

Today is Memorial Day. This day, May 30, is a national holiday observed in the United States and all possessions and territories of the United States in honor of the dead. The day especially honors the war dead; those men and women who have died for their country in past and present wars. Today, Memorial Day 1952, just seven years after the greatest war in our nation's history, men are still dying in Korea; their names are to be added to those millions who before them have died in defense of the same principles of freedom and justice to which the United States has since its inception been dedicated and to which as a member nation of the United Nations is yet further dedicated on a world-wide scale.

Mr. John C. Elliott, Lieutenant Governor and Acting Governor of American Samoa said, concerning the observance of the holiday in American Samoa: "Memorial Day is to be observed in American Samoa, not only as a territorial possession of the United States, but also because of the Samoan dead, both those who have died on the battle field in defense of their adopted nation and those who have died here in Samoa as Samoans loyal to the United States of America for fifty-two years. Although it is unnecessary to remind the Samoan people to pay tribute to the dead, yet I would like to call special attention to those honored dead, American and Samoan, who have died side by side for a common cause."

Special Memorial Day services will be conducted today by the Veterans of Foreign Wars under the direction of Post Commander Edward Hunkin. The veterans group will leave the main dock at 9:00 on the motor launches for the SRU pier. From there they will march to the Government Cemetery where services will be conducted. The public is invited to attend.

World News: The Prime Minister of England, Winston Churchill, speaking to the House of Commons said that the Communists have more than doubled their strength in Korea. Churchill said that the Reds have nearly one million men, mostly Chinese, in Korea, as well as strengthened artillery and self-propelled gun units. But he made it quite clear that Allied commanders in Korea believe they can handle any offensive the Communists may launch at this time. The Prime Minister also said that he doubted whether the Reds ever really wanted an armistice in Korea.

The Korean truce talks which were adjourned last Friday until Tuesday of this week have been continuing on the same discouraging basis. Major General William Harrison reported that the enemy negotiators are blocking an armistice. He told the Reds Thursday that they are disappointed because so few Communist prisoners want to return home. The Communists, however, have been very cleverly destroying the ground under UN prisoner exchange stands by the continuing prison camp riots. The organized riots have countered any propaganda value the Allies hope to realize from their voluntary repatriation demands. Harrison proposed another recess after Thursday's meeting but North Korean General Namil, following Communist chess tactics, insisted on continuing the existing pressure. Another meeting was consented to by the United Nations delegates for Friday.

Meanwhile General Mark Clark's deputy Chief of Staff said after a visit to Koje where renewed rioting was quelled by the forcible entry of British and American troops into Compound 66 by use of tear gas that the situation there is well in hand. Major General Blackshear Bryan affirmed that he is one hundred percent behind Brigadier General Hayden Boatner and that the new camp commander has done a "fine job". Boatner lectured to prison camp leaders in his office on obedience as if, a spokesman said, he was talking to children.

In Washington two resolutions calling for an investigation of the recent incidents at Koje and also of earlier Communist atrocities against Allied soldiers were introduced in the House by New York Democrat Gary Clemente and Republican Edith Nearis Rogers of Massachusetts. Senator Styles Bridges said the whole Korean chain of command should be looked into to determine final responsibility for the Koje Island outbreaks. The New Hampshire Republican said that responsibility may lie further up than the two brigadier generals who were demoted.

The French Government reported that it had put down a new series of "Communist-inspired" riots in Paris which were evidently staged as a discouragement to General Ridgeway, the new European Commander for Allied forces, but there was also an element of protest against "general French security", French police reported. The number one Communist leader in France, Jacques Duclos, was arrested along with 700 others. One rioter was killed in the demonstrations and about 20 were injured.

Bernard Baruch, perennial advisor to Presidents, at eighty-one delivered a fierce talk to a Senate group, urging Congress to increase America's defense efforts. Baruch, always a serious "all-out mobilizationist", suggested that more emphasis be placed upon actual arms production in view of the immediate crisis which Baruch says authorities agree will exist between the present and 1954. A large part of the present production program, Baruch says, is aimed at building up productive capacity. It is no time, Baruch emphasized, for "business as usual" nor

Local News:

Mr. Theron Warth who is producing the motion picture "Return to Paradise" for Aspen Productions in Western Samoa arrived in American Samoa Sunday night aboard the Manu'a Tale to make arrangements for shipping 120 tons of equipment which was scheduled to arrive in Pago Pago aboard the strike-bound Sierra to Western Samoa. The Sierra was originally scheduled for June 6 and production on the picture was scheduled to begin about the middle of the month coincidental with the arrival of the picture's star, Mr. Gary Cooper of the films. It was anticipated that with the Manu'a Tale scheduled for dry dock in Suva during the month of June, the S.V. Samoa would be used to transport the equipment which includes a twelve ton generator to Apia from Pago Pago.

