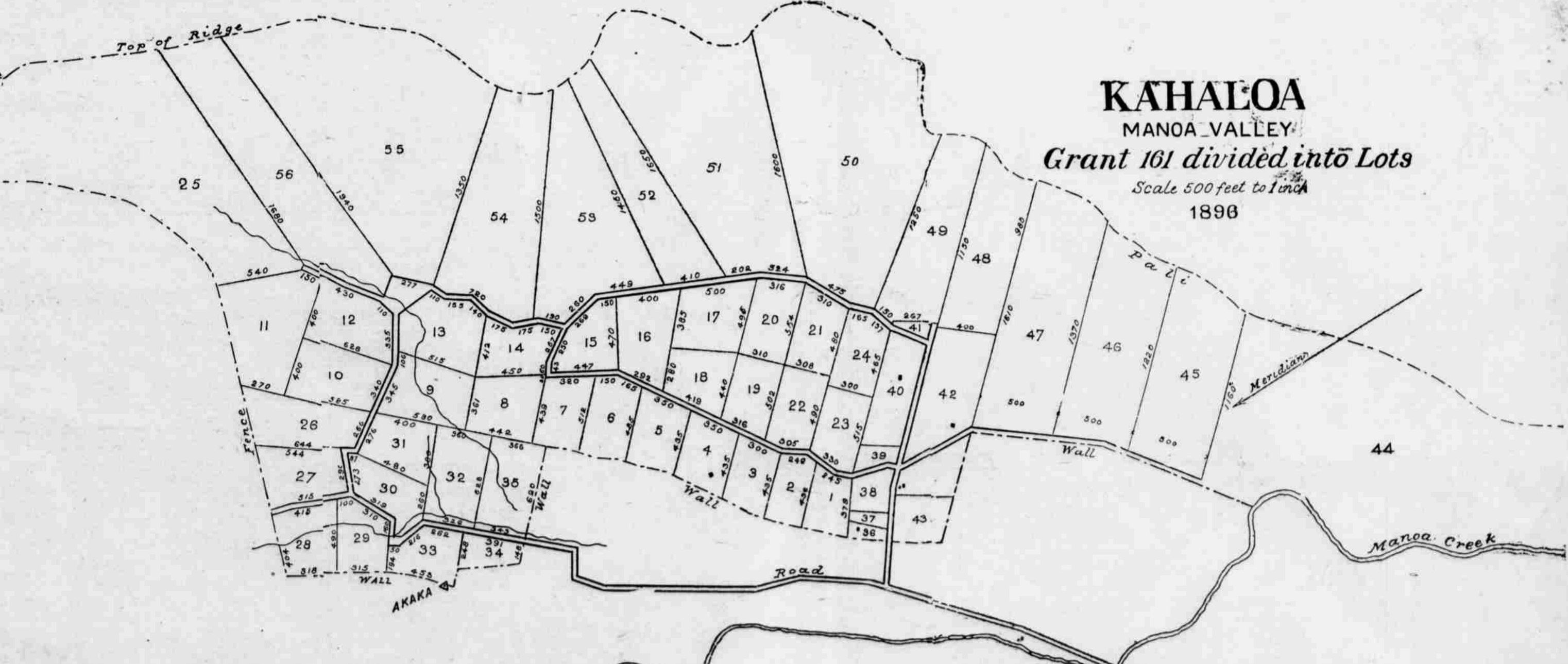

A resolution is pending in the House at Washington looking to the adoption, some years in the future, of a series of international coins.

The light air cut went through the House with bells on it and the Minister of Finance, who has made a hard fight, almost single handed, emerged from the contest with colors flying and ready for another tilt.

The Hilo Tribune comes out flat-footed and strong against the registration Act. That paper hits the thumb mark a sharp rap and dwells at considerable length on other features of the law that is considered very objectionable.

Mr. C. A. Brown, who is a member of the Board of Health, is looked to leave soon for a visit to the United States.

HE SHOWS LONG EARS.

It is the redeeming feature of the letter of Mr. Lansing that he confesses it is the product of impulse. It is not published or given comment upon impulse. The communication was received on last Saturday too late for use in the issue of that day.

Mr. Lansing has been informed that this evening's Star will present it. The erratic and temperamental is a business man of Honolulu, a public official and has considerable prominence in several local institutions.

