LOCAL NEWS.

The stolen Crown jewels have been nearly all returned. Wonder if they are genuine!

The bk Alden Besse is at the Oceanic dock loading sugar. Captain Fries hopes to get away the first part of the coming week.

Another German club, secret, is in process of formation. Germans only, are to be admitted.

The sealing schooner Theresa is in the stream, off Brewer's wharf. She will probably sail on her sealing cruise next week.

Kum Won was captured by Captain Larsen this morning. He is an escaped prisoner and a much wanted man.

The bark Albert, Captain Griffith sailed yesterday afternoon for San Francisco with 1190 tons sugar. Domestic value \$67,641.63.

The report of the entertainment given at the Opera House last Saturday evening was omitted in last night's, but appears in this issue, of the HOLOMUA.

The bark Rither is at the old Custom House wharf waiting her turn to take in sugar. She will probably commence loading today.

A new and somewhat lucrative business has been engaged in by the Government of late, viz; auctions sales of dogs at an upset price of \$1.60 per head.

The proposed excursion to Ewa last evening did not take place. There was no "ad" of the projectors in the HOLOMUA.

Don't forget the concert in aid of the Sailor's Home Society at the Opera House on the eve of Washington's Birthday. 'Tis for a good purpose.

The British ship Villalta is in the stream at present waiting sugar. She will not commence loading for a couple weeks to come.

If one desires to be in touch with the music of the outer world it is advisable to visit the Popular Phonograph Rooms, Arlington Block, and listen to some of the latest "hits."

The bkne Irgard is at Brewer's wharf. She has finished discharging and will probably be hauled out in the stream to await turn for loading.

The question has been asked why the side-walk by the Eagle House and up to the Nuanu bridge has not been graded and laid? Another problem is surveying, and there will, probably, be an attempt to dodge the question.

The American ship C. F. Sargent is entirely discharged and is now taking in ballast. Her cargo here was 2000 tons of coal for the U. S. Government.

The British bark Velocity is at the old Custom House wharf, foot of Nuanu street. Captain Martin is only waiting for a few more passengers, before departure for China.

Captain Griffiths of the bark Albert enjoys such popularity amongst Island people that his ship rarely leaves port here without some of the gentler sex as passengers. Mrs. T. F. Lansing a well known society lady, and her children, were among other passengers by the vessel for San Francisco yesterday.

Father Theodore Lauter a well-beloved Catholic priest of the Mission at Wailuku, Maui, died at the Mission-house on Friday (Feb. 9th). The deceased priest has lived and performed the duties of his office, on Maui for nearly a quarter of a century. His death will remove the presence, from the Hana district of one who was a father in social as well as religious council. Father Lauter was only fifty years at the time of his decease.

A DESPARADO

A Smuggler Stabs Two Police Officers.

Joseph Cassideras, cook on the bark S. C. Allen, which arrived in port here from San Francisco lately, a man known to the police as a smuggler has added to his record by again being captured, and, in attempting to escape, having dangerously stabbed two police officers.

The circumstances as related, are that Cassideras had made effort to sell some opium to a Chinaman. The expected buyer informed officer Kanhane, one of the detectives of Captain Larsen's force, and he, Kanhane and Kaouli were detailed to capture the smuggler. Officer Kaouli waited in the vicinity of the vessel on which Cassideras was engaged. About 7 p. m. Cassideras came on shore and was shadowed by the detective until near the corner of King and Maunakea streets when an attempt of arrest was made.

Cassideras immediately became desperate and dropping the opium which he had with him draw a dagger some twelve inches in length and two inches broad and cut and jabbed at the officer Detective Kanhane who was close at hand came on the scene and immediately closed with the desperate smuggler throwing him to the ground. Determined to escape if possible the murderous Chilean cut and slashed with his knife reaching Kanhane in many places the most serious being on the arms and legs. Both officers had their hands cut seriously in the endeavor to get the knife away from their prisoner. Kanhane stuck to his man however and although bleeding from many wounds, he clabbed his man into quietude, and the smuggler was then brought to the Station. There examination was had of the officers wounds by Dr. Cooper and both were ordered immediately to the hospital. Today both officers are in great pain and at one time it was thought that Kanhane would die, but he has since rallied. The desperado smuggler is in the station, and evinces no contrition for his crime.

The American ship B. P. Rither is at the Mail wharf discharging coal. When discharged she will load sugar for San Francisco.

New postage stamps, ordered by the Provisional Government from designs by Mr. E. N. Holds, worth have been received from New York and will be distributed to the public in the near future.

The British Lion and English coat of arms look very much out of place over the doorway to the business house, on Queen street, of that much vaunted spread-eagle American citizen, John Thomas Waterhouse. "Between two stools," etc.

Mr. George Tyrol the sailing master of the yacht Tolna, of which Countess de Festetics is commander, will be sorry to hear of the loss of the steamer C. R. Bishop as he was the sailing master on that vessel, on her 3,000 miles cruise in search of the Lady Lampton's missing boat.

There was a very heavy rain pour last evening from 5 to 7 o'clock. Many streets were flooded but no damage was done except to the road beds. It was noticeable that Adams lane acted as a conduit for a great amount of water which fact being now reported may tend to assist in giving a "pointer" with regard to improved upper grades.
