We who were the comrades of your brother Henry want to express our sympathy for you as you mourn his death. May the Father above send you comfort in your grief.

Pfc. Henry T. Furushiro, 39082233, Company "B" of the 100th Battalion, was killed in action in Northern Italy on April 14, 1945. He was hit by enemy machine gun fire during a German attack and died instantly; I learned this from friends who were nearby at the time. He was given a proper burial and now rests in an American Cemetery in Northern Italy.

We remember the loved ones of our honored dead each time we offer prayer at our battalion services. God bless you and all Henry's near and dear ones.
