Exiction of Equatters.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Dec. 26.-The Spanish squatters on the island of Larosts, government reservation, near the mouth of Charlotte harbor, must leave there at once, under orders from the Treasury Departmeat. The revenue cutter Hamilton, acting under orders, visited the island last week and Lieuterant F. S. Van Baskerick landed and deliver ed the ultimatum to the squatters. There were about forty, including men, women and children. They were found on the beach, ostensibly fishing. Over a year ago the cutter McLean visited the Island and captured a number of smugglers. They found that the island was made a rendezvous for smuggling liquors into the Florida mainland, the fish ing business being only a ruse. The island contains several hundred acres. Most of the people there are Spanish. If the equatters refuse to go within thirty days or so troops from Key West will be sent to send them away.

Sampson's Kick.

Washington, Dadember 20 .- The objection of Admiral W. T. S.mpson to that portion of Admiral Dewey's report of the Schley court of inquiry in which he says Admiral Schley was in command at the battle of Santiago and entitled to the credit of the victory was filed with Secretary Long today.

Sampson claims that the President and Navy Department had already decided that he was in command, and Schley second in command, and that this question was not referred to the court for consideration. He alleges that Schley's own statement fixes Sampson as commander.

Secretary Long today formally terminated the Sampson-Schley controversy so far as the Navy Department is concerned by approving the majority opinion of the court and dissolving that tribunal. The entire case is now closed.

One of the institutions here which has the special attention of tourists as well as the local people is the Mint, which is established on Nuuanu street, opposite Queen Emma Hall. Germany and Venezuela.

NEW YORK, Dec. 26 .- According to the Port of Spain (Trinidad) correspondent of the Herald, Germany intends to act vigorously against President Castro's government in Venezuela for the latter's failure to pay the interest on the debt owing the German bankers during the last three years. A naval demonstration, it is alleged, would have taken place by this time had it not been that the German cruiser Vineta needed repairs, and had to go to the United States for an overhauling.

Heavy Loss at Tafelkop.

LONDON, Dec. 24 -The list of casualties in an engagement fought by Colonel Dammant's force at Tafelkop, Orange River Colony, on December 20th, when the Boers, who were dressed as British yeomen, defended a kopje against Colonel Dam mants advance guard is heavier than was first reported by Lord Kitchener. It pow appears the British lost three officers and twenty-nine killed and had five officers and thirty-five men wounded.

An army order issued tonight announces that no volunters will be accepted in the future who are only able to devote to training purposes the time required for elementary barrack square drill. The Commander-in Chief points out in this connection that modern warfare has so changed conditions that in order that they shall be effective it is now imperative that the volunteers at tend the annual instruction camps and field maneuvers. It is generally believed that this order will wipe out a large majority of the present volunteers.

The War Office has decided to withdraw twenty batteries of artillery from South Africa at once. This action is taken on the ground that under the present conditions of guerrilla warfare the guns are of little use, and are rather a bindrance of mobility and decisive action.

Soon after the major left, a breeze carried the flames from a candle to the decorations, and in a moment there was fire all through the room. Mrs. Wood managed to get out on the verandah, and her screams for aid brought Mrs. Curtis from next door, and roused Mrs. J. C. Evans. They assisted the invalid to a place of safety, and while one roused the neighborhood the other celled the Fire Department.

It was a rally of women, and they work with a will. They started a bucket brigade, and Mrs. Evans, on. a ladder, soon broke through the roof where the blaze was working, and use a garden hose with effect.

It was only a short time until the fire was under control, a half bour perhaps, though there was much damage done to the furniture. The Department got as far as King street and the Waikiki road, and then seeing nothing, departed, and believed that it was a false slarm. The quick and clear headed work of the women alone prevented a fire which would have swept the row and perhaps caused loss of life.
