Odd Things In Streets.

New Incorporations.

Articles of incorporation were filed on Monday by the Hawaiian Transportation Co., Ltd., with a capital of \$6000 and power to increase to \$25,000

The purpose of the corporation is to own and sail vessels of all descriptions, to buy and sell firewood, and to carry on other business as necessary.

The incorporators are S. J. Harris, President; C. M. Tai, Secretary and Treasurer, and Simca Bonde, G. H. Paul and A. St. C. Pianaia.

The Hawaii Yacht Club has been incorporated with a capital of \$4000, divided into shares of \$20 each. The articles give the company the right to buy and sell real estate, to own and build a clubhouse, acquiring land as may be needed for the purpose, and to own and construct row boats, yachts, etc. T. M. Hobron signs the articles as President. Both of the above articles of incorporation will be presented to the Executive Council at its next meeting tomorrow.

Any clergyman not accepting the new order of things in Episcopal Church matters cannot officiate as such clergyman without being duly licensed thereto by the Bishop. Such has already occurred to our knowledge and we deprecate this vaunted show of insubordination and disloyalty, which we deem as being next door to being treasonable and schismatic.

Will the road department please attend to repairing the sidewalk near the destroyed Chinese Engine house and make it passable for pedestrians. As in its present condition, it is a disgrace. One day's work of one man can set it right by throwing the bricks that are on the ground here and there, and by so doing would make the same good for pedestrians to walk upon, and at the same time receive the unwonted thanks of those passing Maunakea street into Paunahi.

If bull-dog editor Smith cannot see further than his nose as regards Church harmony and discipline, then he is a born idiot or an Ishmaelite. Any American bishop must and will consult with "the few," who are the majority in the Diocesan Synod and constituting the only "authority" under which Bishop Willis is acting. THE INDEPENDENT would here again reiterate that the ignored many "whom that authority has abused" were and are a party to the constituted authority of the Church. Although the "ignored many" may be the wealthiest, an American Bishop cannot for one moment ignore the "few" to their detriment, but must recognize in them, being the majority in spite of

the wealth among the "ignored many," as—quoting the editor's own words—"it is already plain to the initiated that the American Bishop will show an American respect for the will of the qualified majority in his diocese," which majority is constituted largely of the despised "few" of the Advertiser. The "many" are only worshipping within the Cathedral edifice upon sufferance of the "few," and therefore, an American Bishop must and "will consult with the few."

Wanted as Naval Sailors.

Since the arrival of the U. S. training ship Mohican on Monday, the report has gone abroad that natives are wanted as sailors on board, and particularly Hawaiian boys. It is reported that Capt. Cowden, during the course of a conversation with Captain Merry, the commandant of the naval station, stated that he is desirous of enlisting a number of Hawaiian boys and giving them training on board his vessel. Captain Merry is enthusiastic over the matter, and hopes that the opportunity will be grasped by many native boys who are undecided as to what particular career they shall follow, now that the time has arrived for them to be doing something for themselves. Captain Merry has a great opinion of the Hawaiians as sailors, and thinks that Captain Cowden furnishes a unique chance for them to show what they are made of.

Here is now an opportunity given to young Hawaiians to join the training ship Mohican as apprentices. Captain Cowden is anxious to try the experiment by adding a dozen Hawaiian boys to his training ship. How many are there among our unemployed young men willing to accept and try the experiment now offered and proposed?

LOCAL AND GENERAL NEWS.

The S. S. Hyades leaves this afternoon for San Francisco via Kahului.

The regular meeting of the Board of Health is being held this afternoon.

The steamer Kaiulani sails for Kohala, Hamakua and Hilo ports at 5 p. m. today.

The funeral of the late Hon. Frank Brown was largely attended yesterday afternoon.

The big dredger for the Pearl Harbor work will be ready for moving to the sphere of its labors the end of this week.

The steamship Sierra yesterday brought news of the death of the Tongan Princess Ofa, of consumption, at Nukuslofa, December 14.

The annual meeting of the Hawaiian Relief Society will be held at the residence of Mrs. S. C. Allen, tomorrow morning, at 11 o'clock.

The residence of Mrs. Albert Lucas on Kinau street was entered by burglars recently, the robbers taking a cage containing two dozen canary birds.

P. D. Kellert Jr., former Circuit Court clerk, was yesterday commissioned by Treasurer Wright as an agent to grant marriage licenses in Honolulu.

The initial number of The Spokesman, the new Democratic weekly organ of which L. D. Timmons is editor and business manager, has been received.

The Zenda's will give their initial dance of the season at Progress Hall tomorrow evening. Invitations have been issued to some of the friends of the members of the organization.

Wm. K. Simerson, purser of the steamer Mauna Loa, stayed over on account of his wife's illness. Purser Lindemann took his place, he having recently returned to work in the Inter-Island S. N. Co.'s service.

New bridges have been put in by the Public Works Department on Anapuni and Hastings streets, in the Puanohu suburb, and is now at work on Wilder avenue completing the macadamizing of that thoroughfare.

