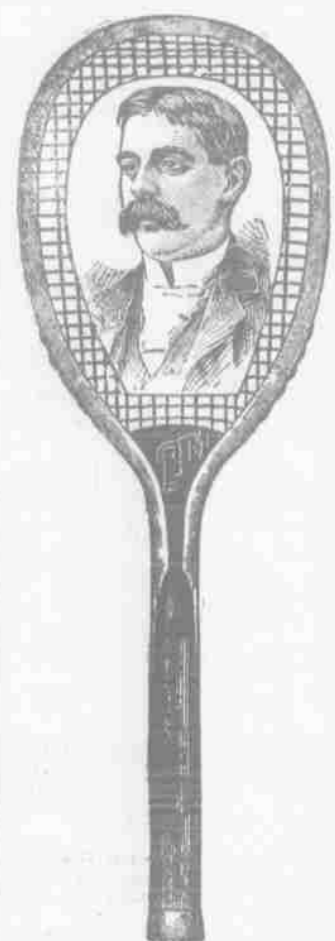

CASES FOR DIVORCE

TWO CIRCUIT JUDGES HEAR THEM.

Senator Kahlina's Alimony "Too Enormous"—An Insane Patient Sues His Wife for Separation.

A motion for a new trial was made this morning in the divorce suit of Mrs. Susan Kahlina vs. Senator I. H. Kahlina. The divorce was granted by Judge Humphreys. The defendant's attorneys, J. K. Kaula and J. M. Poole, ask for a new trial on the ground that the alimony allowed is "too enormous."

George S. Houghtaling, an inmate of the asylum for insane, has brought suit against Mrs. Becky Houghtaling for divorce, on the ground of adultery, the suit being brought by his guardian, B. W. Houghtaling. The couple were married in Honolulu in November 1898. The plaintiff was committed to the asylum last March.

Mrs. Bertha F. Hough has sued Luther W. Hough for divorce on the ground of failure to provide. The couple were married in August, 1892, in Honolulu.

Judge Humphreys and Robinson both heard divorce cases this morning. The first judge had the trial of De Greaves vs. De Greaves, being the third divorce suit the couple have brought into court. The wife sued first and lost, then the husband did the same and now the husband is suing again.

The case of Walsh vs. Walsh for annulment of marriage on the ground that the plaintiff Mrs. Walsh was too young to take the marriage vows is before Robinson, and will be continued this afternoon.
