Japs Want Money

Dr. C. B. Wood, Dr. C. B. Cooper and Chester Doyle have been made defendants in a suit for compensation for labor performed, in the sum of \$11,000. The physicians are sued as former presidents of the Board of Health, and Doyle as superintendent of the Drilled detention camp at the time of the plague. Service was had on Doyle yesterday, and the case will come up soon after court convenes.

The claims have been assigned by the Japanese who were confined in and assisting in the work of the camp, to one of their countrymen. The claims are for cooking, cleaning the camp, building sheds and sewing. All of this work was done after the Japanese had been taken to the camp after the fire.

The President Bids Farewell to His Wife and Lies Resignedly.

The American Nation Mourns Its Irreparable Loss.

BUFFALO, September 14.—President McKinley died at 2:15 this morning. His last breath passed calmly and almost imperceptibly.

Secretary Cortelyou made the announcement. He came out of the Milburn house and walked slowly down to the newspaper men...

"The President died at 2:15 o'clock," said he, in an even voice.

THE LAST MOMENTS

MILBURN HOUSE (Buffalo), Sept. 13.—Before 6 o'clock it was clear to those at the President's bedside that he was dying...

The President came out of one period of unconsciousness, only to relapse into another. But in this period, when his mind was partially clear...

One by one they ascended the stairway, Secretary Root, Secretary Hitchcock, Secretary Wilson were there. There was only a momentary stay of the Cabinet officers...

After they had left the sick room the physicians rallied him to consciousness, and the President asked almost immediately that his wife be brought to him...

The President, in his last period of consciousness, which ended about 7:10 o'clock, chanted the words of the hymn "Nearer, My God, to Thee..."

ROOSEVELT TAKES THE OATH.

BUFFALO (N. Y.), September 14.—"In this hour of our terrible national bereavement I wish to say that I shall carry out absolutely unbroken the policy of President McKinley..."

With these words warm upon his lips Theodore Roosevelt at 3:35 o'clock this afternoon took the oath as President of the United States.

Judge Hazel read the oath, the President repeating it after him, phrase by phrase. It was very brief, reading as follows: "I do solemnly swear that I will faithfully execute the office of President of the United States..."

THE FUNERAL.

WASHINGTON, September 14.—The War Department late tonight, after a telephonic conference with Secretary Root at Buffalo...

The remains of the late President will arrive in Washington at 8:30 P. M. on Monday, September 16th, and will be escorted to the Executive Mansion by a squadron of United States Cavalry...

The following morning there will be exercises at the Capitol at 10 A. M. At 1 P. M. sharp they will be borne to the station of the Pennsylvania Railroad...

THE DEATH CERTIFICATE.

BUFFALO, September 15.—The Coroner of Erie county today issued the following certificate of death of the President:

"City of Buffalo, Bureau of Vital Statistics, County of Erie, State of New York—Certificate and record of death of William McKinley: I hereby certify that he died on the 14th day of September, 1901, about 2:15 o'clock A. M. and that to the best of my knowledge and belief the cause of death was as hereunto written:

"Cause—Gangrene of both walls of the stomach and pancreas following gunshot wound.

"Witness my hand, this 14th day of September, 1901:

"H. R. GAYLOR, M. D., "H. Z. MATSINGER, M. D., "JAMES F. WILSON, Coroner.

"Date of death—September 14, 1901.

"Age—58 years, 7 months, 15 days.

"Color—White.

"Single, married, etc.—Married.

"Occupation—President of the United States.

"Birthplace—Niles, O.

"How long in United States, if foreign born—.....

"Father's name—William McKinley.

"Father's birthplace—Pennsylvania, United States.

"Mother's name—Nancy McKinley.

"Mother's birthplace—Ohio, United States.

"Place of death—1168 Delaware avenue.

"Last previous residence—Washington D. C.

"Direct cause of death—Gangrene of both walls of stomach and pancreas following gunshot wound."

Czolgosz Removed.

BUFFALO, September 15.—At 12:30 this (Sunday) morning Superintendent of Police Bolt issued the following notice to the press:

"To relieve the heavy police detail at No. 1 Station, that their services might be used for other important details, it was decided, on consultation with the District Attorney, to remove the President's assassin from the headquarters building, which has been done."

Nothing is known as to where the prisoner is now confined. There are two places where the prisoner could be taken, to the jail or to the penitentiary, and it likely that Czolgosz is now in one of these places.

Barefooted Bill Bagged

Wm. Hoopii, alias Barefooted Bill, for whom the police has been anxiously looking for the past two weeks, wishing him to explain his connections, if any, with the recent burglaries, was apprehended today at the Pacific Mail dock where he disguised as a dock laborer was mixing with the crowd.

A non-suit was granted by Judge Little yesterday in the case of the Bishop of Panopolis vs. Kauai et al relating to a lease.

LOCAL AND GENERAL NEWS

The Warren sailed at 9 o'clock this morning.

The Aorangi arrived from the Colonies this morning.

All government offices, the courts and schools are closed today.

