"Living Stones" of Falkland.

The most curious specimens of vegetable or plant life in existence are the so-called "living stones" of the Falkland Islands. These islands are among the most desolate spots in the world, being constantly subjected to a strong polar wind. In such a climate it is impossible for trees to grow erect, as they do in other countries, but nature has made amends by furnishing a supply of wood in the most curious shape imaginable. The visitor to the Falklands sees, scattered here and there, singular shaped blocks of what appears to be weather beaten and moss covered boulders of various sizes. Attempt to turn one of these "boulders" over, and you will meet with a surprise, because the supposed stone is actually anchored by roots of great strength. In fact, you will find that you are feeling with one of the native trees. No other country in the world has such a peculiar "forest" growth, and it is said to be next to impossible to work the stone blocks into fuel, because it is perfectly devoid of "grain," and appears to be nothing but a twisted mass of woody fibers. - St. Louis Republic.

Boda Fossilized Engines.

A fossil locomotive engine was recently used on the Aix-la-Chapelle railway. The motor power is derived from soda. The invention is based on the principle that softening of soda, which have high boiling points, liberate heat while absorbing steam. These engines emit neither smoke nor steam and are perfectly silent. Compared with coal burning locomotives, soda engines show a capacity equal to the former, while they are worked with greater ease and simplicity.

AGAIN it may be remarked that local conditions appear unfavorable to the development of the cholera germs. The pure air kills it.

NOT counting Sabbath-schools it is estimated that every year in the United States 20,000,000 religious services are held, and that 10,000,000 sermons are preached in 165,000 places of worship.

MR. MOODY is so encouraged with the results of his evangelistic tour in Mexico that he says if he could had the language he would canvas every engagement in the United States and spend the next six months there.

IT SHOULD be clear that when a rebel has been vanquished and subdued he becomes a political prisoner and especially in a Republic is not regarded as a criminal. That is the ordinary rule. Exceptions are extremely rare.

SEEK this is an eventful year in Hawaii. First we have a revolution and a military commission, then a special session of the legislature with the land act and cable scheme, next a weakening of a cholera bacillus, with quarantine. And four months of the year left yet.

THERE is certainly need of sending cholera news to the other islands. THE STAR was shown to-day a letter from Waiuku, Maui, in which the writer said a steamer purser had told them people were dying of the plague in Honolulu "like rotten sheep."

IF by any stroke of fortune Tom Reed should become President of the United States, he will probably be the first accomplished linguist to occupy that office. Mr. Reed is passionately fond of the study of languages. His English is of the pure and undefiled order and he is fluent in French, German, Spanish and Italian.

HOW vindictive and unreasoning an intelligent person can be on occasion. A note to THE STAR begins: "All the great scourges which have fallen to the Hawaiians have come through the management of the good missionaries." And this unsensational expression of prejudice and hatred is from a woman. And there is much more of it.

THE problem of how to keep cool in summer offers a wide range of glorious possibilities, but probably the most extraordinary method ever heard of is that of the King of Siam. This ingenious gentleman escapes the torrid rays of Old Sol by depositing himself for hours at a time in the cooling if aqueous embrace of a lake. There he sits in a house of glass as comfortable as can be, while the pond lilies droop and the furnace-like heat spreads itself all over his domain.

JUSTICE that is late but none the less clear and vigorous on that account has been done the memory of Edgar Allan Poe in a recent biography by George Hamlin Fitch. The latter declares that Poe's detective and mystery stories as well as his supernatural sketches and tales of scientific adventure are yet at the head of their respective classes. The best of the French and English writers, who have either copied after him or derived their inspiration from his work, have failed to equal what he produced. Mr. Fitch says that no man of letters has been the victim of so many shameful romances as Poe.

GLADSTONE and Armenia. LONDON, August 7.—The Morning Post today, referring to the Armenian question, says that it fears that Gladstone's speech at Chester will prove dangerously mischievous. His extravagant criticism and wild words, says the Post, may kindle a civil war in the Sultan's domains. This may spread into a European conflagration, and England with her millions of Mohammedan subjects in India may be threatened with a renewal of the horrors of the Sepoy mutiny of 1857.

Timely Topics.

August 26, 1895.