Meanwhile, preproduction rehearsals and preparations are now going on in Apia under the supervision of Mr. Mark Robson who will direct the picture and Mr. Ron Thelan, the production manager. One of the more noteworthy news items from Western Samoa concerns the enthusiasm of the people from Hollywood for Miss Moira MacDonald a twenty-one year old local girl, who is slated for an important supporting role. She is reported as making excellent progress with her part. Miss Roberta Haines, who is to play the lead opposite Mr. Cooper, is reported to be studying Samoan as well as being instructed in the fine art of the siva by Mrs. Aggie Gray. Mrs. Gray is also instructing a Samoan girls' group of singers and dancers. Some parts of the script will be translated into Samoan and the language used to achieve realism where dialogue is not completely essential to the sense of the film.

Mr. Warth in the company of Mr. Bruce Lowe, the Asst. Director of Commerce & Industry, inspected the Eastern District Tuesday afternoon. Mr. Warth has expressed the view that there are several pictures scheduled with South Sea localities in the next two years, but, he made it clear, one fundamental necessity for film production is regular air service.

"Return to Paradise" based on the book by James Michener is being made in Western Samoa with blocked sterling funds accumulated by American picture companies in England and other Commonwealth nations which cannot be converted into dollars to be taken out of the country. Such funds make production in British and Commonwealth territories financially attractive.

The Governor of American Samoa, Phelps Phelps, reported by letter to Lt. Gov. John C. Elliott that he had not been able to determine the date when the Senate Finance Committee would hold its hearing upon the budget for American Samoa or even if the Committee would hold a hearing upon it at all. Because of the tremendous pressure under which the Congress is now working, faced with important defense and foreign aid appropriations bills, plus the up-coming political conventions in July, it may be necessary for the Senate to consider the House Bill from the floor. Meanwhile, in Samoa, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, Tuinasopo, conferred with Mr. Elliott, Acting Governor of American Samoa on the advisability of setting a definite date for the special session of the Fono. It would be impractical to put off indefinitely the special session. A dispatch was sent to Washington by Mr. Elliott asking for any available information and together with Speaker Tuinasopo decided that a Fono would be called at any rate if no information was forthcoming, the results of the session necessarily being subject to review based on financial developments.

The Government of American Samoa, received word from Admiral MacMorris, commanding the 14th Naval District in Honolulu, that a transport is definitely scheduled to leave Honolulu, possibly in late June, for American Samoa to carry the wives and children of the Samoan servicemen stationed in Honolulu to Hawaii.

Acting Governor Elliott appointed Fred Urtle, Chief Customs Officer, to act as the official transportation chief for all transport passage. Mr. Urtle will process each dependent to make sure their travel papers are in order and that all medical qualifications have been fulfilled. This processing will begin Monday, June 2. The Transportation Officer will send for the dependents, following a list supplied by the Navy of Samoan dependents. Mr. Urtle emphasizes the point that it will be useless to come in seeking transportation until the dependents have been sent for. The processing will be done in family units. Mr. Edward Johnson reveals that the Navy list contains 365 dependents who already have been booked by the Navy for passage to Honolulu. These dependents will be processed first, of course.

So far, there have been no definite plans made for the transportation of civilians from American Samoa to Hawaii aboard the Navy ship. Further announcements will be made concerning private passage after the dependents have been processed.

A labor recruiting representative from the United States now in Western Samoa is due in Pago Pago late this week. Mr. Kusano has requested permission which the Government of American Samoa has given to recruit Samoan labor for American farms. Contracts for the laborers are now under consideration by the Attorney

General, Mr. Gerald Gottlieb. No definite information is available as to the number of laborers Mr. Kusano intends to recruit locally.

Reports from the Samoan workers now working on the farm of Mr. Namimatsu in Santa Clara, California indicate that Samoans are proving to be very capable workers and that they are enjoying the work.

The gift boxes prepared for the Junior Red Cross by the children of American Samoa with the cooperation of Samoan Industries have been received in the United States according to Mr. Edward Johnson, who is Chairman of the local Red Cross. Boxes were sent to the forty-eight states and Washington, D. C. Letters of acknowledgement and thanks have been received from nine states by the Governor's Office and in a letter to Governor Phelps Phelps, the Director of Insular and Foreign Operations for the Red Cross has expressed his gratitude for the publicity pictures showing Governor Phelps distributing the Red Cross boxes to Samoan children. Commissioners of Education and School Superintendents in Sacramento, Tallahassee, Montgomery, Columbia, Jackson, Boston, Atlanta, Baton Rouge and Boise have all sent news clippings and letters from school children which express the interest and delight American school children show for the Samoan handicraft. Most of the products will be taken on statewide tours of the schools and then placed in State or private museums for permanent display.

Mr. Bill Meredith of the Attorney General's Office received a letter from his son, Samuel, who left for the United States aboard the Seni Bua, which was being returned to its owners in San Pedro, California, which said that the young Meredith was enjoying a visit with Mrs. Elsie Heinrich of Chula Vista, California, Mr. Meredith's sister. The letter was dated the 23 of May and on that day in American Samoa, the Government received a request for information concerning Samuel Meredith which led his father to believe that he was joining the Navy. Mr. Edward Phinnes, who is staying with Mrs. Heinrich also, indicated in a letter to Postmaster Edward Hunkin that he too will join the Navy and it would seem likely that both boys are already enlisted.

