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"MO LE 'AUPAATASI MA LE A'OA'OI NA
O SAMOA - FAITAU, MA AVATU I LE
LUA TE TUA'OI E FAITAU AI".

TUSI I LE PERESITENE E UIGA IA SAMOA: Sa auina se tusi a le Failautusi o le Puipuiga o le Malo o le Unaite Setete (o ia lea e Pule i le Ami, Fun-Vaa-a-dalo, ma le Fua-Vaalele) i le Peresitene o le Unaite Setete, e uiga i le faatautoina o Samoa i vaega 'au a le Unaite Setete.

Na ta'uina atu e Laveti (Lovett - o le suafa lea o le Failautusi) i le Peresitene e faapea, ua una ona ia su'esu'eina ma iloilo tulafono a le Vaega o le Puipuiga o le Malo, e uiga i le faatautoina o tagata Samoa; ma o lona taofi e le mafai ona fua-se porokarama e mafai si ona tauto ni tagata Samoa. E i ai ni mafuaga ua ala ai ona iu taofi faapera. O le mea lea ua ia le mana'o ai e suia nei tulafono a le Vaega o le Puipuiga o le Malo.

O mafuaga ia na faaalia o le Failautusi o le Puipuiga, un mafua ai ona le faatuina se mea e tauto ai tagata i Samoa nei:

- (1) E mamao tele Samoa mai men o lo'o nofcia e vaega 'au a le Unaite Setete; e tele tupu e alu i le la'uina atu o tagata o le a tauto.
- (2) O tagata Samoa o le a tauto, o le a tofia pe lava e tiute i nu'u mamao, e mamao esë mai Samoa. Afai o le a 15 mafai e nisi o i latou ona ë mai i Samoa ne a o'o i o latou ase malolo, o le a fai lea ma mea e tutupu mai ai nisi faalavelave.
- (3) E mafai ona mafugofie e vaega 'au nisi latou te mana'omia, mai nisi atunu'; e laitiiti fo'i le tupo e alu ai.

O le Failautusi o le Puipuiga, o se ofisa mauluga tele lava i le Malo o le Unaite Setete; ma o lenel iuga ua ia fain ua matua faanoanea ma le malilie tele ai le to'atele o Amerika Samoa.

Na sili ona le malilie le finagalo o le Alii Kovana Sili i lenei mea, suu na matua malosi na uni lana finaua mo le faatautoina o taulele'a Samoa i Samoa lava. Sa tauanauina e le Alii Kovana Sili o Amerika Samoa le Alii Faipule o Korofoti (Crawford) mai le Setete o Misikeni (Michigan) ina o 'i'inei o ia i le tausaga talu ni, ina ia fai se pili na ave i le Maota o Alii Sui o le Malo o Amerika, ina ia faatuina se'mea i Samoa nei e tanto ai tagata Samoa. Faato'a fo'i mai nei fo'i le Sui Kovana o Eliota mai Uasigitone; sa ia tauanauina fo'i le Fono a Faipule o Amerika ina ia talosangina se porokarama o tanto ai tagata Samoa 'i'inei. O tauamafaiga nei a le Alii Kovana Sili ma le Alii Sui Kovana, na mafua ai ona fesiligin e le Peresitene se taofi o le Vaega o le Puipuiga o le Malo. O le tusi la lea e ta'ua i luga a le Failautusi o le Puipuiga, o lana tali lena i le fesili a le Peresitene.

Afai o le a malaga le Alii Kovana Sili i Uasigitone, e i ai lona faamoemoe o le a ia saga tauamafai peo lava ino i mafai ona faatautoina tagata i Samoa nei.

Sa auina e le Alii Kovana ni feso fa'a-uealesi i Ofisa o Nusipepa i Honolulu. Sa ia faaalia atu i ai e faassalauina i a latou nusipepa le 15 sa'o o le mea lea e uiga i le 15 faavavanoaina o tagata Samoa e tanto i vaega 'au a Amerika i Samoa nei. O lo'o fia faaalia e tagata Samoa le latou fia tautua i le Malo o Amerika, a o le a le auala lea faamoemoe, ona o le le'i fautagiaina e le Failautusi o le Puipuiga.

Na auina fo'i se uealesi a le Tofa a Tuiasosopo, Fofoga Fetralai o le Maota o Alii Sui ma le Susuga a Satolo, Talita'i Fono o le Maota o Alii, i le Alii o Korofoti (Crawford). O le tauamafaiga lava ia fesoasani lencu Alii i le tauanauina o le Vaega o le Puipuiga o le Malo o Amerika, ina ia toe fai se ilologa o le pili.

