Kahuku Fully Equipped Says Manager Adams For Economical Work

ANNUAL MEETING HELD TODAY

The annual meeting of the Kahuku Plantation Company was held in the offices of Alexander & Baldwin at 2 o'clock this afternoon.

The sugar statement for 1905 shows total net proceeds to have been \$517,570.92. Gross receipts for sugar, 15,498,825 pounds, mill weights, 15,412,044 pounds, delivered weights.

The report of Manager Andrew Adams is as follows: Crop of 1905.—This crop was estimated to yield from Kahuku cane 7,000 tons, from Laie cane 450 tons sugar, a total of 7,450 tons sugar.

Crop of 1906.—During the warm summer months this crop had a very good growth. The short ratoons were more heavily fertilized than usual and "made cane" rapidly.

Some 35 acres of land has been planted in cane by the Boys' Industrial

School at Waialea, adjoining Field No. 8. This cane will be purchased for this crop.

Repairs.—Over \$8,000.00 was spent during the year on repairs to buildings. Most of this sum was for repairs to buildings occupied by the employees of the company.

NEW TUBES WERE ALSO PURCHASED FOR THE six boilers at the factory and the old mill-house was renovated to make the change from the open clarifier to the Denney system.

Congress Appropriates \$20,000 For Quarantine Island

RECLAMATION IS PROVIDED FOR.

"Quarantine bill passed," is the substance of a cablegram received Saturday by W. A. H. Connor, who represents the San Francisco Bridge Company in its dredging work in Honolulu Harbor.

In speaking about the matter today, Mr. Connor said that his company would undoubtedly be given the work, as there is no one else in position to do it at the present time.

At the rate the big dredger is now working, it will take only 20 days to complete the work after the job has been started. The bill was rushed by mail.

Questions Title Of Palolo Co.

The hearing on the petition of the Palolo Valley Land & Improvement Co., which wants to lead water from the mauka end of the valley down to the proposed site of the Pacific Institute, came up before Commissioner of Water Rights Mrs. Nakulua this forenoon.

At the opening of the game Peters threw out a hot shot by questioning the title of the Palolo Land Co. to its holdings, which it has under a deed from A. F. Cooke.

Mrs. Nakulua held, however, that she would not pass on any question of title, but merely on those concerning water rights.

Expert From Sumatra To Start Large Tobacco Plantation

Land Agent Williams of Hawaii, who arrived last Saturday to discuss land matters with Land Commissioner Pratt, brought some good news regarding a couple of tobacco experts who intend to go into the tobacco raising business in Hamakua on a large scale, having become quite enthusiastic over the results shown by the Federal experimental farm in that district.

The names of these gentlemen are Kretchnar and Gordon. Kretchnar has had a large experience as a tobacco planter in Sumatra, Java and Cuba.

Both these planters are very enthusiastic over the Hawaiian grown tobacco raised on the experimental farm. Kretchnar says that the tobacco grown from Sumatra seed is better than that raised in Sumatra.