It is a wonder that so far no great essayist has produced an everlasting dissertation on the monotony of man. How much easier it is to say the same thing over and over again or to ring changes deceiving yourself only, than it is to come out with something original. A lengthy continued residence in Hawaii will reduce the vocabulary as it limits the range of comment. This may be altered considerably when we have a cable and get mail more frequently. How isolated we really are. There was one stretch this year of twenty-two or twenty-three days without a single word from the outside world. It is a marvel the community does not quarrel during those fasts. But to return to and give an instance of the monotony of man as an individual. At Paso Robles, California, where the principal yard work of the householder is removing acorns from the lawn and walks, they have sulphur and mud springs of great medicinal powers. Just like some fellows once described the volcano as looking like hell, a one-lunger at Paso Robles, in an inspired moment, remarked as he sat in a mud bath that he was uncertain as to whether he had after the experience, more or less respect for a hog. About 97 of every 100 persons who visited the place since that time have repeated this and half of them at least have thought they were springing something real clever. Around Paso Robles are the greatest prune orchards of the world, the best soils for spuds and some of the best wheat fields.

Many improvements are constantly being made to bring the bicycle as near perfection as possible. One part has apparently been overlooked in the general improvement, and that is the shape of the sprocket wheels. It is, nevertheless, a fact, that in nine-tenths of the bicycles made today, the teeth on the rear sprocket are made without correct mechanical shape; in fact, are mere projections to keep the chain from slipping around the sprocket without turning the wheel. Some are made in the shape of a V, and are so pointed that they form a regular inclined plane, on which the chain climbs whenever any power is applied.

The object of the Cycloidal Sprocket as usual on the Tribune is to remove this useless friction and cause the chain to drive as freely as the running of ball bearings. There is no necessity for friction in the running of a chain; all that is necessary to prevent it, are four conditions: 1st.—That the teeth shall be curved properly to enter the chain without contact. 2d.—That the chain shall pull exactly at a right angle, with its bearing surface against the teeth. 3d.—That the chain block shall not shift or change its position while passing around the sprocket. 4th.—That the teeth shall leave the chain without the least resistance. In order to establish these conditions it has been found, after much consideration and practice, that it is necessary to form the teeth with what is known as a cycloidal curve, which in mechanics is the curve by which a circle, when rolled along a plane surface. The advantage of the cycloidal tooth is most apparent when the rider is climbing a hill or forcing his wheel rapidly on an up grade or against the wind. This is where the ordinary tooth grinds and makes the rider work at least 15 per cent. harder than there is any necessity. MARVELOUS JENNY LIND. Interesting Reminiscences of the "Swedish Nightingale."

Among the most interesting of those of whom John A. Davidson Symonds gives reminiscences in his recently published autobiography is Miss Jenny Lind Goldschmidt, of whom the image has faded away for the present generation, like that of all whose power was displayed on the ephemeral sphere of the stage.

She was a very charming account of the simple, unassuming, and womanly singer, who had the highest devotion to her art, saying, "I sing to God," and whose home life and manners were those of simple affection and womanliness.

Jenny Lind had passed beyond the bloom of youth when Symonds saw her, and her marvellous talent was beginning to lose its power, but her artistic method was as pure as ever, and her expression as magical.

The following is his singular account of her singing: "Miss Goldschmidt came on second in 'On Mighty Pegasus.' She was quite in black and looked to me an old, worn lady, with a large head and a small person. She wore no corset, and her dress, with its loose waist, reminded me of grandmothers'."

At the first tones of her voice I quivered all over. It was not her wonderful execution, her pathos, varying expression, subtle indefinability, that surprised me, but the pure timbre, which so vibrated and thrilled my very soul that tears came into my eyes.

The volume of tone she threw out and then diminished to a whisper, which permeated the room, the dimly-lit chandeliers and candelabras, brilliant accents and floods of swift, successive notes I expected, but I had not realized such quality of voice.

He gives a charming picture of the home of the Goldschmidts at Oak Lea, and this account of the singing cantriero singing to her bird is very wonderful: "A blackbird lunged in a cage outside the door. Miss Goldschmidt went up and talked to it 'Come pretty bird, pretty, pretty little bird, do give us a little song. We want to hear you sing so much, you pretty, pretty little bird.' Then Miss Goldschmidt sang for the bird and long shakos and high, sharp notes which made the bird most inquisitive. But he continued silent until she turned to go, and then he gave a loud, shrill chirping, as if to call her back."—Cincinnati Enquirer.
