## SHUN KISSING.

While we have viewed the Board of Health's anti-kissing circular with some misgivings we are glad to see that hopeless idiots are not confined to the local Board. In Wichita, Kansas, a club has been formed called the Mount Hope Married Men's Anti-Kissing League.

The report doesn't say whether the dissenters from the old rules had wives who had been eating onions or sweethearts who filled their teeth with chewing gum. For the delectation of Dr. Pratt, the healthy health healer of the Board, we give the following extract from the declaration of the League with the many names:

"Believing that true love can never run smooth when a man continually kisses the woman of his affection, we have, after due deliberation, arrived at the following agreement:

"That henceforth we will not kiss our own wives or any other woman, but that we will still hold the same deep affection for our wives and retain our admiration for the feminine beautiful. We do not believe that kissing is right, and therefore we agree not to practice it. Any member of this organization who is found guilty of disobeying the order will be dismissed at once."

Then the trouble began.

We have believed this for a long time, but some of the members did not like to form an organization to carry it out. But some of us who believed thus were continually violating the principles of our belief, and we agreed that the best way to keep from falling by the wayside was to form a club and then one member could support another.

"I will use all my influence to get other young men, and old men, too, for that matter, to join us, for I think our principles are right. I am now fifty-one years old, and I

have never kissed my wife or any other woman more than a dozen times in all my life.

"I will tell you why. I think it a dirty and filthy habit—one that is apt to spread diseases and against the true principles of love. One does not need to kiss to show their affection. The grasp of a hand is sufficient to do that, and as for loving, I think one's action speak for that and not by the number of times you kiss your wife. I have not kissed my wife for five years, and I do not intend to, but I love her just as strongly as I ever did."

Mr. Wilson may be right and we have no doubt that his theories in regard to non-kissing of wives will be adopted after fifty one years of experience. It ought to be stopped by authority and Pratt, but president Wilson—he is not a local Wilson, and don't you forget it, says nothing about kissing the other fellow's wife or of the typewriter. Soper, vice president; David Dayton, secretary; George R. Carter, treasurer; H. M. von Holt and H. Waterhouse, trustees. The number of burials during the year was seventy-two, and the total receipts from all sources was \$2,741. **How to be Beautiful.**

Here are a few rules given by the celebrated French dermatologist, M. Felix Chaleux, for a clear, beautiful complexion and perfect health:

- 1. Don't drink tea or coffee.
- 2. Drink pure water.
- 3. Eat grapes, apples, raisins and figs.
- 4. Eat a few salted almonds daily.
- 5. Don't eat animal food.
- 6. An egg or two a day, soft boiled, instead of meat.
- 7. Eat an orange every day or so.
- 8. Walk two or three miles a day.
- 9. Bathe the whole body daily in tepid water.
- 10. Don't fret, don't worry; be calm and quiet.
- 11. Follow the above and you will be perfectly strong, healthy, beautiful and live to great age.

**Beards in Russia.**

It is curious to note that in Russia the beard has always been an object of repute. An ordinance which Yaroslav, son of Vladimir and legislator of Novgorod, then the capital of Russia, published in 1015, exemplifies this. By this law any one plucking a hair from a neighbor's beard was subjected to a punishment four times more severe than that inflicted for cutting off his finger.

**Lawmakers and Their Pay.**

The most expensive Parliament in Europe is that of France, which costs \$1,500,000 a year. The French people are very well represented. There are 309 Senators and 584 Deputies, a total in excess of 800. Each receives a salary of \$1800 a year.

In the United States the ninety Senators and 360 Congressmen are paid \$2,500,000 in salaries.

The members of the British Parliament serve without salary. The incidental expenses of this body last year were but \$260,000. The German Reichstag, with its two branches, costs the voters on an average \$100,000 a year.

Russia has no Parliament in the American or French sense, so that this item is entirely saved. The

legislators in the Italian Parliament receive no salaries, but have free transportation on railroads. The cost of the Italian Parliament last year, nevertheless, was \$420,000.

The salaries of lawmakers in many parts of Europe seem trifling, according to American standards. In London, for instance, there are 150 members in the upper and 250 in the lower branch. The former get no pay at all and the latter but \$300 a year. And if any session lasts longer than four months they are paid at the rate of \$260 a day additional. The Parliament of Holland comprises 150 members in two houses. Members of the Upper House receive \$4 a day and of the second body \$800 a year and mileage. The Parliament of Holland costs \$300,000 a year.

The most scantily paid of any of the regularly salaried lawmakers are those of Austria. There are two legislative bodies for Austria, one meeting in Vienna and one in Budapest. The total cost is \$800,000 a year. An Austrian law provides that the members receive 10 florin, or \$2 a day.

**Your Teeth.**

Without good teeth there cannot be good mastication.

Without thorough mastication there cannot be perfect digestion, and poor health results.

Hence the paramount importance of sound teeth.

Clean teeth do not decay.

The importance of a sound first set of teeth is as great to the child as a sound second set is to the adult.

Children should be taught to use the toothbrush early.

Food left on the teeth ferments, and the acid formed produces decay.

Decay leads in time to pain and the total destruction of the tooth.

The substance of the following rules should therefore be impressed constantly upon all children:

1. The teeth should be cleansed at least once daily.
2. The best time to clean the teeth is after the last meal.
3. A small toothbrush with stiff bristles should be used, brushing up and down and across and inside and outside and in between the teeth.
4. A simple tooth powder or a little soap and some precipitated chalk taken up on the brush may be used if the teeth are dirty or stained.
5. It is a good practice to rinse the mouth out after every meal.
6. All rough usage of the teeth, such as cracking nuts, biting thread, etc., should be avoided, but the proper use of the teeth in chewing is good for them.

When decay occurs, it should be attended to long before any pain results. It is stopping of a small cavity that is of the greatest service.—Motherhood.