The Seni Bua had an adventuresome trip between here and Hawaii, breaking into flames twice and having the engines flooded with sea water by one attempt to extinguish the flames.

The Viator, a trim yacht owned by Mr. W. H. Close of San Francisco arrived in Pago Pago Sunday, May 25 from Tahiti. There are three persons aboard including Mr. and Mrs. Close. The Viator took nine days to make the journey from Tahiti.

The thirty foot yacht was here once before fifteen years ago and is the one referred to in Mr. Elliott's testimony before the House Sub Committee on Appropriations on which two Samoan boys sailed to Honolulu to enlist in the Army.

Mr. Close is on a projected world cruise which may be made by halves; the Viator will be put up in Australia while Mr. Close returns to business interests in the States by plane and then takes another leave of absence to complete the tour. One of the landmarks which Mr. Close immediately noticed as different from his visit on the Viator fifteen years ago is the missing radio towers.

The heavy migration of people from American Samoa will begin June 7 when Mr. and Mrs. Edward L. Davis will leave on the Tofua for Suva where they will make airline connections and fly to San Francisco. The Asst. Director of Administration and his wife will spend their leave visiting with their parents in Utah and Washington and friends in San Francisco. Mr. Davis will return approximately the end of August and Mrs. Davis will rejoin him at a later date.

On June 8 Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Watson and their one-year old son George are scheduled to leave Apia by plane for the United States. Mr. Watson has been employed for two years in the Department of Agriculture as a teacher in the vocational agriculture school. The Watsons are returning to their home in Indianapolis, Ind.

On June 16, Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Swan and their children, John, Clifford and Garnet will leave Apia for Honolulu where they will spend some time visiting with friends. From Honolulu Mr. and Mrs. Swan will return to the United States to visit members of Mr. Swan's family in Long Beach, California. Mr. Swan has served as the automotive instructor in the Vocational School for the past two years.

Miss Carol Bell, the daughter of Mr. George Bell will leave Apia June 13 aboard the Norwegian freighter Thor I bound for Australia and thence to the United States via the Panama Canal, docking at Baltimore Maryland. Miss Bell plans to attend college in Cincinnati, Ohio.

The voyage of the Thor I will be its last in Pacific waters. She will enter into the Canadian-South African service on her return to the Atlantic. The ship is being replaced by a new vessel, the Thorsisle, whose first scheduled trip into Apia is on July 12.

politics as usual. A severe critic of the United States defense mobilization, Baruch continued by pointing out that, in his estimation, inflation has increased the cost of mobilization by twenty billion dollars. Unless prompt action is taken, he said, the US cannot overtake the Soviet Union in military preparation.

In Washington the Senate finally passed the Foreign Aid Bill after a last minute cut of an additional \$200,000,000, bringing the total cut by the Senate to one and a half billion. The Senate Foreign Relations Committee voted for a cut of one billion earlier. The Senate bill now calls for \$6,700,000,000 in military and economic help for America's allies. The measure must now go to a joint House-Senate conference committee for a final compromise.

General Dwight Eisenhower is expected to receive another tremendous welcome when he arrives in the United States from Europe where he resigned his position as Commander of the NATO forces now mobilizing in Europe in order to seek the Republican nomination for the presidency. Eisenhower is expected to arrive Sunday, June 1, approximately one month before the Chicago Republican convention. Many interested political observers will watch Eisenhower closely to see if he will ride into Chicago on a wave of popular support and stampede the convention or if by committing himself on domestic issues his general grass roots support will dwindle, leaving a clear path for the professional politicking of Robert Taft and cohorts.

The Senate Judiciary Committee has approved a constitutional amendment which would prevent executive seizure of private property. If two-thirds of the House and the Senate pass the measure, it would then be sent to the State legislatures where three-fourths of the States must ratify the proposed amendment before it would be admitted to the fundamental law of the land.

Singmon Rhee, the President of the South Korean Republic defied his national assembly by refusing to lift the martial law decree which placed the city of Pusan under strict military control. The assembly had voted to lift the martial law.

Communist artillery fired its heaviest barrage of the year at UN lines for the twenty-four hour period ending at 6 PM Wednesday. More than 7,000 shells were launched by the Reds, more than five times their usual amount. Some allied divisions have fired as much as 20,000 rounds in a single day, however. The heavy artillery attacks were directed at one area on the western front near Karang Po and at two spots in the east near the Punch Bowl.

The Manu'a Tele arrived in Pago Pago early Thursday morning from Manu'a Federal Judge A. Maris and Judge A. A. Morrow of the High Court of American Samoa were aboard, returning from an inspection of legal matters in the Manu'a group. Mr. Lafi Toelupe of the Judicial office made the trip with Supervisor Aifili Lauvao of the Department of Education returned from an inspection trip of the Manu'a schools.

Father McKey also returned from a visit to Manu'a, Thursday morning. High Chief Lefiti, District Governor of the Manu'a District is making a visit to Tutuila.
