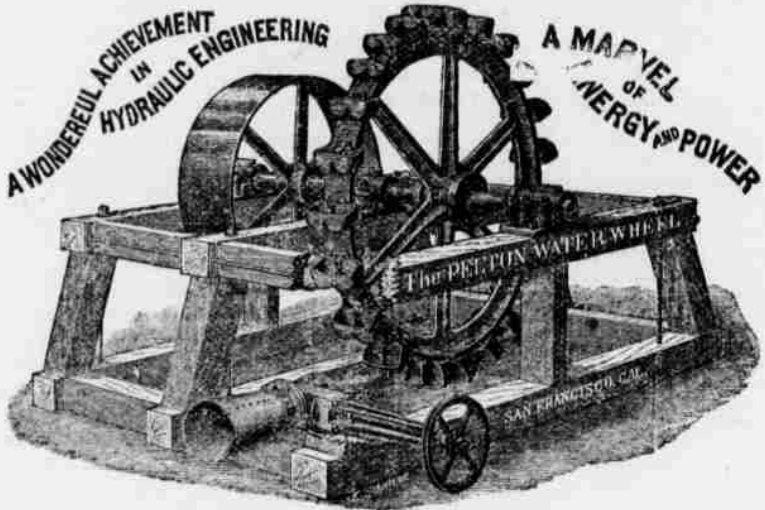
