Late Cruise of the Morning Star

Capt. Colcord. Left Honolulu July 5, 1876 cruised among islands of Gilberts, Marshalls, and Carolines - notice confined principally to Mortlocks.

E Bailey of Wailuku sailed as delegate. (His report being published in the native newspaper Lahui Hawaii.)

Remained 15 days and visited stations of Uoniop, Lukuner, Satrau, Ta, Etal, Kutu and Mar.

Teachers supplied from Ascension or Ponape.

34: 58

June 11, 1877, sixth day of meeting.

Voted to request Oahu and Maui to immediately take into consideration the ordination of those about to embark as missionaries for Micronesia.

Annual Report of Board of Haw'n Evang. Ass'n.

refers to death of Rev. W B Kapu's wife. (He labored 14 years in the Gilberts.

Monetary contributions from Micronesia.

Publications: Revised edition of 2000 copies of Gilbert Islands New Testament being printed in Honolulu by H M Whitney under superintendence of Rev. H Bingham.

Foreign Dept.

Morning Star left July 5, 1876 on annual visit to Micronesia.

Returned Honolulu, January 14, 1877, with Rev. B G Snow and wife, Mrs. Kaaialii and child of Marshall Island mission, Mrs. Logan of Ponape, Rev. H J Taylor and son with Rev. W B K apu and his 3 children of Gilbert Island mission.

Mr. Whitney of Ebon comments on kindness of captains and mates.

Micronesia: Mr. E Bailey, Sr. prepared a large map of groups visited by him in the Gilbert, Marshall and Caroline Islands.

Short articles on each islands progress in church work.

Nonouti - starvation and cannibalism common. Kaupi, a native, left and returned to teach but left again.

Acknowledging copies of Boston Advertiser in which Rev. Joseph Cook's lectures are published. In No. 80, delivered May 30, shows Rev. B G Snow of Micronesian Mission offering prayer.

September, 1877

"A Lone Land, and Who Lived On It"

title of series appearing in WEEKLY NEWS OF AUCKLAND, N 2 by HB Sterndale.
6 appears in June 2 issue.

Lone land referred to is Micronesia including Ascension Island, Strong's Island and others.

○ Tells of beachcombers Cockney Jim, Bob Darling, etc. Includes names Jack Cook, Yankee Jim of California.

Writer also claims since missionaries in Marshall, Kingsmill or Carolines no instance of massacre except of a German schooner on one of northern Marshalls and reported in FRIEND by Rev. Snow - an island where no missionary had ever landed.

Mission families all well, Mr. Logan had left that day for Ebon.
