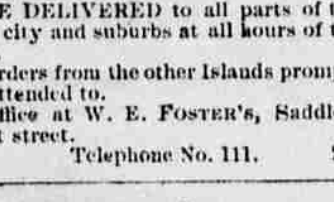



The thieves in China have a custom of anaesthetizing occupants of rooms into which their business takes them.
