Lono and Kanoho ordained today.

Sermon by Leleo, ordaining prayer by Kanoa, right hand of fellowship by Maka, charge by Kapu (Butaritari).

Correspondence refers to murder of St. John Keyse, an Englishman, by a pagan.

The Morning Star's trip

Mortlocks - January 1874 - 3 Bonabe teachers and wives stationed on islands of Lukonor and Satawan

Early 1875, Father Sturges of Bonabe received report of progress.

Population of about 3200.

Oct. 1875, Father Sturges organized church on Lukonor.

On Satawan - 2 churches - on islets of Ta and Satawan.

Sunday Oct. 17, 1875, ordination of Obediah.

Mention of heathen island of Hogolu.

Story about Bonabian princess "Obedinia" wife of Obediah and famine of 1874.

Work on Pingalap; people mentioned - Barnabas, Rev. W. H. Alexander.

Abstracts of Minutes of 13th Annual Meet of Haw'n Evang. Ass'n June, 1876
Delegates from Micronesia: Rev. J. W. Kanoa and Mr. Kaaia
June 13, 1876, resolution adpted re: Rev. S. Kahelemauna's death after six
years of missionary work on Marshalls.

Resolution: Mrs. Kaholo Kanoa who labored in Micronesia til death May 6, 1875.

Page 59: Account of Mrs. Kanoa and Rev. Kahelemauna given.

500 copies of Bible stories, vol. 1 by Mrs. Bingham in Gilbert Island dialect received.

Books for Gilbert Islands and Marshall Islands in Marshall Island dialect, Strong's Island dialect. A spelling book in Mortlock dialect translated by Obetimia, wife of Obedia.

Gilberts: Mr. and Mrs. Bingham compelled to leave before Star's arrival due to Mr. Bingham's health. Left Apaiang on German vessel, San Francisco, May 19, 1875. June 2, arrived Butaritari then left for Samoa.

Prompt Punishment in the "South Seas" 1793-1876

Man-of-War RENARD ordered to visit island of Apaiang to see guilty native who murdered an English punished. Acc't as published in Herald, an Auckland paper given. Names mentioned: English navigator Capt. Vancouver Mr. Keys, Mr. Taylor.

Statements confirmed by letters of Haw'n missionaries as translated and published in Gazette of Oct. 18.

December, 1876

Article dealing with the visit of HBMS RENARD at Apaiang regarding the question of the murder of Englishman by native.

Letter written by Rev. Bingham mention:

Rev. G Leleo, Mr. G Haima, Capt. Push.

Tells more of the incidence of the RENARD and the procedures occuring in trying to carry out 'justice'.
