In the estate of H. A. P. Carter the Court approved the accounts as passed on by the trustees and allowed Henry Smith a master's fee of \$50.

In the Police Court this forenoon, Asachi, a Japanese, arrested last week on the charge of selling liquor without a license, pleaded guilty and was fined \$200 and costs.

The estate of J. W. Winter was declared insolvent on motion of the administrator and the sum of \$18, the total assets, awarded to the administrator. The liabilities were over \$5000.

The big American ship S. D. Carlton, fourteen days from Tacoma, arrived this morning with 3,923 tons of coal for the O. R. & L. Co. Yesterday morning she was off Kahului and reports a haze almost obscuring the land.

Dr. Hayes, who was private secretary for Congressman Pitt, both when he was chairman of the Committee on Foreign Relations and when he was a member of the Commission that drafted the Hawaiian Territorial bill, arrived from Hilo in the Akana Saturday afternoon.

The Kahului Railroad company have added two magnificent first class passenger coaches to their system on Maui, and the traveling public who appreciate up to date facilities can now be accommodated. A small additional charge between stations will be made which will tend to keep the cars exclusive. The company under the management of R. W. Miller are gradually extending the system.

POST OFFICE BOXES FAST BEING PUT UP

Louis T. Kenake of the post office said this morning that the boxes at the street corners and other places would all be in position by the end of the week. The men at work putting up the posts have finished this part of the work and are now hanging the boxes. Operations are being rushed along so that the people of the city may have the benefit of an up-to-date system in as short a time as possible.

The carriers are doing their work very well. Of course, there is a good deal of trouble in the matter of sorting the mail for distribution to the various parts of the city but this will be overcome after the men have been at their work for a fortnight or so.

Mr. Kenake says that the post office men are very anxious that the people who have ordered their mail delivered at their homes should inform all their correspondents of their street and number.

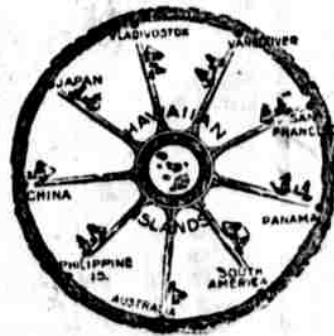

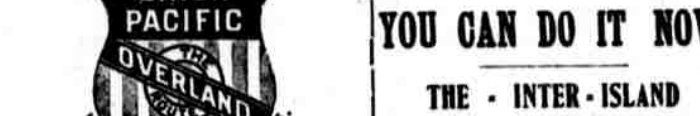
