ZURICH, Jan. 18.—I met this morning the continental expert of whose views as to the outlook of matters in the Mediterranean between France and England I have already given you some account. He accosted me with this question: "What is the meaning of a paragraph in the *Kohinoleu*..."

AN EXPERT ON CHINESE.

STATEMENTS BY MR. WRIGHT OF THE FOREIGN OFFICE.

The First Immigration—The Flood—Putting off the Gates—Tricky—Vagrants Here.

One of the most interesting and valuable chapters of Thurston's new annual is the treatment by H. W. Wright of the "Chinese Immigration to the Islands..."

Mr. Wright has been in the Foreign Office a number of years. During that period and while engaged in the newspaper business he had special facilities for studying the Chinese question..."

The first Chinese restriction regulations were established by the reform Cabinet of 1887. It was then feared that the influx of Chinese would be a great danger to the Hawaiian Islands..."

Section 1. The King will never receive the head of any person killed in war or in suppressing a rebellion..."

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to carry or display the severed head of an enemy killed in war or in suppressing rebellion..."

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of sections 1 and 2 of this ordinance shall be punished by imprisonment at hard labor for a period of not more than six years..."

Section 4. Any person violating the provisions of sections 1, 2, and 3 of this ordinance shall be punished by imprisonment at hard labor for a period of not more than six years..."

Section 5. The Supreme Court of Samoa shall have jurisdiction of all prosecutions under this ordinance..."
