22 February saw the close of the current police school. This five (5) weeks of training in the duties of policemen, close order drill, police administration, jujitsu, fire fighting, elements of criminal law, and the handling of crowds was attentively followed by the trainees. In addition, five (5) hours of lectures in first aid were given by competent personnel. This training is well worth the effort; first, in it's effect on the policemen themselves. They reason that if someone takes the time and energy to train them, their job must be important. This raises their self-confidence and morale. Secondly, the other people are impressed by the training too, and the prestige of policemen is raised. Third, the police actually learn things which will be put to use in the future.

Law and order are maintained by the Palau Insular Constabulary of forty-six (46) native constables headed by a Marine Corps Master sergeant.

(b) Constabulary or police:

There are 22 constabulary on Koror, 12 on Babelthaup, Peleliu has 6, Angaur 4, Sonrorol 1, and Tobi 1, making a total 46.

(2) CAU supervision results.

The constabulary at present has reached a satisfactory degree of military efficiency. Constables are familiar with basic

infantry weapons, drills, guard duties, etc. At present the greatest handicap in training is the lack of English speaking constables. Future instructions will be to aid the constabulary in acquiring an immediate working knowledge of English. They are eager to learn and gladly attend school without compensation.

Jails on Anaur and Peleliu have a capacity of ten (10) and twelve (12) prisoners respectively. Each district in Babelthaup has a small jail.

(e) Fire protection:

The Koror fire department is manned by the constabulary. A Chevrolet $1\frac{1}{2}$ ton Oren truck is in good condition, but the pump is detached and has been replaced by a small 60 G.P.M., 9.8 horse-power portable pumper. All buildings on the island larger than the average native shack are equipped with at least one fire extinguisher, usually a 15 pound CO₂.

(a) Maintenance of Law and order:

Law and order are maintained by the Pacific Insular Constabulary, Palau Islands, which is a force of forty-three (43) constables trained by a Marine Corps Master Sergeant.

(b) Constabulary or police:

The Insular Constabulary is the only police force in the Palaus. There are 21 constables on Koror, 6 on Babelthaup, 9 on Peleliu, 5 on Angaur, 1 on Tobi and 1 on Sonsorol, totaling 43.

(2) CAU supervision, results:

In the early part of this quarter the Constabulary fought twelve (12) grass fires of various sizes thus giving them on-the-spot protection training. Other training has been along the line of weapons, drill and English. The Constables take pride in being members of the Constabulary and are looking forward to wearing the regular Pacific

Insular Constabulary Insignia when it is issued. The main duties of the constabulary at present is the standing of watches on docks, warehouses, compounds, brigs, etc., the majority of which are night watches. Each Monday, Wednesday and Friday, the constables on Koror report to the Police Station for two (2) hours of school.

(d) Jails or brigs:

There is a 20' x 56' quonset building on Koror used as a Police and Fire Station. This building is also used for school purposes for the constables. The jail is located in this building and has a capacity of sixteen (16) men and four (4) women, plus two (2) solitary cells. The jails on Angaur and Peleliu have a capacity of ten (10) and twelve (12) prisoners respectively.

(e) Fire Protection:

The Koror Fire Department is manned by the Insular Constabulary. A Chevrolet $1\frac{1}{2}$ ton Oren truck is the main piece of fire-fighting equipment on hand and it's condition is fair. It carries a portable 60 G.P.M., 9.8 horse-power motor which pumps water from the 200 gallon water tank located on the truck bed. All the larger buildings and all dependents homes are equipped with at least one (1) CO₂ or foamite extinguisher.

(a) Maintenance of Law and Order:

Law and order are maintained by the Pacific Insular Constabulary, which is a force of fifty-two (52) constables trained by two Marine Corps Sergeants.

(b) Constabulary or Police:

The Insular Constabulary is the only police force in the Palaus. There are 20 constables on Koror, 6 on Babelthaup, 9 on Peleliu and 5 on Angaur Island. There are 12 on Yap.

Constables main duties consist of standing watches on docks, warehouses, compounds, brigs, firetruck, etc., the majority of which are night watches. School is now held twice weekly, Tuesday and Friday mornings. Progress has especially been

made by the senior Non-Commissioned officers of the Constabulary in handling records, files, Criminal investigations, writing up charges in the rough and instructions in general. Subjects such as Pistol, Carbine, English and others are now lectured upon by the senior NCO's instead of the Marine instructor. The members of the Constabulary are anxiously looking forward to the time when they can wear the approved Khaki uniform of the Central Insular System. They take their stripes and uniforms very seriously and the same is very good for morale and a smooth functioning organization.

A 33' by 80' quonset building on Koror is used as a Police Station, firehouse, jail and schoolhouse. The jail has a capacity of 16 men and 4 women, plus two solitary cells. The jails on Yap, Angaur, and Peleliu have a capacity of fifteen, ten and twelve prisoners respectively.

(e) Fire Protection:

The Koror fire department is manned by the Constabulary. A Chevrolet $1\frac{1}{2}$ ton Oren truck is the main piece of fire fighting equipment. This truck carries a portable 60 G.P.M., 9.8 horse power motor which pumps water from the 200 gallon tank on the truck bed. All Civil Administration and native public buildings are equipped with either a 15 pound CO₂ or 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon foam extinguisher. Yap has a Bean High-Pressure Fog trailer pump.
