The Humming of Bees.

Last winter, when the mercury was 10 degrees below zero, a thermometer inserted into a cluster of bees showed a temperature of 85 degrees on the inside and 45 degrees Fahrenheit on the outside. The heat generated by the bees could be maintained at that degree with an outside temperature of 10 degrees Fahrenheit, what must be the work of the thermometer at 60 degrees? This is the way the bees manage to reduce it, or at least to secure cool, pure air. A number of bees, a thousand or more, perhaps, act as ventilators or fans. They stand head down at an angle of 45 degrees and keep their wings in motion. Throughout the hive, on all the combs, up and down the ventilators keep their fans going. On the alighting-board, with borders pointing away from the hive, they fan also. At the entrance of one hive, on a day in August, 5,000 bees, by actual count, were fanning. The honey gatherers dropped down upon them, trembled over them, but they kept to their work.

Some writers have spoken of the "hum of the hive," as though the hum was the result of the work going on within. 'Twas the hum of the fanners. But in August, this year, there were nights when the hives were silent. Not an echo of a hum came from any showing that the air was cold enough to disperse with the ventilators.

The English Hair-Apparatus. There seems to have been no special observance of the birthday of the prince of Wales, who was born Nov. 9, 1841. The hair-apparatus to the British throne, who is now 47 years old, is described by a New York lady who recently met him at social entertainments as the most perfect-mannered gentleman in the world, with nothing condescending or patronizing apparent in his bearing, but with infinite tact, grace, and dignity characterizing every salutation and movement.

In person he inclines to be portly, with thick, short hair, round, full face, long body and short legs. His eyes are creamy light, dull, and expressionless, like those of the queen and most of her family. The princess of Wales is described as being most exquisitely dressed, but not at all intellectual. When she happens to say a good thing to any one, she keeps on repeating it to the same person until the repetition becomes tedious. Her children, unlike herself, are droll and unbecomingly dressed by some notion, without the slightest regard to the harmonies of color. They are white haired and white-eyed, and would be called plain if not princely blood.

Use of Pr. Fresco to G. mine. During the last fifteen years the inhabitants of a malarial locality in Kharkoo government in Russia have used the crab powder with great success against the fever. The powder is prepared in the following way: Five crabs are covered with whisky until they get asleep, then they are put on a bread-pan in a hot oven, thoroughly dried and pulverized, and the powder passed through a sieve. One dose, a teaspoonful, is generally sufficient to cure the intermittent fever, in very obstinate cases, a second dose is required. Each dose is invariably preceded by a glass of wine mixture as a purgative. The powder is used in that locality in preference to quinine.

Different Varieties of Tea. A writer from the tea districts of northern India defines the different varieties of tea as follows: The very coarse tea remaining after the first sifting (which ends the "making") is called Bohoa, and the second quality Souchoong. Flowery Pekoe is the very young shoot, with a down on it, called the flower. "Facing" tea is simply cooking it in an iron pan, by which means principally green tea acquires its color.

The Importance of Self Control. An expert and experienced official in an insane asylum said to us a little time since that the insubordinations are filled with people who have given up to their feelings, and that no one is quite safe from an insane asylum who allows himself to give up to his feelings. The importance of this fact is too little appreciated, especially by teachers. We are always talking about the negative virtues of discipline, but we rarely speak of the positive virtues. We discipline the school to keep the children from mischief, to maintain good order, to have things quiet, to enable the children to study. We say, and very rightly, that there cannot be a good school without good discipline. We do not, however, emphasize as we should the fact that the discipline of the school, when rightly done, is as vital to the future good of the child as the lessons he learns. Discipline of the right kind is as good mental training as arithmetic. It is not of the right kind unless it requires intellectual effort, mental conquest. The experienced expert, referred to above, was led to make the remark to us by seeing a girl give way to "sulks." "That makes insane women," she remarked, and told the story of a woman in an asylum, who used to sulks until she became desperate, and the expert said: "You must stop it; you must control yourself." To which the insane woman replied: "The time to say that was when I was a girl. I never controlled myself when I was well, and now I cannot." The teacher has a wider responsibility, a weightier disciplinary duty than she suspects. The pupils are not easy to be controlled, but they must be taught to control themselves. Discipline, honestly, completely.—Journal of Education.

Run on a "Wicked" Bank. When the banks did not want to redeem their notes they would take only one bill at a time, and on such occasions a long line of men would be formed awaiting their turn. If a man went up with \$1,000 the cashier would not redeem it in a lump, as the law allowed them to redeem in \$5 amounts, and would make the holder present it bill at a time. When the bill was handed to him he would turn it over, look at it in every way, smell it and feel it, and finally picking up a gold coin and examining it, would turn it over to the holder of the notes, when he would be given another bill and go through the same movements. A man with \$1,000 in small bills could in that way keep back a line of men for a full business day.—Globe-Democrat.

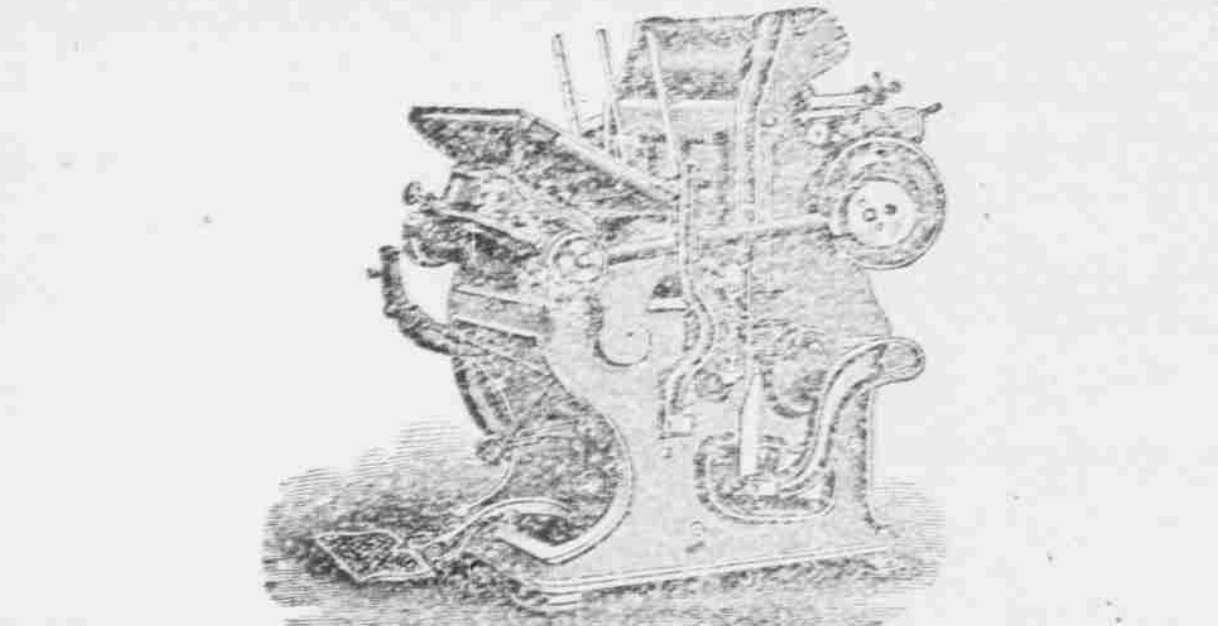