KOREA: E lima vaalele tau o Komunisi na tafanaina ma faapa'u'u e vaalele tau o le Unaite Setete i le Aso Lulu ma le Aso Tofa o le vajaso nei. Fai mai na faaleagaina fo'i nisi vaalele Komunisi e ono.

Sa tu'iina ala u'amea o Komunisi e vaalele la'u pu'u '8'5 a le Unaite Setete, na faumatua nei auala u'amea faatasi ma muñ- 'au a Komunisi na maua ane e vaa-lele tau a le Unaite Setete i nei auala u'amea.

Sa malaga le Alii General o Risiusi (Gen. Ridgway) i se vaalele mai Tokio (Tokyo), Sapani, e malaga i Korea. O le 'autu o le malaga, o le fia su'esu'eina atili lava o matapu o lo'o faaumiumi ai nei filifiliga a Sui o Malo. Na fai se

faamatalaga a Risiuei i usi-tala o Nusipepa i Korea e faapea, ua gascolosolo lava i luma itu tau le su'fimiga o se moa e finagalo faatasi i ai Sui o Malo, i le fasi'uina o le taua, le fefafao'i a'i o pagota, ma le asiasiga o Malo pe a umu le taua, ina ia 'au ne'i toe fauina ni 'aupega c so malo. Ae tasi le mea, na te le'i matua ta'utinoina po o fia o le a i'u i ai nei filifiliga. Na te le'i iloa fo'i po o afia o le a malilie faatasi ai sui o malo i mea o lo'i fai aga'i i ai a latou iloiloga.

Sa faaiala le taofi o Risiuei e fa'apea, e sili pe a 'aua le toe fai faaliloaina ni fono. Olona taofi ia fai faaaliali pea, ia avanoa ai fo'i le 'au maioma.

UA FO'I MAI LE SUSUGA A ELIOTA MAI UASIGITONE: O le Aso Lulu o le vaiaso nei na tauvu'u mai i Amerika Samoa le Susuga a Ioane Eliota, Sui Kovana o Amerika Samoa. Na malaga mai ia i le Manu'a Tele. E 12 vaiaso na malaga ai o ia i maila e 10,000 i Uasigitone, le Laumua o le Unaite Setete. Sa filifili o ia faatasi ma ofisa maululuga o le Vnega o le Initeria atoa ma Faipule o le Unaite Setete e uiga i matapu fiti ma le faigatā o lo'i faafeagai ma le Malo o Amerika Samoa.

Sa faaflafiaina le finagale o le Susuga a Eliota nua o le agaga fiafia na faaiala e le to'atele o ofisa o le Malo, atoa ma nisi tagata na latou talanaina matapu tau Samoa. Sa o'totia foli o ia oni o matapu fiti ma le faigatā o lo'i feagai ma nisi vaoga o le lalolagi. E tatau ona iloiloina nei matapu faigata e ofisa o le Malo; a o nei fo'i matapu, e sili ona tetele ma faigatā i lo mataupu o lo'i tateu faafeagai.

Fai mai le Susuga a Eliota e uiga i lana faigamalaga: "O aso e 70 na 'ou i ai i le Unaite Setete, ma aso e 5 na 'ou i ai i Hawaii, ma aso e 2 na 'ou i ai i Suva, sa 'ou su'esu'eina ai mea o lelei i le lelei ma le manuia o Amerika Samoa; ma sa 'ou faia so'o se mea na 'ou iloa c tatau ona fai mo so tatou manuia. Ona o le lava o lo'u taimi, ma le te'atele o na 'ou fia feiloa'i i ai, na matua faigata tele ai ia te a'u ona galuea'iina nisi mea o tele. Ae peita'i, 'ou te manatu ua 'ou faataatiaina se galuega fa'avae, o le a faamoemoe i ai le galuesa'iina o nisi mea i aso o lumana'i, pe afai o le a malaga ese atu mai lo tatou atunu'u le Ali'i Loia Sili ma le Ali'i Kovana Sili, mo le galuesa'iina o le fiamaeemoe. 'Ou te tauvu'u atu a o lo'i galuesa Sui o le Komiti/Maota Numeria Luu, i le fuauina o ala'tupe tetele o le'i, alu me le puipuiga o le Unaite Setete i le taua o lo'i fai nei ma le tulalagi o komunisi. E ma'u lava le agalelei o nei ali'i, aua na latou faavancina ni nai o lateu itula matou te tulatalanoa ai ina ua i'u le Fono a le Komiti. Na avei nei tulatalanoaga i tua, atoa fo'i ma filifiliaga sa fia i le Fono, ma mea na pasia ai e le Komiti le atu o le tupo-faaosoo mo Samou, e huncia ma se toe fasitititia. 'Ou te matua lagona o le a iloga le lelef o le tulaga o Samoa i le itu tau tupe i aso o lumana'i, ona o le fiafia o nei ali'i i matapu tau lo tatou atunu'u.

