# Report in Document Signed By Rizal

## Did Dr. Jose Rizal Retract His Religious Beliefs Just Before He Was Executed?

MANILA, Jan. 10 (UP)—After making separate studies of the alleged religious retraction of the Filipino national hero, Dr. Jose Rizal, two handwriting experts, Dr. H. Oley Beyer and Dr. Jose I. del Rosario, pronounced the document purported to have been written by the greatest Filipino patriot on December 29, 1896, the day prior to his execution in Manila, was found in the archives of the archbishop of Manila several years ago, and has since stirred considerable controversy as to its authenticity.

"The document which is in Spanish reads as follows when translated into English: 'I declare myself a Catholic and in this religion in which I was born was educated I wish to be united with all my heart everything in my words, writings, publications and conduct that have been contrary to my status as a son of the Catholic church. I believe and I profess all that it teaches and I submit to all that it commands. I abhor the Mass, as an enemy of the church and as a sect contrary to the church.'"

## Nationwide P.I. Strike Will Be Called May First Unless Demands Are Met

MANILA, Jan. 10 (UP)—A coordinated large-scale labor movement, embracing all organized labor elements in the Commonwealth, will lead to the declaration of a general labor strike on Labor Day, May 1, unless demands for increased wages are met by employers concerned, according to a resolution reached by labor leaders in a private conference.

The labor leaders agreed to convene a general reunion of labor organizations in February for the purpose of mapping out the details of the projected nationwide walkout.

According to an official of the Confederated Workers Alliance, strike committees will be organized in different parts of the country for the direct supervising of a national strike committee, which will be composed of the leaders of the various labor groups of the islands.

Efforts are now being made to make the coronation and ball in honor of Miss Philippines a brilliant social affair; it will be some time in March, 1939, in the auditorium at Treasure Island.

Tentatively, the program for 1939, at Treasure Island, includes an "air show" by Filipino flyers; a historical pageant; a fashion show of native Philippine costumes; the showing of Philippine-produced talking pictures; an exhibition of native games (such as Sipu), and folk dances; and a musical-literary program.

At its recent meeting in San Francisco, the Board of Advisors of the Northern and Central California Filipinos went on record as entirely in accordance with James V. Stewart's contention in one of his Philippine Free Press articles that the Philippines on the Pacific Coast do not want a Filipino labor commission.

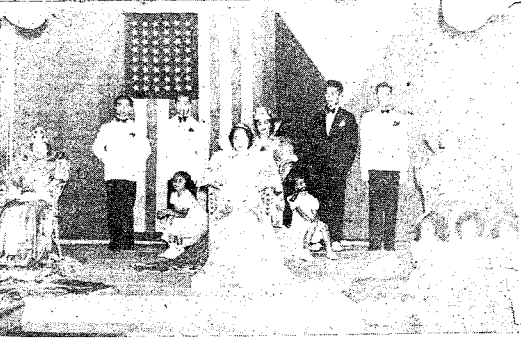
