The Sydney Evening News says: It is understood that the whole of the officers and crews of one of the finest mail steamers that visits the port of Sydney (the Zealandia) have tendered their resignations to the agents of the vessel. The cause of the complaint is the alleged extremely harsh and over-bearing conduct of the captain. The officers are very popular in Sydney.

The schooner Jennie Walker when off Molokai last Friday, nearly drifted ashore on that island. Her boat was lowered with a crew of men to tow her off, while doing so, a puff of wind struck the schooner, and forging her ahead, ran over the boat, and smashed it. The crew saved themselves by clinging to the head-gear of the schooner.

The bark Caibarien sailed for San Francisco yesterday with a cargo consisting of 6415 pkgs of sugar, 1887 bags rice, 63 pkgs sperm oil, 314 bdls green hides, 61 dry hides, 7 rolls leather, 74 bxs soap, 4 rolls duck, 55 empty barrels, 8 bxs personal effects, 1 bx scientific instruments, and 1 case gin: Domestic value, \$64,237 57; foreign value, \$916 85; value cargo transhipped, \$9,254 40.

At Hakalau, Hawaii, on Wednesday, the 8th inst., a whale-boat, in coming out to the assistance of the schooner Malolo's boat, which was towing a loaded scow, got capsized in the breakers, and a man named Joseph Potter drowned. His body was found a short time afterwards, under the boat, entangled in some cordage. He was buried the same evening. The deceased had been in the employ of the Hakalau Plantation for more than two years. He was from California last, but was probably a native of one of the Western States. He had served in the Cavalry of the U. S. Army during the late war. Mr. Lehman, the manager, took charge of his effects.







Fighting the Reciprocity Treaty.

New York, February 18th.-The Graphic has the following from Washington on the Hawaiian sugar question: A determined onslaught is being made on the Hawaiian Treaty. The Louisiana sugar planters have interested their representatives to a man, Democrats and Republicans, in behalf of the movement to terminate the treaty. The Democratic members are found arguing with the Foreign Affairs Committee against free sugar, and are as urgent for a tarriff as ever Judge Kelley was known to be in the height of a company. It is alleged that the Havemeyers are opposed to the treaty, because they naturally desire the removal of competition in the business of sugar refining. It is said, indeed, that they are at the bottom of the agitation in the East. The parties who are opposed to a continuance of the treaty are having a series of hearings before the Committee on Foreign Affairs, A vast array of statistics have been presented to show that the Government is losing large amounts of money in the customs every year; that more sugar is being imported from the Hawaiian Islands under the treaty than the Islands could possibly produce, and that no substantial benefit is being done to American industry. It is alleged that fully threequarters of the sugar imported free from Hawaii comes from China, and its importation free is a fraud.