"E faigata ona 'ou tautala atu po o le a le mea a Faipule o Amerika o le a fai i le tupe i fuauina mo tatou. Peita'i o lo'i sauni le Ali'i Loia Sili e malaga i Uasigitone, e avan o ia ma sui o i tateu e faafeagai ai ma le Komiti Fuafua o le Maota Numeria Mummu. Ou te iloa o le a ia fai so'o se na te silafia e lelei ai i tatou. Afai o le a lelei le gasloga o mea uma, o le a maua se tupe mo le galuesa'iina o nisi mea e tele mo le lelei o i tatou; ae peita'i, e le tatai lava ona tusa ma mea o lo'i tatou manana'o e fia fia, e pei lava ona tatou iloa. Ae ui i lea, 'ou te faaali faatauanau atu ina ia faautagia e tagata talite'atasi una lava le itu lenei; o le tetele o ala'tupe o le'i mana'omia e le Ami, le Fua-Va'a-a-lalo, le Fua-Va'alele, ma Marini, e tauau ai ina leasi ni tupe e avanoa me galuega faa-sivilis.

"E to'atele Faipule Amerika na feseasoani i le taumafaiga ona pasi le pili me le faatautaina o tagata Samoa, ae sa faatu'iese le Failautusi o le Puipuiga i le pasia o lenei pili. O le a fiai pea ni taumafaiga malelosi ina ia toe sua lona taofi, ae pasi ai le pili. O se matua galuega faigata lava lenei galuega, ma afai tatou te manana'o ia gaua'i mai le taofi o le Ali'i Failautusi o Laveti (Lavett), e tatau lava ona tatou maua uma le feseasoani o le'i tatou mana'omia mai so'o se tasi e maua mai ai. 'Ou te faatauanau atu i tagata uma lava, ina ia tusitusi i a latou u'u i le Unaite Setete, ma faaali atu i ai le tatou naunau i lenei mea. Ia faaali atu i ai le taua o le mana'o o Samoa e fia tautui i le latou Malo; ma ia latou tusitusi i Ali'i Faipule o Maota e lua, ina ia taumafa, e pasi la tatou pili. E tatau fo'i ona faafeso'ota'i Nusipepa uma lava e mafai ona faafeso'ota'i. O se mea taua lava pe afai e faailoaina lenei matapu i tagata uma o le Unaite Setete. O le Ali'i Kovana Sili, ma a'u, atoa ma isi ofisa uma lava o le Malo, o le a fiai mea uma lava matou te mafai. Ou te faamoemoe o le a 'au faatasi Samoa uma lava i lenei taumafaiga.

"Sa le manuia la'u taumafaiga ina ia sau se wa'a suau'u mai le motu o Kenitone (Canton); o le mea lea ua tatau ai ona tatou fiai nisi faiga e maua mai ai le

suau'u ma le kesilini. O lo'o i ai se isi vata suau'u o lo'o faatali i Kenitone ia Iulai; ma o le a toe taumafai fo'i ina ia sau 'i'inei e aumai se suau'u ma se kesilini mo tatou. Ona o le laititi o le kesilini e lava ai Samoa, ua lo mana'o ai le kamupani e ona lenei va'a suau'u e sau mamao le va'a ac laititi le uta e aumai. Tusa lava po o le suau'u ma le kesilini e lava ai Samoa i le tausaga atoa, se le lava ai lava le uta a le va'a. Masalo ua cutou silafia sa le'i talia o le Komiti o Vaalele Sivil le talosaga ina ia feso'i vaalele i le va o Pago Pago ma Apia; se fai mai le Susuga a Loreni (Mr. L. Coleman), ua na toe talosagaina le Komiti ina ia feso'i lava ni vaalele i le va o Pago Pago ma Apia, a ia 'aua ne'i fesoasoani i ai le Malo i moa tau tupe. E le mafai ona 'ou fai atu o lo'a a manuia lenei ana taumafaga. E foliga mai fo'i o le a le manuia taumafaga a le kamupani fai vaalele lea e ta'u o le PIFERI (PAA), ina ia fesoasoani le Malo me se tupe e feso'i ai o latou vaalele 'i'inei. O le mea lea, ailonoga o latou toe tauanauina le Malo i lenei vaitaimi. Ae ui i lea, ua matua ta'utino mai e le Vaega o le Imitaria ia te a'u, o le a latou faia mea uma lava, ina ia mafai ona faaaogaina 'i'inei se va'alele, e pei o vaalele o lo'o faaaogaina nei i isi ATU MOTU o lo'o tausia e le Unaite Setete.

