What Samoa now needs, is the establishment of a similar government—perhaps not so elaborate—but sufficiently strong to command the support of the unruly native clans, and to maintain order and stability where constant strife now prevails.

The American Government has signified its desire to withdraw from the treaty, although it has a claim Tutuila harbor for a coal station, acquired by a former treaty.

"Once a Mason always a Mason" does not apply to the Order of Eastern Star, for the constitution provides that no female relative of a Master Mason is eligible to membership in the order unless that Master Mason is affiliated and in good standing in some regularly constituted lodge.

ODD FELLOWS. Illinois Working For the Re-encampment. Triple Link Notes.

The Odd Fellows (I.I.O.) Record says Grand Representative E. S. Conway is working on a plan to help the encampment men get new life and material into their bodies by making it easy for young men to become members and to be able to wear a uniform with less expense than heretofore.

An Ohio lodge has increased its dues \$1 for one year, the extra dues to be set aside for their donation to the home front. Their aggregate donation will be \$300.

In California when two or more lodges desire to consolidate they are permitted to do so.

Grand Master Phillips of Illinois delivered the address at the dedication of the Odd Fellows' temple at Wellington.

The subordinate ritual is printed in eight languages.

The new consul at St. John's, N. F., is Samuel Ryan, P. O. M. of Wisconsin.

General J. P. Elliott of Chicago has been honored by the grand sire, Hon. John W. Stubbins, commander in chief of the Patriarchs Militant, as the first grand sire to have made on his military staff an Odd Fellow.

The department of Wisconsin of Illinois will be held at Springfield in November.

Bro. James A. Holt is the grand master of the grand lodge of Quebec.

The fraternal work should be pushed from now on until next May.

At the semi-annual session of the grand lodge of Indiana there were 82 nominations for that office. Prior to the election at the next session there were 100 additional nominations.

About 60 lodges and encampments met in the new temple at Philadelphia.

American Legion of Honor. The supreme council of the order's session in Detroit re-elected the old officers.

Supreme Treasurer Combs reported his receipts for the two years to be \$224,220 and disbursements \$192,364, leaving \$31,856 on hand June 30, 1895.

The order has 63,000 members in the United States. It was founded in 1878 and has the badge (by permission) of the French Legion of Honor and has for its motto the Latin words, "Juncti Juvantur."

The order is nonsectarian, fraternal and insures its members.

The American Legion has paid out nearly \$31,000,000 in death certificates and \$750,000 in sick benefits.

The next session of the supreme council will be held at Buffalo in 1897.
