### NEMO'S COMPLIMENTS TO OMEN.

EDITOR BULLETIN:—  
The dispute between Omen and myself regarding the Ohio vote in 1883 is this. In the first place I claimed there were only 28,000 prohibitionists in Ohio, when Omen proved by a test vote for a prohibition Governor (the only true test) that there were only 8362 prohibitionists in Ohio. What should I do but drop it? For did not Omen come to my aid and help me out amazingly, by saying that there were only 8362 prohibitionists in Ohio? Certainly he did, and now no doubt regrets of having done so. My authority that the liquor dealers and prohibitionists worked together for forty years in support of the Adair law which gave to the liquor dealers free license for those years to sell liquors, is Murat Halstead; an authority that no amount of prohibition sophistry from Omen can wipe out. Omen says: "The N. Y. Voice is the leading prohibition paper in the U. S." Yes, Omen, and you also should have added, and the most unscrupulous. The Voice is a sheet that is prohibition to-day, to-morrow dickers with leading liquor dealers in New York for political purposes, and the next day sends a barrel of money to Nebraska to bribe honest voters against their convictions to vote for that curse prohibition. What was the result? Nebraska rolled up forty thousand majority against the cranks, and sent the Voice back to its lair, disgusted with itself and human nature. I said in one of my articles that prohibition was the worst curse that was ever hatched in America; and by degrees, I will prove it so, to the satisfaction of every reader of the BULLETIN (Omen included). Omen says that the "Farm Herald" is issued by the Liquor Dealers' National Protective Association. This Association has recently been writing to the post-masters of New York State for names of all voters, offering a premium for the information. The object being to send these voters the bogus Farm Herald. The information is asked for under the guise of the National Publishing Association, 142 West Main street, Louisville, Ky. Over the door at 142 West Main street, Louisville, Ky.—the headquarters of the association fraud—hang the following signs in large gold letters: "The J. M. Atherton Co., Wholesale Liquor Dealers; 'Brown Forman & Co., Wholesale Liquor Dealers.' The office of the Farm Herald and other bogus papers is in one corner of Mr. Atherton's whisky store very near the whisky barrels. This Farm Herald, whose very name is a fraud and deception, Nemo quotes to bolster up a bad cause." As far as the Farm Herald is concerned, the above is false; and goes to show that Omen is getting off his base worse than ever. The Farm Herald is, as its name implies, a purely farm paper in every sense of the word. And is headed "The Farm Herald, published monthly by the Farm Herald Company, 125 West Main St., Louisville, Ky." The corner of Mr. Atherton's whisky store that Omen seems so familiar with, might have been his old snoozing corner when so filled up with tangle-foot whisky, that he wouldn't know an office from a saw-mill. Again Omen says: "The N. Y. Voice, in this as in other cases, hunted these things into their holes." Read the following, Omen, and see how nicely the biters were bitten. It is quoted from the South West: "We referred, two weeks ago, to the controversy between ex-Senator Ingalls and the prohibition people, which has since then developed so beautifully that we must return to it once more. It will be remembered that Ingalls delivered a speech at Prohibition Park, in which he said, in substance, what everybody knew already, namely: that prohibition in Kansas had proved a very sorry failure. The N. Y. Voice took exceptions to this, and comparing this speech with an article on the same subject in the Forum a couple of years ago, thought these two statements of the case irreconcilable, and forthwith sent a circular to Kansas officials, asking whether they really concurred in lawbreaking in the degree and manner described by Ingalls. This became known to Ingalls and he wrote a letter to the Voice which is printed in its current number. "In it Mr. Ingalls says that his Prohibition Park speech had been 'an extemporaneous address,' and that the Voice's quotation from it was 'incorrect, imperfect and mutilated.' The latter point the Voice meets by stating that there is ample proof that its report is correct, and by asking Mr. Ingalls to please particularize. The reply to the first we must give in the Voice's own words. It is too good to be condensed. It seems Ingalls cheated the pious people of the Prohibition Park enterprise in a most outrageous manner, so beautifully insincere themselves, for the Voice says: 'Nor will his plea that the speech was 'extemporaneous' do him any credit. The management of Prohibition Park paid him a very large sum on the understanding that he was to deliver a carefully-prepared, new lecture. The management were cheated. The lecture was not, except in a very few brief passages, new, and now Mr. Ingalls intimates that the brief passages were offhand additions.' It would be very sad, that the prohibition people are so frequently imposed upon by rapacious lecturers, if they were not, with few exceptions, so beautifully insincere themselves. We will not leave the subject without informing our readers how Mr. Ingalls expressed himself on the situation in Kansas, not extemporaneously as at Prohibition Park, but after one reflection before writing to the Voice. We reprint this, because it is interesting on account of the

circumstances that have forced this admission from a man, who until recently pretended to believe prohibition in Kansas a success.

"This is what Ingalls says in his letter to the Voice: 'To present the issue clearly I affirm: 1—That there is no town of importance in Kansas where beer, whisky and other intoxicating drinks cannot be had and are not sold as a beverage. There may be some hamlets where this is not true, but not even many of these. 2—That in the principal cities of the State the dramshop traffic is recognized, and practically licensed, by the imposition of monthly 'fines,' which are regularly applied to the payment of the expenses of the municipal government. 3—That the brewery, which in a test case the Supreme Court of the United States held the State has the power to suppress and destroy, had been, and now is, in constant, uninterrupted and profitable operation. 4—That these facts are known to the State officials, to the boards of police commissioners appointed by the Governor, upon oath, to enforce the prohibition law, and to the people generally.'—South-West, S. p. 4, 1891.

Prohibition is a fraud, and always will be. Taxes in Topeka, Kan., were \$1.28 on the \$100 in 1887 and the city had no money for current expenses. Bradstreet shows during two years 228 failures in Kansas. The farms in Kansas are mortgaged for \$30,000,000. Prohibition drives valuable citizens and vast capital from a community, and breeds hypocrisy and other vices; also causes ruinous high rates of taxation.