"E i ai ni nai tagata o le Unaite Setete e fiafia i galuega-tau-lima o lo'o gaezia i Samoa. Peita'i o mea o lo'o gaezi a'i nei mea-Samoa, o le fesuisua'iiga o lo latou gaosiga, atou ma le latou teuteuina, e tatau ona matua faaleleia atili, pe a'i lava tatou te fia mana faamoani ni mea lelei mai lenei ituaga galuega. Ua toe amataina nei e le Susuga a Eliota ana galuega faa-Sui Kovana o Amerika Samoa. A o le Susuga a Lui Potisi (Lewis S. Bowdish), o 15 sa galus faa-Sui Kovana fesoasoani, ua toe fo'i ane o ia i ana galuega faa-Loia Sili o Amerika Samoa.

UA FA'ATE'AINA LE LOIA SILI O AMERIKA: O le Aso Tofi nei na maua ai se ripoti, fai mai ua fa'ate'aina le Loia Sili o le Malo o Amerika e le Peresitene o Turumane. O le Loia Sili o Amerika, e tusa le maualuga o lona tulaga male maualuga o tulaga o le Failautusi o le Puipuiga, ma le Failautusi o Setete.

Fai mai na mafua ona fakte'aina le Alii Loia Sili, ona o le fa'atu'iese ma le muumui o tagata i totolu o le Vaega o Faamasinoga, o le vaega lea e ulu i le Loia Sili.

PALOTA MO LE PERESITENE: Na malo le Faipule o Tafi (Taft) i le palota na faia i le setete o Wisconsin (Wisconsin) ma le setete o Neperasaka (Nebraska).

Fai mai le faagaliga a le Peresitene o Amerika, le Afioga a Turumane, ua uma o ia ma galuega fau-le-malo uma lava. Ua leai sona faamoemoe e toe galue mo le Malo i so'o se vaega.

KOMITI FUAFUA O LE MALO O AMERIKA: Sa talosagaina e le Vaega o le Puipuiga o Amerika se tupe-fa'ascosia mo vaega 'au uma lava a Amerika. MANU'A TELE: O le po o le Aso Farailo e le vaiaso nei na malaga ai le Manu'a Tele i le motu o Kenitone. Sa malaga ai tagata Samoa e to'a 18, o i latou ia e malaga i Kenitone e faatali ai le vaalele e malaga ai i Kalifornia. O 'inā o le a faigaluega ai i latou i le fato'aga a i tagata Sapani e igoa ia Namimatisū. O le isi vaega o nei tagata fai-fa'atoaga na malaga i le Aso Farailo i le vaalele. Afai o le a avea lenei mea ma se tasi o alā-manuia o Samoa i le itu tau tagata fia faigaluega, fai mai le Susuga a Ariu o le a toe sau e su'e atu nisi. A uma ona tu'u le pasese a le Manu'a Tele, o le a fo'i mai loa mu sumai kalone kesilini e sefululima afe (15,000) mo taavale a le Malo o Amerika Samoa, auh ua matua tele le oge-kesilini i nei aso. E tusa e 7 aso e fai ai e le Manu'a Tele lenei malaga; ma ua i si le faamoemoe o le a toe taunu'u mai i Pago Pago i le Aso Farailo po o le Aso To'ona'i o le vайаса a sau nei.

A fo'i mai le Manu'a Tele, ona faasaga loa lea mo ana malaga e lua mo Manu'a; e lua aso e fia faia ai nei malaga, o le aso 14, ma le aso 15 o Aperila, ina ia aumai tagata Manu'a i Tutuila mo le Aso e le Fu'a, o le aso 17 lea o Aperila. O le aso 16 o Aperila e faapea e malaga ai le Manu'a Tele i Apia e 'a'ami le Ali'i Komesina Sili o Samoa i Sisifo, na valauina e le Aliti Kovana Sili o Amerika Samoa, ina ia 'auai i le faailogaina o le Aso o le Fu'a. E malaga mai ai fo'i ma Ali'i Fautua, o le Afioga a Tupua Tamasese, ma le Tapa'au Faasisina, le Afioga a Malietoa.