There are 6,789 claims filed with Commissioners on Fire Claims, amounting to \$3,200,000.

A jury yesterday returned a verdict in favor of Asiu Brown who had brought a suit of damages for breach of promise against Andrew Baunister. The damages were assessed at \$2,500.

The October term of the Third Circuit Court will begin Wednesday, October 21. Hon. W. S. Edings will preside and Carl S. Smith will prosecute for the Territory.

St. Andrew's Second Congregation elected the following synodmen last night to attend the synod which will convene here in about two months: W. R. Castle Jr., T. Clive Davis and E. G. Keen.

The hallway leading to the Board of Education offices in the Judiciary building is being partitioned off and roofed with a skylight. It is to be used for the tax office, which is very much crowded.

Hannah II opposes the appointment of Hee Lee as administrator of the estate of Ching Hong Wa Ah, on the grounds that Hee Lee is not the widow of deceased. The estate is valued at \$67,400.

Citizens were called to meet at the offices in the Castle & Cooke building at 2 p. m. today on account of the sad news received by the Warren and to adopt proper measures to express the grief at the national loss.

The band will play solemn music only at the public concerts until the end of the month. This is by special order of the governor. The band today played in the morning and will play at the drill shed this evening.

Lawyer E. Omstead, former deputy sheriff of Waimea, Kauai, who left here some time ago for Norway, got married to Mrs. Paulina Borchgrevink, in Chicago July 27. They have toured the States and the European continent, and are at present in Norway. Their intention is to see relatives in Great Britain from there to go to France, and they expect to reach the Islands just before Christmas.

Ivers-Scott.

Miss Gertrude Scott and Mr. Richards Ivers were married yesterday at noon at the Anglican Cathedral by Rev. Alex. Mackintosh. Miss Marion Scott was the bridesmaid and Harry Whitney acted as best man. After the ceremony a breakfast was given at the Scott residence, and the young couple left the city to spend their honeymoon at the Irwin country seat on this island. The bride is the oldest daughter of Professor and Mrs. M. M. Scott and is a very charming and popular society woman and the bridegroom is the brother of Mrs. W. G. Irwin and connected with the firm of W. G. Irwin & Co.

In the Federal Court.

A large number of attorneys were present in the U. S. District Court this morning and eloquent addresses eulogizing the late President were made. Among the speakers were Judge Estee, Judge Little, attorneys Hatch, Fitch, Dunn, McCant Stewart and others. The speech of McCant Stewart was an oratorical masterpiece and appealed strongly to all present. Judge Estee adjourned the Court until Monday next.

Mrs. Aldrich Sues.

Mrs. Minnie C. Aldrich, of Honolulu, has sued the trustees of the estate of the late William H. Aldrich, of Oakland, charging that their accounts were falsified. She wants \$3,334.32 which, she declares, were diverted from the support of her children by fraud.

The Great Yacht Race.

NEW YORK, September 14.—Sir Thomas Lipton today sent the following message from Sandy Hook: "I am very much pained and grieved in the sad news regarding the President's death, all the more so as I had a most cheering telegram from his brother on the 10th, saying he was happy to inform me that the doctors looked for a speedy recovery. His death is a loss to the whole world, and it will be felt nowhere more than among the British people."

When asked if he wished to say anything regarding the postponement of the international yacht race, Sir Thomas begged to be excused from touching on the subject until the challenge committee of the New York Yacht Club shall have met and formulated a plan. From another source it was learned, however, that by reason of the pressing business engagements of Mr. Jameson, Mr. Watson and Charles Russell, the latter being the representative of Sir Thomas on board the Columbia, they would be unable to remain in America for more than three weeks from today. Without them Sir Thomas would not care to race the Shamrock. So it is hoped the date of the first race can be fixed in time to conform. There will be a meeting of the challenge committee at the New York Yacht Club Monday to decide about the race.

The Court of Fire Claims.

The Court of the Fire Claims Commission met as usual this morning and immediately adjourned for the day out of respect to the memory of the late President, Wm. McKinley, of the United States of America.

Yesterday being the last day within which claims may be lawfully filed for adjudication, 133 claims were filed amounting to \$304,191.84, the last one filed being that of Mary A. Rhodes, by Kinney, Ballou & McClanahan, which was handed to Clerk Riggs after adjournment at 4 o'clock p. m. The claim is for a certain number of calabashes destroyed and the total value placed at \$575.

On Monday last claims amounting to \$89,938.94 were filed. The total number of claims filed up to yesterday is 6748, amounting to a grand total of \$3,167,132.90.

It has been definitely decided that Commissioners Kspokai and Testa will compose the delegation to Wailuku next week, leaving here on Tuesday, October 1.

At the Opera House.

The vaudeville performance at the Opera House last night was very good and pleased the audience from first to last. The house was not very good, owing to different circumstances but we feel assured that a full house will greet the Lilliputians tomorrow evening when another grand vaudeville entertainment will be given. On Saturday evening the Belle of New York will be presented.
