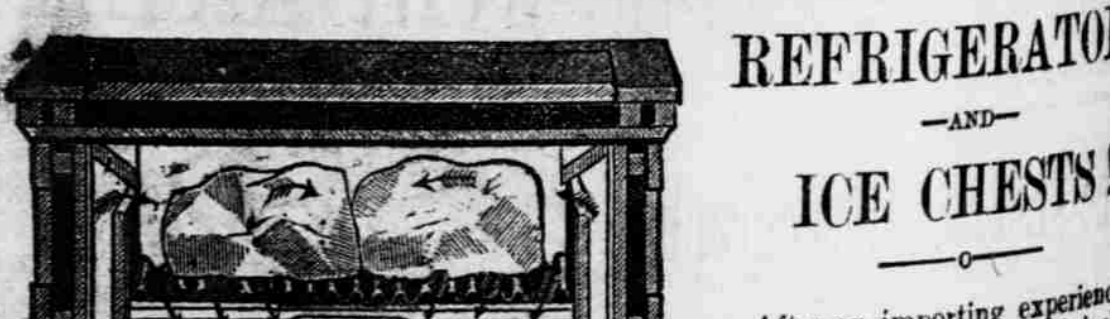

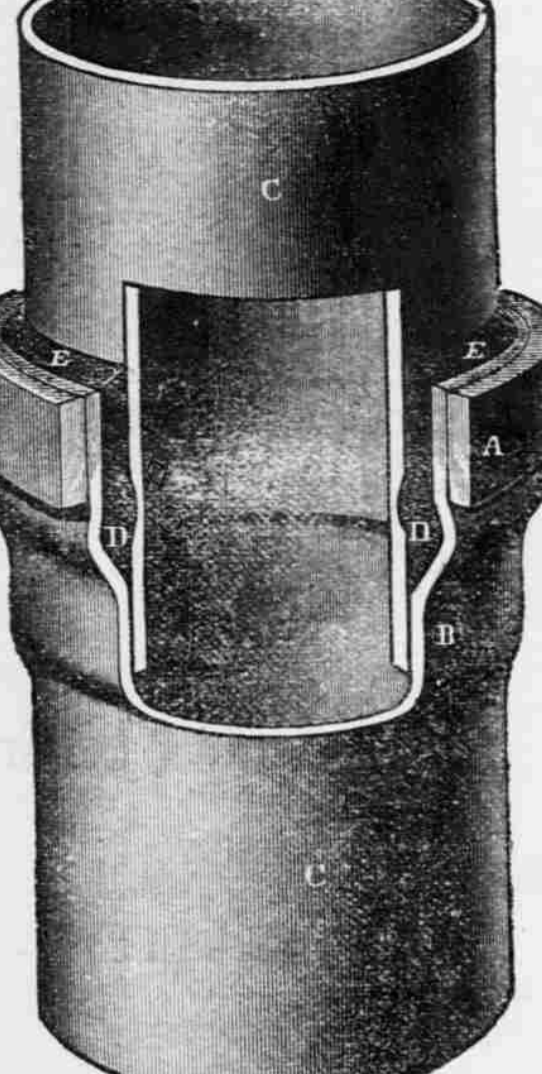

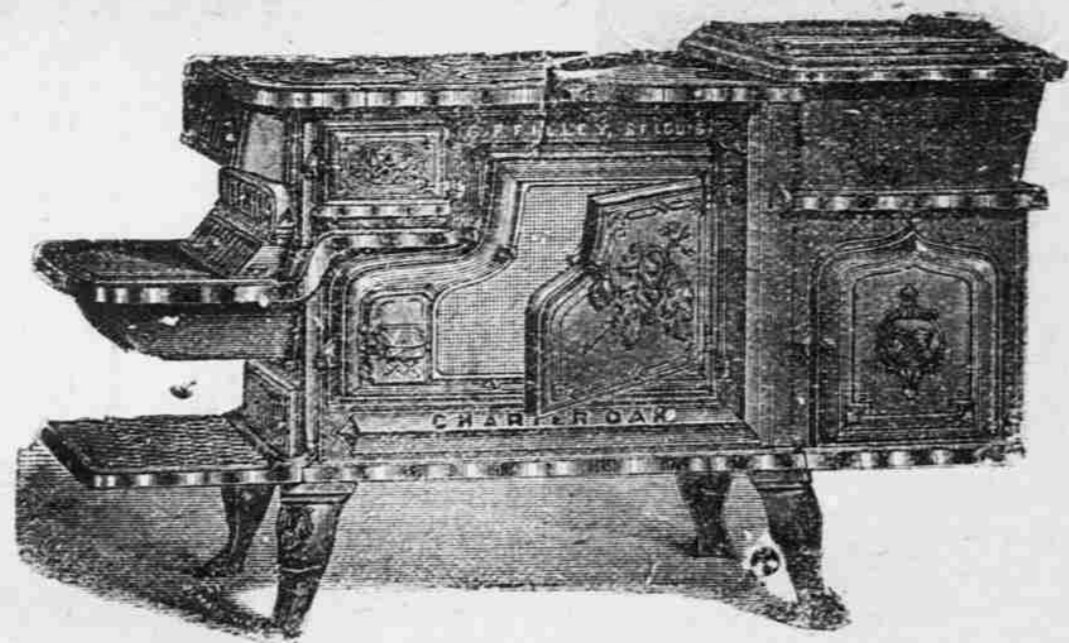

LATEST FOREIGN NEWS.

The Czar has visited Germany recently, remaining only a few days, however.

China is becoming alarmed over the repeated outbreaks and attacks on missionaries, and has guaranteed the punishment of the anti-missionary rioters.

Canada is writhing in the throes of a Ministerial scandal. Following close on the forced retirement of Sir Hector Langevin comes serious charges against the Dominion Printer. The entire Canadian Government seems to be seething with official corruption if half of the reports are true.

Rebat, the French foreign minister, has been decorated by the Sultan of Turkey.

Brazilian Reciprocity.

The Bureau of American Republics has issued a valuable bulletin on the reciprocal arrangements between Brazil and the United States. It appears that the average yearly imports into that country of articles which, when produced in the United States, have been admitted free of duty since April, 1891, amount to more than \$20,000,000, of which considerably more than three-fourths have been imported from countries other than the United States. The advantages which the United States may expect to reap from the agreement are fairly indicated by these examples. Fish (salted, dried or pickled) imported from the United States, amounted to \$23,278; from other countries, \$1,629,229; duty, 20 to 48 per cent. Potatoes, imports from the United States, \$36; from other countries, \$905,503; duty 15 per cent. Beans and peas imported from the United States, \$476; from other countries, \$1,039,522; duty 20 per cent. Mining and mechanical machinery, tools and implements (including stationary and portable engines and all machinery for manufacturing and all industrial purposes, except sewing machines), imports from the United States, \$184,032; from all other countries, \$2,310,628; duty from 15 to 48 per cent. Coal imports from the United States, none; from all other countries, \$6,057,381; duty 5 per cent.
