Wheels Have Gone Up.

COLUMBIAS IN A FIRE. Destruction of Wheels in the Pope Building. BOSTON, March 13.—The Pope Manufacturing Company's building was completely gutted by fire shortly before 4 o'clock today.

The block was a five-story structure of brick, profusely ornamented with terra cotta trimmings. The contents, which were ruined, consisted of 1700 new bicycles, 175 second hand wheels and about 20,000 pieces of bicycle fittings, besides several thousand tires.

The Pope Company has a total loss on its stock and fixtures conservatively estimated at \$150,000 and \$200,000, on the building. The loss is covered by insurance.

TAXES AND LICENSE.

DEBATES IN THE SENATE ON NEW ACT ITEMS.

Poll Tax Cannot be Worked Out—Life Insurance—Chinese Barbers—House.

FORTIETH DAY.

Senator Waterhouse read the following petition: "We, the members of the Christian Endeavor Society of Central Union church, hearing that the question of the policy to be pursued by this Government toward the liquor dealers of this country is about to be presented to the Legislature, wish to put ourselves on record as totally and forever opposed to the license of the sale of intoxicating liquors in this or in any land. And we respectfully urge upon our law makers such enactments as shall tend toward the restriction and ultimate extinction of the saloon power, one of the greatest social evils of our time. MARIA B. FORBES, Secretary."

Mr. McCandless supported the amendment. It would assist the assessor in his work.

Sections 17, interest of each person assessed; 18, tax to be in and on property assessed; 19, fire and marine insurance tax, \$1 for every \$100 in premium. Mr. Waterhouse asked why life insurance was not touched. Mr. Damon replied that the question was up some years ago. It was then decided that life insurance companies did not do business here. Premiums were sent away and the business was done where the insurance companies lived.

Mr. McCandless supported Mr. Waterhouse. Massachusetts assessed insurance companies 4 per cent and Washington 2 per cent. Agents in this country should certainly pay 4 per cent. He would move to insert life insurance agents in the poll tax item.

Mr. Brown said all business of life insurance companies, except picking up the policies, was done in the States and subject only to the laws of the States in which they were located.

Mr. Baldwin opposed inserting the life insurance item. It might drive agents from the country. This class of insurance was a good thing and should be made conventional to the people.

Mr. McCandless said all life companies represented here, except one, were American concerns. It was against the set policy of the Government to add one dollar duty on American interests than was explicitly laid down in existing systems.

Senator McCandless' motion was lost.

Section 20, insurance agents' return, passed.

Section 27, taxes on mortgaged property, was referred to the Minister of Finance.

Section 30, exempting diplomatic agents and their attaches from all taxes, and the following from personal taxation: Clergymen at work and volunteer soldiers, passed. 31, same, also went through. Referred to 11:30.

House, Rep. Richardson reported that the Registration Act and the bill to reorganize the Judiciary had been referred to the President.

Rep. Robertson presented a petition from resident physicians and dentists against license.

Mr. Robertson presented a petition from the Chinese barbers same as offered in the Senate.

Bill restricting Chinese immigration passed second reading to be reported on Friday.

House adjourned.

The way seems open for Albert Willis, if his boom is properly managed.