PAAMAULA'AU (BUTTONWOOD): Ua tusa o le luma vaiaso tulu ona i si le Taulaga. Pago Pago le va'a mai le Unaite Setete e ta'uua o le Faamaula'au. O le taaao o le Aso Tofi o le vaiaso nei na malaga ai lenci va'a i Manu'a. Na o le to'a 20 lama pasese na 'ave; e to' 20 fo'i le pasese na cumai mai Manu'a. O le po o le Aso Tofi lava na toe fo'i mai ai ma taumu'u i Tutuila.

FAI FAATO'AGA SAMOA E MALAGA I AMERIKA: Sa matua telc le vovesi e tagata i le vaiaso nei ona o le teutequina o le malae-valele mo le fantaliga o se vailele ga le PI'E'I'E'I, o le va'alele lea no togipau mo le la'uina o tagata Samoa e galulue faa-fai faato'aga i Kalifornia.

E tele le taimi o le Malo na alu i le teutequina o le malae-valele i Tafuna, e tele fo'i ni tupe na alu ai. Sa auina e le Malo i le Aso Lulu ma le Aso Tofi ni ripoti i le uacalsi i le kamupani a le PI'E'I'E'I, e faaali stu ai i ai ua lelei ona teutequina le malae-valele.

Sa sainis feagaina e i latou una na filifilia e le Susuga a Ariu Tagoa'i o le a galulue i le faato'aga a Namimatisi, o le tagata Sapani, i Sana Kalara i Kalifornia. Sa faia sima lunga pu'upu'u a le Ali'i Kovana Sili mo i latou, e-fapes: "Ua tele ni tupe a le Malo o Amerika Samoa na alu, ua tele fo'i galuega ua fua, ona o le galue'iima o le malae-valele i Tafuna, anf le taumu'u mai o le vailele tou te malaga ai i Kalifornia i le Aso Farailo, aso 4 o Aperila. O le matua manu'o lea i aso una lava, if fesoasani i taulele'i o Samoa, ina ia latou manu swanoa e galulue si i isi viuega o le Malo o le Unaite Setete, ina ia faa-lautaleina lo latou maluwalua."

Sa faaalia fo'i e le Kovana Sili e fapes; o ui lava ina ua fua e le Malo o Amerika Samoa mea umi e fesoasani ai i taulele'i Samoa i le latou malaga atu i le Unaite Setete, ne o le a levi se too puipuiga a le Malo o Amerika Samoa mo i latou po latou o'o i le Unaite Setete.

Sa faapea nisi saunoga a le Kovana Sili: "Ou te matua faamoemoe lava o le a lelei uiga tou te uiga n'i i aso una lava, e fai lea ma mea o le a vilia ai tagata o le outou atumu'u, atoa me le atu motu o Amerika Samoa. Soifua."

Na fai lenci porokarama e faafiafiatia ai ofisa ma le 'auua o le vaafoi' lea o le Vaega o Lelelo Gataifale o le Malo o le Unaite Setete o le o'i Amerika Samoa nei.

Sa mataofie tele lava le faafiafiatia; ma su molia e le Ali'i Kovana Sili lana faafetai i 5 na fai le faafiafiatia, ona o le faaaliiga o lo latou agalelei ma le faaaloalo faa-Samoa on lauiloa ai Samoa i le lalolagi. Sa faaalia fo'i e le Ali'i Kovana lona faamoemoe ina in 'aua ne'i muta nei uiga mataofie, au'u o le a latou manu ai ni uo fou, atoa ma e o lo'o latou mo'omia uputu'u na aqaiianua a Samoa.

World News: General Matthew Ridgeway flew to Korea from Tokyo late this week and expressed his belief to newsmen in Korea that the armistice talks are making progress. Ridgeway declined to predict what the outcome of the talks would be, but still maintained that progress was being made on both the prisoner exchange and armistice inspection issues. Ridgeway was expected to request that the secret talk be discontinued in favor of open meetings.

Military action was limited to sorties by fighter-bombers against railroads and Communist advance troop positions and sabre-jet - MIG dogfights. Communists artillery made a heavy bombardment of UN positions also.

