Noted below is paraphrase of confidential Radiogram #1103, dated June 27, 1942, from Ft. Shafter, T.H. to The Adjutant General.

Representatives of the American Red Cross and the Social Security Board here in Hawaii report that these organizations are ready to assist in the evacuation of families to travel to the mainland and to continue assistance for adjustment time of one month. Effort is being made by the local Social Security Board to clear with this agency in Washington to extend this service beyond a period of 30 days to the extent necessary. The War Relocation Authority, it appears, may take up where the American Red Cross and the Social Security Board's services and assistance stop. Since we have no information at the present time as to numbers concerned, it is not necessary for the War Relocation Authority representative to come here. Reference is made to Radiograms # 4471, dated June 23, and #4493, dated June 24. In conformity with your instructions and pending further clearance of this matter, all persons evacuated for the present will be those who can certify their ability to maintain themselves on the mainland without any additional government assistance. Your attention is invited to radio from Beasley to Powell of the Social Security Board in Washington, dated June 25.