Spreckelville, on Maui, has been ruled out of the postal circulation, and hereafter mails destined for that locality must be addressed to Puunene Postoffice. William Walsh has been placed in charge of the office.

The Lusitana Society, which was to have met last evening for the election of officers, adjourned without taking action. The meeting for the election of officers will be held Sunday, and a lively contest between rival factions is expected.

Hon and Mrs. Julian Monsarrat of Kapapala Ranch, Kau, Hawaii, returned home yesterday on the Mauna Loa. Mrs. Monsarrat lately returned from the Coast and Mr. Monsarrat came down last week to meet her here and to return home together.

The Wilder's Steamship Company has resumed the carrying of paiai to Molokai under the old contract. The new arrangement which was contemplated with Young Brothers by the Board of Health, for some reason, fell through, and the old deal will be carried out.

It was after 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon that the steamer Mauna Loa left this port on her regular route after undergoing repairs. The W. G. Hall left Monday evening on a special trip to Kaula, the Mikahala taking her regular route last evening.

F. E. Richardson is to import several locomobiles for use here. He says that when they arrive, he will guarantee to take parties around this Island, over the roads as they are at present, at the rate of fifteen miles an hour. If such is the case, travelling will be much easier.

The band will play out at Makee Island this evening.

The Vantura has not yet been sighted as we go to press.

Young Bros. have bought the yacht Pokii from Bill Williams.

The U. S. training ship Mohican may remain here about ten days or a fortnight.

The February term of the First Circuit Court will open a week from Monday.

The boys aboard the U. S. training ship Mohican drew \$6000 upon arrival here.

Judge Wm. A. McKay of Wailuku, Maui, has been visiting this city on business and returned home last evening by the Claudine.

The Honolulu Diocesan Magazine for the January quarter is out and contains many matters of interest to Churchmen, especially in regard to the action taken by the last Diocesan Synod. It is really a double number as far as reading matter is concerned.

The Kinau was flying George Beckley's admiral's pennant yesterday on her departure for windward. A number of members of the Mariners' and Pilots' Association were present at the unfurling of the pennant. His commodore's pennant was also flying at the same time with the other.

A meeting of the Women's Christian Temperance Union was held yesterday afternoon. Reports were read, after which Rev. W. D. Westervelt made a statement in regard to the coming convention of the Anti Saloon League. This convention, which will be held very soon, will occupy a whole day.

Captain Sodergren, ex-master of the bark Hesper, who has been serving a long sentence in Oahu jail, was released from custody Monday morning. He was along the waterfront during the day, shaking hands with his friends and renewing old acquaintances. He also paid a visit to his old vessel, which is now lying at the railroad wharf.

Inspector J. W. Doyle of the Custom House has been suspended from the service pending a decision in the case of a Chinese sailor who was allowed ashore from the America Maru by the inspector without the permission of the inspector of immigration. Under the rules of the service the suspension had to take place and the action of the collector will be passed upon by the Secretary of the Treasury.

An Unknown Man.

The decomposed body of a man was discovered yesterday morning by Thomas Taylor, an employee of S. E. Damon, in a sorghum field at Moanalua. After the police had been notified, a coroner's jury was called together and was driven to the spot to view the body. An inquest was held on the spot where the body lay, as decomposition had well set in, and, on account of which, an autopsy was rendered impossible.

The jurors returned later to the Police Station and the following verdict was rendered:

"That the said John Doe, white man, whose true name is unknown, but identity known, came to his death at Moanalua, in the district of Honolulu, Island of Oahu, on or about January 12th, 1902, from a self-inflicted gun-shot wound."

It was impossible to identify him as no means of identification could be found on the body. In the pockets of his clothes were found a silver watch, minus the minute hand, a box of cartridges, a Chinese laundry ticket, and \$11.55 in cash, including two five dollar gold pieces. Attached to the watch was a piece of cord.

Nothing much was known of the man, whoever he may be, as no one has been reported missing. The gruesome find plainly shows suicide, as no other cause can be thought of.

King Edward's New Title.

A supplement to the last London Gazette contains a proclamation by the King, announcing the new title which His Majesty now takes in accordance with the royal style and titles bill of last session. Up to the present the King's title has been "Edwardus VII, Dei Gratia Britanniarum Rex, Fidei Defensor, Indiarum Imperator," and in English, "Edward VII, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India." The new title is, "Edwardus VII, Dei Gratia Britanniarum et terrarum transmarinarum quae in ditone sunt Britannica Rex, Fidei Defensor, Indiarum Imperator;" or, in English, "Edward VII, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India."

The First Local Mint.

One of the institutions here which has the special attention of tourists as well as the local people is the Mint, which is established on Nuuanu street, opposite Queen Emma Hall. It is interesting to enter the large main working room, where general manager McDonough and his corps of assistants are at work. The cool and large laui is a proper resting place and the vaults, where the "bars" to be minted and beer are kept present a very tasty spectacle. The Mint is open from 5:30 a. m. to 11:30 p. m. and during those hours the work never ceases. Visitors after looking over the place will find first class refreshments and the purest of liquors.
