The mongoose is becoming quite numerous in Honolulu. The little creature is the enemy of rats, and also of chickens, ducks, etc. Whether the good effected by the destruction of rats or the evil to poultry is, the question. The chances are that the mongoose will soon be regarded as more of a nuisance than a benefit.

It is understood that the Legislature will be asked to appropriate funds for defraying the cost of taking a census of the Kingdom. No reasonable objection can stand in the way of an appropriation for such purpose. It is a good many years since a count of our population was made, and the registration of births and deaths in the country districts is so imperfect that no accurate reckoning can be made on that basis. In taking a census it is well that it shall be done carefully and accurately, and the appropriation should be sufficiently large to secure good work.

CARRYING FIRE-ARMS.

A very interesting return has lately been issued by the British Foreign Office, from various Legations abroad, on a question which is constantly cropping up in England—and never more frequently than within the last few years—namely, the desirability of restricting the carrying of fire-arms, especially revolvers, by private persons. Magistrates and Judges are constantly insisting upon the necessity of instituting a system of licenses to prevent men from swaggering about the streets with fire-arms in their possession. The subject was lately brought before the House of Commons, and Lord Salisbury undertook to ascertain what the laws prevailing in other countries were upon the subject. In Austria-Hungary the matter appears to be left largely to the local authorities, and in most cases a license is necessary even for those who, from their rank or occupation, are entitled to bear arms; and even by holders of a license arms cannot be brought into public meetings or assemblages of the people. In Bulgaria the licenses are only granted upon the recommendation of two house-holders. In Bavaria police certificates are requisite, and the same is the case in Belgium, where the licenses are issued under very stringent regulations. In Denmark there is no legislation on the subject, and in Baden every man can carry fire-arms unless expressly prohibited by the authorities. There are also prohibitive regulations in France; and in Germany, generally, it is an offence punishable by a police court to carry arms except in accordance with regulations. In Montenegro every adult male is a soldier and goes armed to the teeth. In Holland a new law has been passed prohibiting the carrying of fire-arms in public places but not elsewhere. There are no regulations in Norway or Sweden, but there is a municipal rule in Stockholm forbidding the bringing of fire-arms into churches. Portugal has a system of licenses. In Roumania it is illegal for a person to go armed in the streets, and in Russia to carry weapons of any description in public places is an offence which is heavily punished. In most of the other states there are regulations of one kind or another on the subject. In Great Britain alone a man may carry as many fire-arms as he likes, whenever and wherever he pleases.

Admiral Albini, of the Italian navy, says that the man-of-war of the future will have double screws and a helm at each end, so that it can turn around without losing any time. Its sides, he says, will be unarmored.

WHAT A SETOFF MUST BE.

Decision in G. W. Macfarlane & Co. vs. J. S. McCandless.

Chief Justice Judd has given a decision in the case of G. W. Macfarlane & Co. vs. J. S. McCandless, on motion of defendant to open default granted against him for not answering in November last. After reciting matters in relation to the default the Court concludes: "I find that the plaintiffs' claim is for goods sold and delivered, certain iron piping. The defendant's counter claim or set off is for the use of a certain artesian well-boring rig. I think under our decisions this is not a matter of set off, and would not be received as such if the defendant had answered."

"The offset must be of the same kind and denomination and existing in the same right," to which I can give no other meaning than that the offset must arise in some way from the original transaction between the parties. The use of the well-boring apparatus is an independent matter and ought to be the subject of an independent suit. I therefore affirm the judgment."

AN IMPERIAL LABOR CHAMPION.

Germany's failure to invite Russia to the International Labor Conference to be held in Berlin, avoids the awkwardness which would arise from Russia's probable refusal. France would, if Russia refused, be likely to decline also. As it is, France is to be represented by Senators Jules Simon and Tolain; M. Bardeau, a member of the Chamber of Deputies; M. Linder, an inspector of mines, and M. Delhayre, a mechanic. According to the programme now made public the main questions affecting wage earners in European countries will be discussed. These will include the consideration of Sunday labor, the regulation of work for women and children and information regarding the conditions under which labor is performed. The Emperor William used some strong words recently in his speech at Brandenburg in which he alluded to his own sense of responsibility to God. One of his utterances was as follows: "I mean with all my strength so to trade with my talent that I will be enabled to add another thereto. Those who help me I shall heartily welcome; those who oppose me I dash to pieces." The words lose a shade of their despotic character when we realize that they were used with regard to seeing legislation for the relief of overtaxed working men. Apprehension seems to be felt by the Germans in this country on account of measures now before Congress having regard to the restriction of immigration to the United States and German Immigration Societies in a number of States have elected delegates to a National Convention which it is proposed to hold shortly at Washington for the protection of the interests of German immigrants which are believed to be in jeopardy by bills before the House. St. Louis, New York and Milwaukee are to have specially strong delegations. On both sides of the sea the interests of the sons of the Fatherland are being guarded and the seventy-fifth birthday of Otto von Bismarck will on the first day of April be honored by our German-American citizens here beneath the stars and stripes as well as across the seas. More and more the different nations are becoming one family, with interests blended whether at home or abroad. — J. N. Y. H. Christian Weekly.

Miss E. M. Merrick, a London artist who last year went to Cairo to paint the picture of the Khedive, has now received an order for a portrait of Henry M. Stanley, which the explorer is to present to the Royal Geographical Society. The Isthmus of Corinth Canal Company has been wound up by the order of the Civil Tribunal at Paris, it having been found that three times the amount of capital subscribed would be necessary to complete the undertaking. The collapse of the Panama Company has undoubtedly prevented the earnings of the French peasantry from being sunk in any more such roseate-lined schemes.

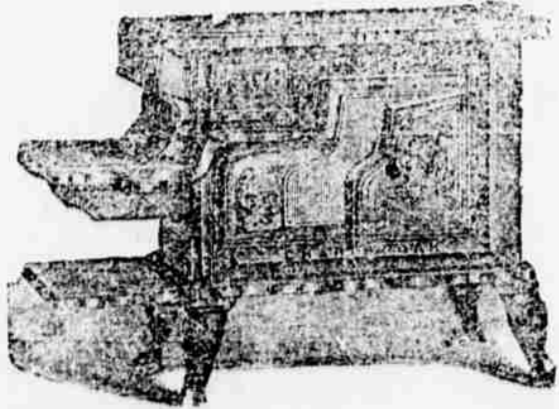
