US AND GREAT BRITA MOVE AGAINST FR. INDO-

Japanese Foreign Office Shake-Up Being Watched Closely By Both London and Washington

LONDON, July 22_It was reported here tonight that the British and U. S. governments had reached a complete agreement on prospective steps to be taken by both countries. in the event Japan carries out her reported attempt to forcibly occupy the southern section of French Indo-China.

The appointment of Kumaichi Yamamoto, supposedly an authority on East Asiatic affairs due to his having occupied the post of Chief of the Bureau of East Asiatic Affairs in the past Konoye cabinet, to the position of Vice-Minister of Foreign Affairs, succeeding Chuichi Ohashi, is being held as particularly significant and right in line with Japanese reported moves against French Indo-China, rumors which have been gaining ground during the past few days, especially since the wholesale resignation of the second Konoye cabinet about a week ago.

TOKYO, July 22_The appointment of Kumaichi Yamamoto, heretofore director of the Bureau of East Asiatic Affairs, to the position of Vice-Minister of Foreign Affairs, succeeding Chuichi Ohashi, who resigned as the result of the recent cabinet change, as well as the resignations of two influential, reportedly pro-Axis advisors connected to the foreign office under the Konoye-Matsuoka regime, is causing quite a bit of speculation among foreign diplomatic circles in the metropolis.

The fact that the new vice-minister of the foreign department has been for some time chief of the Bureau of East Asiatic Affairs and the reported movement of Chungking and British troops in the Indo-Chinese area, added to reports of a projected move by the Japanese in the same direction during the past few days, are causing quite a degree of "jitters" both in Tokyo and other capitals of the world, noticeably in London and Washington.










