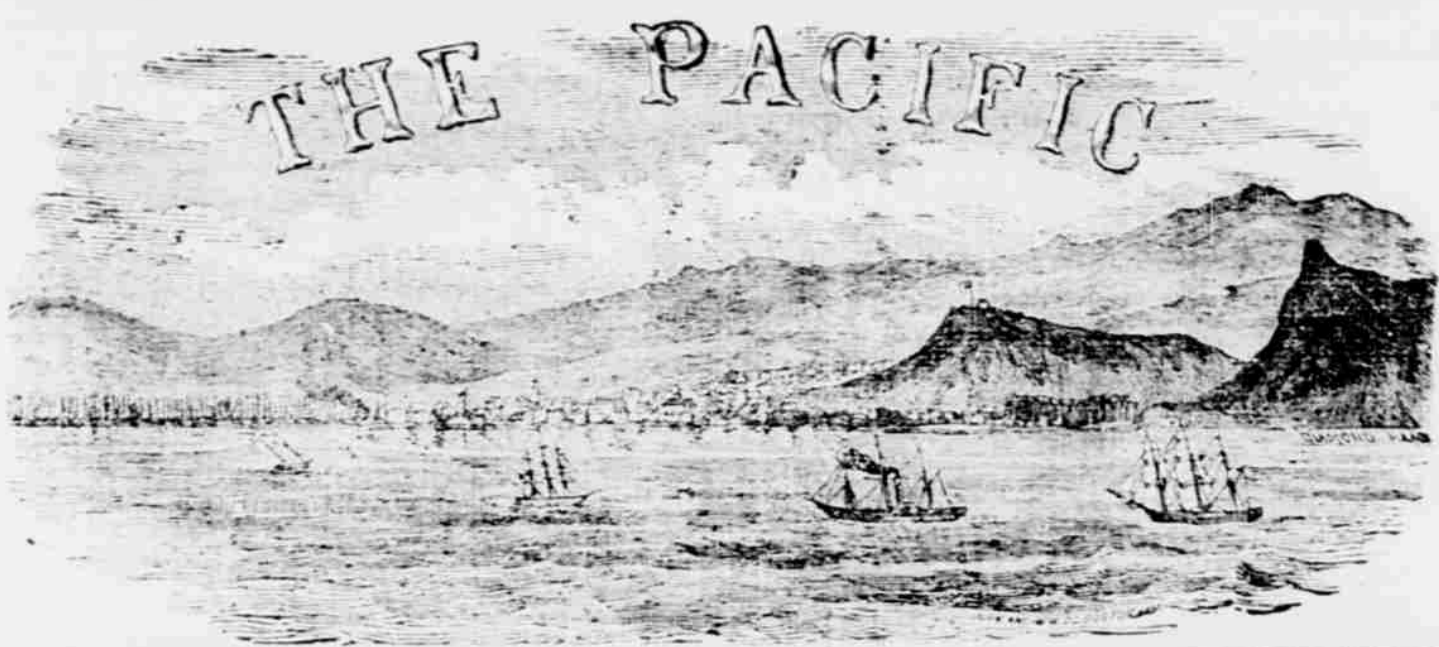

The following review of the San Francisco market was prepared for and received by the bank of D. C. Mearns, of the Hawaiian Packet Line. It is the best review of the market that has come to hand:

Chas. W. Brooks & Co's Circular.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Feb. 5th, 1866.
Trade the past month has been circumscribed within more than ordinary winter limits; the season has proved severe beyond what is customary, and although limited districts only have been flooded, gentle and continuous rains have rendered interior roads quite impassable for heavy teams. The rain gauge reports 16 1/2 inches, exceeding any month for several years; during January 1862, the season of our great flood, only 11.30 inches fell.

Stocks generally throughout the interior are low, and from some localities report them comparatively bare of goods, and although jobbers have already orders in hand, they merely buy to replenish stocks for local consumption, unwilling to purchase largely until after free communication is established with the interior, when a brisk trade is likely to ensue. Hawaiian produce, although in comparative light supply, sympathizes with general mercantile life, all rates being somewhat nominal. We quote as follows:

SUGAR.—Considerable transactions have been closed within range of quotations, the market has gained some firmness from reported detention and disasters to vessels from Manila with cargoes of refining grades. From Peru, we learn two cargoes are expected during the current quarter. Imports of Hawaiian during the month of January for three years past have been as follows: 1864—1,278 kegs; 1865—2,397 kegs; 1866—5,600 kegs; which latter is fully up to requirements at this season. Extra No. 1, 114@125; No. 1 cane, 104@110; medium No. 2 grades, 82@100; ordinary molasses sugars, 67@68; dark in mass, 64@70.

MOLASSES AND SYRUPS.—Late receipts mostly placed prior to arrival at 30@32 1/2. Sales to a moderate extent at 55c. Since arrival of the H. D. Rice, by which heavy shipments of this article were expected, and none came, a party has attempted to control lots at hand, and established an advance with temporary success, and now asks 45c, at which figure sales are circumscribed, although a few orders have been filled at the latter rate. Several distillers withdraw from the market sales could be difficult at old quotations, yet should this demand continue paying rates may be sustained for some time.

COFFEE.—Rates are dropping, trade being dull and holders anxious to realize, and sales only effected at considerable concessions. Green Rio, 24 1/2@25 1/2; Manila, 24@25; Costa Rica, 26@27; Java (Old Gov't) 30c; Hawaiian Kona, 24@25.

RICE.—Market weaker, owing to heavy receipts from China and East Indies; 107,717 bags are reported as due or arrived within a few days. Any considerable offering pressed on our market would involve a decline from present nominal rates. The future of our market although uncertain, warrants little encouragement for these varieties, as the present market is probable. Hawaiian table rice for city trade is held at 10c, while China No. 1 is dull at 6 1/2c.

PULP.—With high rates, demand has considerably abated; nominal 12 1/2@14; recent arrivals per H. D. Rice, 4 1/2 sales remain in first hands.

FRUITS.—Without recent sales quotations remain unchanged; clean, well-cured lots would readily command 17 1/2c.

SWEET POTATOES.—Large parcels 10 1/2@11; current jobbing price for California raised, 2 1/2@2 1/2. By the H. D. Rice, 216 barrels received are reported unsold, importers asking 10c from ship.
