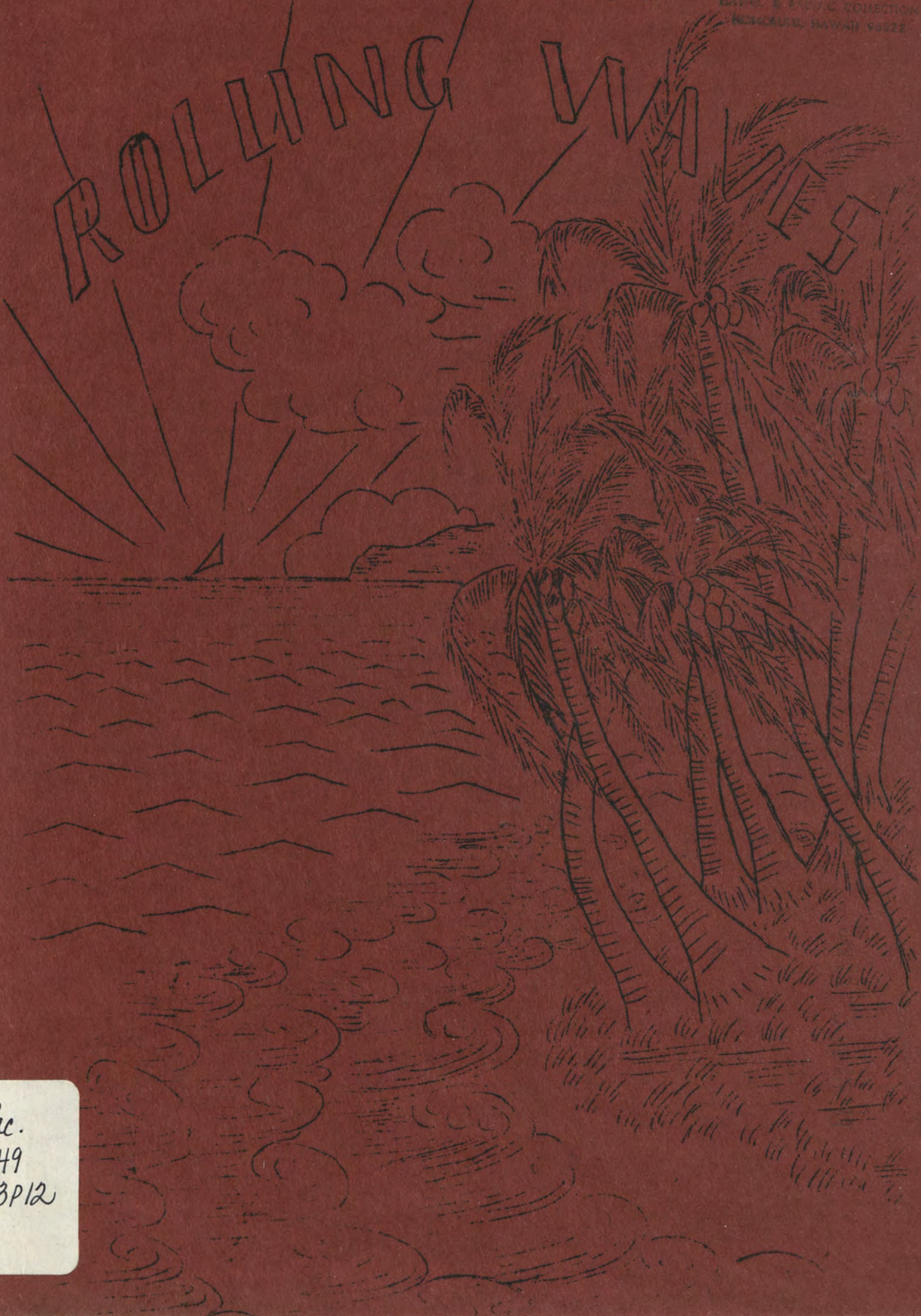

Nicotine is often used as a spray to kill harmful insects in the garden. The poisons in tobacco irritate the delicate linings of the nose and throat. That is why many people cough when there is tobacco smoke in a room.

Nicotine causes the heart to beat faster and the breath to become shorter. The effect reduces a person's endurance in game and stunts. Athletic coaches have very strict rules against players' smoking. They know the results of smoking will show in games which require endurance and strength. Tobacco is a hindrance to growing girls and boys.

Alcohol is a liquid which is not needed by the body. It does not help in growth or development of any part of the body. There is no nourishment in alcohol. There is no muscle building food in it. In fact, alcohol reduces the strength and endurance of the muscles.

Alcohol looks like water but it acts quite differently. Outside the body, alcohol has many different uses. It is useful as a disinfectant in killing the germs in a scratch or out. Mixed with water it makes a good antifreeze for the radiator of a car. It is useful as an anti-freeze because it will not freeze even in the coldest weather the world has ever known. Because it mixes with water, it is used to remove water from any substances. This process is called dehydrating. It kills germs by removing the water from them.