Those in Washington who predicted a short-lived career for Government Corruption Investigator Newbold Morris had their pessimism vindicated Thursday when Attorney General J. Howard McGrath fired Morris when the latter insisted upon a financial report from high government officials including Mr. McGrath.

The firing of Morris was only the beginning of a series of events which were climaxed when President Truman discharged McGrath as Attorney General. Mr. Truman appointed Federal Judge James McGranery of Philadelphia as the new Attorney General.

There was a report Wednesday of a violent quarrel between the President and McGrath at the airport where officials were gathered to welcome Queen Juliana of the Netherlands who was arriving for a visit in the United States. At one stage of the heated argument the President turned his back on McGrath and White House Press Secretary Short who continued to argue with McGrath.

"I've done my duty as I saw it" McGrath said to newsmen after being notified of his dismissal. McGrath continued to say that he had defended personal liberty in his actions as Attorney General.

Ex Corruption Investigator Morris viewed his dismissal with quiet resignation. His illusions were not destroyed, Morris said, because he had no illusions. "This shows," he said, "official Washington does not want to be investigated."

McGrath sent a telegram of congratulations to McGranery in which he advised the new attorney general to come to Washington with a pair of "asbestos trousers."

McGranery's old cronies in the House of Representatives, including Sen. Karl Mundt of South Dakota, consider it a great opportunity for McGranery. The task as the new Attorney General views it is to re-establish trust in the Government by the American people.

Henry Kaiser who had intended making a break in the nationwide steel crisis Wednesday by signing new contracts with his CIO steelworkers did not accomplish much for CIO President Phil Murray announced Thursday that the Union had rejected an industry offer which did not meet the stipulations of the Wage Stabilization Board recommendation. A nationwide steel strike will probably go on Wednesday of next week.

Some observers believe the Union is anxious to have the Government seize the steel industry in the fashion of the railroads.

The House of Representatives voted a four billion dollar reduction in the Military Appropriations Bill this week. The cut was explained by Members of the House as a result of improved world conditions. The Bill now must go to the Senate where the reduction may be restored.

Queen Juliana of the Netherlands arrived in the United States Wednesday and addressed a joint session of Congress on Thursday. The Queen told US Congressmen that communism was on the wane in Europe and would yield to the cooperative efforts of the allied western nations.

President Truman threw the 1952 Presidential election wide open last Friday by announcing at the Traditional Democratic Jackson-Jefferson Day dinner that he will not be a candidate for re-election in 1952.

The President who has been perching precariously on the fence for several months and who has kept political second guessers completely in the dark by entering withdrawing and re-entering various primaries finally announced after his angry withdrawal from the June 3 California primaries that he will not run again.

Speculation on Mr. Truman's political future which was supposed to hinge on the April 17 deadline for filing for the office of United States Senator in Missouri was ended at his weekly press conference this Thursday. Mr. Truman said that he will not seek any public office in 1952. He intends to return to Independence, Missouri to enter private business. He said he would neither be a candidate for a seat in the Senate nor in the House of Representatives...

This past week also saw General Eisenhower reporting on the first year of NATO achievement. Eisenhower implied in his speech that although many problems remain to be solved in the military program of cooperative defense, still, sufficient organizational progress had been made the first year and the basic ideas of joint defense accepted by participating nations. He gave the impression that he feels free of obligation to the new organization and may now resign to return to the US campaign for the Republican Presidential nomination...

In primaries in Wisconsin and Nebraska run off last Tuesday Senator R. Taft made his strongest popular showing to date. In both states he polled over 35% of the popular vote to win both primaries.

In Wisconsin where Taft's name was on the ballot he received 40% of the total popular vote. No write-in ballots were allowed in Wisconsin but Governor Earl Warren of California and Harold Stassen both of whom have closer political ties to Eisenhower than Taft (Stassen promised to release one-half of his delegates to Eisenhower, Warren said his delegates would only be pledged to him on the first ballot) received a combined total greater than Taft's. Warren ran a good second in Wisconsin.

In Nebraska neither Taft's nor Eisenhower's name was on the ballot and both received substantial write-in votes. Taft capturing 36% of the total (enough to win) and Eisenhower 29%.

Taft was elated by these victories claiming grass roots enthusiasm for his candidacy equal to that displayed for Ike. Other observers discard the grass root theory but recognize this demonstration of party organization efficiency.

The Democratic primary in Wisconsin saw Senator Estes Kefauver swamp all opponents for the nomination.