Those who know him more intimately, who have had close association with him, will only regret that he has once more shown his frightful lack of balance. He tries to tear a passion to tatters, but only flounders about ridiculously. He usually does just that thing when he gets mad and in no five-minute discussion can he escape an attack of hot temper.

The Star could say a good deal more of Mr. Lansing personally in this connection, but out of charity refrains. As to "ungentlemanly" reference to Ambrose Hutchison, it will take a man much better schooled in the prophecies to give the Star or anyone else lessons in this field.

His defense of the Board of Health is so weak and fallacious and indefinite that the other members will be unable to resist in joining in the smile of men of judgment and the public generally. The Star makes a study of questions and details of Government with the sole view of accomplishing or assisting in accomplishing the greatest good for the greatest number. It will continue in the work and if past record is a fair criterion will render service not to be despised. The Star will be on the job long after Mr. Lansing returns from the exalted position of Member of the Board of Health.

Reports of the proceedings of that body will evidence that Mr. Lansing is what is sometimes described as an echo and quorum member. The Star has poured forth no venom. It is the desire of the paper to make friends, not to raise up enemies, therefore it could not afford to be ruled by bias, prejudice or personal desires, or to lose its steadiness over time.

Mr. Lansing, or his firm, holds stock in the corporation that owns this paper. The writer, who also holds stock, will readily assist Mr. Lansing in having a general meeting of the owners. An appeal to the Board of Directors is another course open to him. In either case he will learn these facts: That the Star is a free, independent and public spirited journal, more widely read than any other Honolulu daily, with more friends, with more ideas, with more advertising patronage and free from mortgage or debt of any kind.

Mr. Lansing. You are at least diverting and then when people like yourself and other weak and ering factors fly at an editor he knows he is doing work with some ginger and some strength and effect in it.

AGAINST REGISTRATION. [Hilo Tribune.] Some 250 Hawaiians held a meeting at the old Chinese Joss house on Front street. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the Registration Act.

Many of those present made strong speeches against the law. It is stated that a majority of the Portuguese residents of Hilo and district will also oppose the law.

HILO ON ANNEXATION. Senator Lyman has introduced the regulation annexation resolution in the Legislature. Which reminds us of the boy who, when asked by his Sunday school teacher if his father had religion, replied, "Yes, but he is not working much at it."

Senator Lyman was perhaps selected by the Government to be the mediator of its proposed faith in the "cause" because only a small minority of the votes that elected him would be cast for annexation of the question was put to the people today.

GEARED AERMOTORS

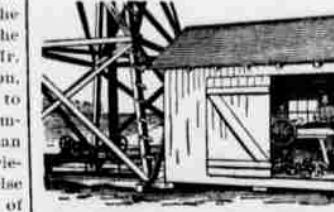
THEIR SIMPLICITY OF CONSTRUCTION AND EASE IN FACING THE WIND.

In the pasture and grazing districts of these Islands it is not always convenient to have power separate from that used to obtain the water for stock and we wish to state that the Geared Aermotor not only produces a sufficient flow of water for house and stock purposes, but by a belt connection does away with the extra power required.



GEARED AERMOTOR.

The above cut represents the 12 foot Aermotor pumping water and cutting feed at Kapaa, Kauai, and the lower cut brings the manner of connection in closer perspective; showing the cane tops in the process of being turned to food.



CUTTING CANE TOPS.

The feed grinder is always in position. You have only to turn a hand screw to adjust the lower grinding ring sufficiently close and it is all ready for use or in an instant you can put on a belt to run any other machine. 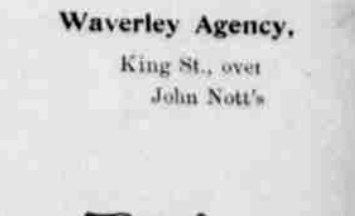
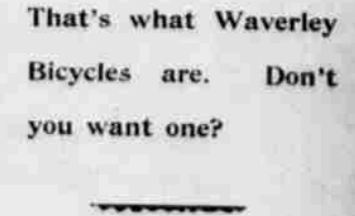
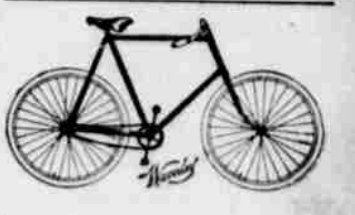
