TOPICS OF THE DAY.

We think it is very improper that a member of the Legislature should apply for and be granted the privilege of a liquor license. While there may not be any encroachment on the domain of "Colonel Mazuma" it looks to the outsiders rather fishy. We think the Senator who now wants to sling gin would have acted with more dignity if he had taken the license in the name of someone else and thereby avoided the comments which are falling upon his head as well as upon the authorities who granted the license.

There is much talk about the small industries, but no one has yet made any practical suggestions. Mr. Frank Brown has in the window of his store on Merchant street a small incubator from which chickens drop daily into the world, grow up on bread and rice and Scotch—we mean water, and when sufficiently big are sent to Mr. Brown's henry at Ewa. Mr. Brown who takes a great interest in the raising of chickens selected as an experiment 52 fine eggs from his "ranch" on the Pacific Heights. Nearly every egg has been successfully hatched and Mr. Brown believes it is due to the cooling atmosphere and darkness prevailing at the heights. Others may follow his example and chickens will eventually be plentiful and served at restaurants as Belgian Hare stew.

In response to a wireless message sent to "Colonel Mazuma" stating the doings of the I. H. R. party in regard to the successor of Governor Dole, an agent of Colonel who is on the top of Mauna Kea, cooling off, received a brief but pointed answer. We have been permitted to use it, but owing to impertinent Grand Jurors we withhold the name of the agent. The Colonel wires: "Tell Bush that Dole is not a grasshopper" or a Nebuchadnezzar but will be in Honolulu tomorrow. Advise the Home Unrulers to stop their gap until re-elected. They may not be in it next time. My love to them but no more dust. "MAZUMA."

We have an idea that the "Colonel" is as wise and powerful, politically speaking, as ever.

"That the cause of the fire which occurred in the Stock Yards should be thoroughly investigated all will agree, but few will agree that it is

wise, without such investigation, to state what was the cause of the fire. To say that it was the act of an incendiary is to point to a few men who may be perfectly innocent. The Star does not claim that the fire was not the act of an incendiary, but there should be good evidence and not theory before so definite a charge is made. That we should have a set of men here willing, for revenge, to destroy property upon such an extended scale, will not add to the confidence in our population, a confidence which, for very strong financial reasons, we have every reason to foster."—The Star.

Is it not about time to drop this constant reference to "confidence in our population" for financial reasons? If Hawaii, a territory rich in its own resources has to be a beggar on a big scale it will be better to drop the whole business and the people here to resume the male and find food from their canoes by fishing or by "roasting" missionaries which is now a usual but profitless job. There is capital enough in the country for all intentions purposes and whatever confidence the Politiz combinations have in the population is of small moment.

Sweet Songs.

The four new Hawaiian songs, the words and music of which were composed by Mrs. Alexandria Kalanikaalaneo Kilioulouinuiamamoo De Fries, and arranged by Captain Berger, were listened to at the band concert at the Royal Hawaiian Hotel last evening by an enraptured audience who encored every song.

On the balcony of the Hotel, which had been reserved for Mrs. De Fries were a large number of friends of the talented lady. The guests were received by Mrs. De Fries and her husband Mr. Henry Kauaunuiawahi De Fries, and during the evening refreshments were served. The singing of the pretty songs by Miss I. Kellias and Mrs. N. Alapai was as sweet as ever and they, as well as the band, received quite an ovation. Queen Liliuokalani was prevented from being present owing to indisposition and among the guests were Judge Estee and Mrs. Estee, Attorney General E. P. Dole, Colonel John Richardson and many others.

LOCAL AND GENERAL NEWS

United States Judge Estes will take a vacation next week until the October term of court.

Mr. Haworth, of the Bulletin's editorial staff, goes to Hilo next week to become editor of the Tribune.

A number of Japanese gamblers, who acted rather "freshly" in the District Court this morning were fined \$10 and costs each.

Pacific Rebekah Lodge No. 1, I. O. O. F., entertained a large number of friends last night at Harmony Hall on King street.

Representative Fred. Beckley had his bicycle crushed yesterday under a wagon driven by one Halvorsen, who is employed at the Iwilei military corrals.

A raid was made at Iwilei last evening and several women arrested charged with soliciting. They will be given a hearing in the District Court tomorrow.

Bishop & Co. have made application for the appointment of Charles Phillips as administrator in the estate of Henry Congdon, deceased. The value of the estate is given as \$5,594.

A jury composed of J. A. Gilman, E. McInerney, A. J. Campbell, T. W. Hobron, W. Dillingham and H. M. Whitney jr., was summoned yesterday by High Sheriff Brown to make an investigation of the cause of the Stock Yards fire.

Wade, sentenced for life for the murder of Gillespie was released on Wednesday on a writ of habeas corpus proceedings. He was re-arrested and was returned to Oahu Jail yesterday morning pending the expected decision of the Supreme Court.

A demurrer has been filed in the case of Kapiolani Estate vs. Charles S. Desky, foreclosure on the Progress Block, in which defendant claims that his wife has not been made a party to the suit, and that no demand has ever been made up on him for an accounting.

The Independent Home Rule party leaders held a meeting at the Foster Hall to discuss the nomination of a successor to Governor Dole, whom the wise men consider is a has-been. No action was taken but it was plain to see that Robert Wilcox has a gubernatorial bee in his bonnet. Dole was not "discharged" however.

A Portuguese liquor case was before Judge Wilcox yesterday morning. The magistrate's patience in regard to ridiculous questions propounded by lawyers is marvellous. A witness was asked when he arrived here from Fiji, and answered "when a very small boy." The attorney wanted dates and facts when Judge Wilcox drily remarked "well I couldn't give evidence to my arrival here, I am unaware of the time of the event." And all laughed as the Judge was born here.

The First Local Mint.

One of the institutions here which has the special attention of tourists as well as the local people is the Mint, which is established on Nuuanu street, opposite Queen Emma Hall. It is interesting to enter the large main working room, where general manager McDonough and his corps of assistants are at work. The cool and large lauai is a proper resting place and the vaults, where the "bars" to be minted and beer are kept present a very tasty spectacle. The Mint is open from 5:30 a. m. to 11:30 p. m. and during those hours the work never ceases. Visitors after looking over the place will find first class refreshments and the purest of liquors.

So They Are Here.

In Paris there is a restaurant that announces for the benefit of visitors of the Anglo-Saxon persuasion, that "American drunks are to be had here."

A New Insurance Company

Yesterday an application was made to the Secretary of Treasury for a charter for "The Oriental Life Insurance Co., Ltd.," with a capital of \$200,000.

The principal place of business is to be in Honolulu, but the field of operations of the Oriental Life Insurance Company is to be chiefly in China and San Francisco.

The present capital stock is divided into 2,000 shares of \$100 each. The largest stockholders are: W. R. Castle Jr., \$10,009; H. V. Murray, \$10,000; Wong Chow, \$10,000; Yong Leong, \$10,000; C. Winam, \$20,000; W. W. Ahana, \$10,000; Eben Smith, \$20,000; J. P. McCoy, \$10,000; Wee Shing, \$10,000; Frank Halstead, \$3,000; Lie Shen Chow, \$2,500; Charles P. Grimwood, \$2,500; H. A. Heen, \$5,000; Chuck Hoy, \$4,000. The total paid-up stock is \$151,000.
