IT HAS HAD NO LICENSE

TRICKERY IN CONDUCT OF A CHINESE THEATER.

Money Put Up by Managers but No Paper Secured - A Young Man Charged with Sharp Practice.

All the actors and stage help of the old Chinese theater were arrested about 7 o'clock Monday evening on the charge of conducting a public show without license. They were released on a check of \$2,500, furnished by Kat Poo. In the Police Court this morning the case was set for Saturday.

The actors and the manager of the theater, Mr. C. Din Sing, tell a story of the trouble which may get William H. Crawford, a well known young man, into a muddle. They say: "Crawford managed all the outside affairs of the company.

"He would go to the Deputy Marshal and have the applications made out, but the licenses were never procured at the office of the Minister of Interior. They say Crawford pocketed the money. Of course the police department thought the licenses were taken out."

But a reckoning day came. The police found out that the theater was operating without a license and had been doing so, with the exception of three nights, since May.

It is not unlikely that the young man will be charged with embezzlement.

SECOND TERM. John Mokuula plead guilty in the District Court this morning to the charge of larceny and was given eight months on the reef at hard labor. He served a term of two months once before for the same offense. This time he stole two tubs of butter from his employers, Messrs. Lewis & Co.

POLICEMAN IN PRISON. He Made a Vicious Assault Upon a Helpless Prisoner.

John Keenan, a sailor of the ship Troop, while being taken to the station house Saturday night was kicked in the mouth by Police Officer Welau, and has since been in the hospital. The sailor was arrested at the Empire corner for being drunk and was being taken to the station by two officers. Welau came along as the prisoner fell and did the kicking.

The toe of the shoe seemed to have struck between the eyes and laid the nose at the bridge open. Two teeth were knocked out and the lower part of the mouth was badly crushed. As the man immediately sank into unconsciousness, it was feared his brain was also injured. Such, however, is not the case and he will pull through all right.

The story of the assault is told by the two officers and confirmed by a sailor of the Ladas, who was present. Marshal Brown called Welau in Sunday morning and discharged him.

Welau was arraigned in Police Court today on the charge of assault and battery. He plead guilty and was sentenced to three months at hard labor and to pay court costs. He was taken to the reef at once.

LARGE FUNERAL. The Portuguese funeral Sunday morning, which called out the Union and the Concordia band was that of Mrs. Louisa Frietas. She was a relative of Mr. Antone Fernandez and wife of a member of the Portuguese Union. About two hundred were in the procession. The remains were interred in the Catholic cemetery.
