Canal Reciprocity.
The Hon. Mr. Blaine, Speaker of the House of Representatives, has recently published a letter and delivered several speeches in Maine, taking strong ground against the proposed Reciprocity Treaty between Canada and the United States. It seems that the treaty proposes to grant to Canada the right of coasting fish shall be placed on the same footing as American vessels in the commerce of the Lakes and the Atlantic Ocean, and also to allow them to register under the American flag. This naturally excites strong opposition from those engaged in the shipping interests, as well it may.

Germany and France.
A recent telegram states that the Government of Germany sent an official note to the French Government to the effect that the German Government, after careful investigation, finds that the French in the South of France are aiding the Carlists in Spain; that this is a violation of the law of nations against the recognized Government of Spain; that France must send an army of 25,000 men to stop the wrong complained of, or that, if France does not, Germany will be compelled to do it. If this report be true, it certainly is in keeping with the recent acts of Germany in Spanish affairs—it will compel France to maintain a strong force on the Spanish frontier, or permit Germany to do what France dares not do. On the other hand, France takes the stand that she has a force there which is sufficient to guard the frontier and prevent aid being sent to the Carlists in Spain. In the present critical state of affairs, it will be a very easy matter for Germany and France to become involved in war again. The success of the Spanish Republic is desired by Germany, while that of the Carlists is apparently the chief object of the French people, if not of their Government.

The Arrest of Count Von Arnim.
Which took place in Germany about the first of October, has attracted much interest throughout Europe. He was ambassador from Germany to the French Court during the presidency of M. Thiers, and while there in that capacity seems to have been instructed by Bismarck to throw his influence in favor of Thiers, as it was for the interest of Germany that he should remain President. From the few despatches received referring to his case, it would seem that he did not carry out the instructions of his chief, but favored the overthrow of Thiers and the election of MacMahon. The result was that he was recalled, and retired from government service to his country seat, Naumburg, where he was preparing for publication a book justifying his course with ambassador, and impugning Bismarck. It is probable that the religious controversy was involved in the affair.

Local Option in California.
The Supreme Court on Monday, Oct. 5, (says the Bulletin) in a long opinion, declared the local option law unconstitutional. The Chile Exposition.
Mr. C. S. Bartow, Consul for Chile, has supplied us with copies of the rules to guide exhibitors, who wish to display articles at the international exposition which opens at Santiago, Chile, on September 16, 1875, and continues till December 31, of the same year. We insert a few of the more important regulations, and refer those seeking further information to Consul Bartow for the pamphlet referred to.

The Austrian Polar Expedition.
According to the accounts in late London journals, the Austrian North Pole expedition which left Europe in the spring of 1872, was frozen in at the north point of Nova Zembla, in August, of that year, and was driven in a northwesterly direction with the ice. The crew worked five months in vain during the summer of '73, to free the ship. In the autumn of that year, north of the 80th degree of latitude, an unknown land was discovered, whose boundary line north and west was not to be seen. A line was explored in sledges from the 9th of March to the 4th of May, 1874, up to the 83d degree. In honor of the Emperor of Austria, this was named Franz Joseph Land. There were no signs of animal life. On the 20th of May, 1874, the crew left the ship together in four sledges, and after traveling ninety-six days reached Nora Zembla, where they met with some Russian seamen and were taken to Mardou, in Norway; after undergoing indescribable sufferings and privations.
