SUBJECT: Relaxation of Passive Protection, V-E Day.

TO : Commanding Generals, Eastern and Southern
Defense Commands.

1. The capitulation of Germany will warrant relaxation in blackout and dim-out regulations, and in zoning regulations within the area of your command.

2. It is desired that you submit to the War Department your recommendations of action to be taken on this subject upon the capitulation of Germany, together with a draft of a public announcement which you will issue, pointing out clearly to the public the minimum passive protective measures which must be continued during the war against Japan.