Truman's disinclination to run will probably result in stronger bids for the nomination by other Democratic potential candidates such as Senator Kerr from Oklahoma who was entered in the Nebraska primary.

Local News: Lieutenant Governor John C. Elliott arrived back in American Samoa early Wednesday morning aboard the Manu'a Tele from a twelve-week, 10,000 mile trip to Washington D.C. where he conferred with high officials in the Department of Interior and United States Congressmen concerning the problems facing Samoa under civilian administration.

Mr. Elliott was heartened by the widespread interest in the problems of Samoa displayed by nearly all the officials and people he met, but he was also impressed by the tremendous problems concerning other areas of the world which Government officials must also consider and which in scope are so much larger than problems here.

Concerning the activities of his trip to Washington, Mr. Elliott says: "During the course of my seventy days in the United States, five days in Hawaii and two days in Suva, I investigated a number of matters pertaining to the welfare of American Samoa and did whatever I found possible to do to help in the solution of our many problems. The limitations of my time and the many people whom I had to see made it extremely difficult for me to accomplish more than a few things; however, I think I have laid groundwork for a number of future accomplishments which both Mr. Bowdish and the Governor will undertake to develop after their departure from the Territory.

"I found the Members of the House Appropriation Committee preoccupied with the enormous defense expenditures of our country in its fight against the spread of world communism. These gentlemen were good enough, however, to give me a few hours of their time outside of the Committee Meeting, and as a result of this and of the formal meeting, the Samoan budget passed the House Committee without any substantial reduction. I feel sure in the years to come that Samoa's financial position will be somewhat better than it has been before by reason of the interest of these gentlemen in our problem.

"What the Senate will do to our appropriation, I cannot say, of course; however, Mr. Bowdish plans to appear on our behalf before the Senate Appropriations Committee and I know that he will do the best possible job there. If all goes well, there should be money for a considerable number of local improvements although not nearly as many as we all know are needed. Nevertheless, I urge everyone to recognize that the enormous expenditures of money required by the Army, Navy and Marines and Air Force for the defense of our country is bound to limit all funds available for civilian activities.

"The Samoan recruiting bill has many supporters in Congress, but the Secretary of Defense at the present is opposed to its passage. Strong efforts will be continued to secure a change in his attitude and to obtain passage of the bill. This will be an extremely difficult job, however, and we will need all the help we can get from everyone if we are to have a chance of success in view of Secretary Lovett's opposition. I urge everyone to write letters to friends in the United States telling of our need for this service and the worthiness of the Samoans' desire to serve their country and asking them to write Congressmen and Senators on

"If of our bill. News papers also should be contacted whenever possible. It is important that the public of the United States be aroused in this matter as far as we are able to do so. The Governor, myself and all the other members of the staff will do everything we can. I hope all Samoa will join us in our fight.

"I was unfortunately unable to secure the deviation of an oil tanker from Canton Island and it will be necessary for us to use other methods to obtain the fuel. Another tanker is expected in July, however, at Canton, and we will renew our struggle to have bulk fuel delivered here. The company which operates the tanker is very reluctant to make this trip for the delivery of such a small shipment of fuel as Samoa requires even on a yearly basis.

"As you may know the application of Samoan Airlines for services between Pago Pago and Apia was disapproved by the Civil Aeronautics Board, but Mr. Coleman tells me that he is appealing the decision and will ask permission to establish this airline without any financial assistance from the government. I cannot say whether he will meet with any success in this effort. It also appears that Pan American will not be likely to succeed in its efforts to obtain financial assistance from the government to provide service here; they will, consequently, probably not pursue the matter further at this time. However, the Interior Department has assured me that they will make every effort to provide service, if necessary, by the acquisition of an aircraft similar to those used in the Trust Territories.

"I found a certain amount of interest in the United States in the product of the Samoan Handicraft Industry, but the quality and variety and design will need to be materially improved if any real developments are to be looked for along this line. I have also awakened considerable interest in the Samoan cannery, but it is necessary that we proceed with great care in this matter in order that we may secure the best possible operator."

Mr. Elliott has resumed his duties as Lieutenant Governor of American Samoa and Mr. Lewis S. Bowdish who has been Acting Lieutenant Governor in Mr. Elliott's absence has resumed his duties as Attorney General.

Last week saw a great deal of excited anticipation of the scheduled landing of the Pan American Airways chartered plane which was to pick up the young men recruited for farm laborers in California and fly them to the United States.

The Government spent considerable time and money in getting Tafuna air-strip in readiness for the landing. The Government sent progress reports to Pan American on Wednesday and Thursday informing them that satisfactory progress was being made in ridding the landing field of overgrowth and dangerous conditions.

The twenty-nine young men who have signed contracts to work for Mr. Nomimatsu a Japanese farmer in Santa Clara, California, by Mr. Ariu Tagos'i were given a brief address by Governor Phelps Tuesday. He said: "The Government of American Samoa has gone to considerable expense and trouble to prepare the Tafuna airfield for the landing of the plane which will fly you to California on Friday, April 4. It is our wish at all times to assist the young men of Samoa to avail themselves of any opportunity to widen their horizons by securing employment in other United States territories or possessions."

The Governor went on to explain that although the Government of America Samoa has done everything it could to assist the young men in securing the employment and getting to the United States, it cannot assume responsibility for the men when they are in the United States.

"I sincerely hope," the Governor told the men, "that all of you will conduct yourselves at all times in a creditable manner which will bring praise to your people and your islands of American Samoa. I wish you the best of luck, and may this experience bring you not only happiness but also broader viewpoints, education and financial benefits. Seifun."

The names of the twenty-nine young men who made the trip to California on the Pan American plane are printed in the Samoan edition of the I.B.

The United States Secretary of Defense Robert Lovett has sent a letter to the President of the United States concerning the recruitment of Samoan men for the Armed Forces of the United States.

Lovett told the President that he had reviewed the Defense Department's policy on recruiting in Samoa and that he did not believe that an enlistment program in Samoa would be advisable for several reasons, and that he therefore would not recommend a change in the Defense Department's policy.

The Secretary of Defense gave the following reasons for not setting up a recruiting station in Samoa:

1. Samoa is so far from areas where U.S. Armed Forces are stationed, it would be too expensive to transport recruits.
2. Samoan servicemen would continually be on "Foreign duty" (away from home) and it would raise morale problems when some would not be able to get home on furloughs.
3. That recruitments of the Armed Forces can be filled more easily from other areas at a much smaller cost.

Governor Phelps Phelps was especially disappointed because he has fought so hard and so long for a recruitment program. Governor Phelps persuaded Representative Crawford, a Congressman of Michigan, who visited American Samoa last year to introduce a bill in the House of Representatives which would establish a recruiting station in Samoa. Lieutenant Governor John C. Elliott recently returned from the United States where he persuaded Congressmen to investigate a recruiting program for American Samoa. As a result of these acts by the Governor and Lt. Governor an opinion of the matter was asked of the Defense Department and Mr. Lovett's letter was the answer.

The Governor has indicated that he intends to continue the fight when he goes to Washington to attend the Senate Finance Committee Hearing. A dispatch carrying the Governor's protest against the Lovett letter argument was sent to the Honolulu press.

Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Fono of American Samoa, Tuiasosopo and Chairman of the House of Ali'i, Satele sent a joint dispatch to Representative Crawford thanking him for his past endeavors on behalf of an American Samoa recruiting station and urging his continued aid in publicising the need for such a program.

The Government of American Samoa M.V. Manu'a Tele was scheduled to sail Friday afternoon for Canton Island with about 18 prospective Samoan farm laborers aboard bound for the United States. The farm laborers constitute a complement to the 29 who were scheduled to fly by Pan American charter plane to Santa Clara, Calif.

The 18 men on the Manu'a Tele will fly to the United States from Canton. The Manu'a Tele will procure 15,000 gallons of motor gas from Canton for the Island Government which is now faced with an acute gas shortage. The Manu'a Tele will take about 7 days to make the round trip and is expected to return to Pago Pago next Friday or Saturday.

Following its return from Canton, the Manu'a Tele is faced with a heavy schedule calling for two trips to Manu'a in two days, on the 14th and 15th of April in order to bring down the Manu'a people for the Flag Day celebration on the 17th. On the 16th of April the Manu'a Tele is scheduled to sail to Apia to bring back His Commissioner Powles of Western Samoa who has accepted an invitation to attend the Flag Day celebration from Governor Phelps, and Fautua Tamasese and Fautua Malietoa, high chiefs of Western Samoa.

The United States Coast Guard Vessel, Buttonwood, which has been tied up in Pago Pago Harbor the past two weeks, sailed for Manu'a Thursday morning to alleviate the transportation shortage resulting from the Manu'a Tele being scheduled to sail to Canton. The Buttonwood returned Thursday night.
