During the month of February the debt was decreased \$12,000,000, making a total decrease since Grant's term began of \$299,228,310.

The English Law Courts have rendered a new reading of Woman's Rights and Woman's Duties. In a divorce case, Milne vs. Milne, a decree against the wife was granted, and for the first time, we believe, the divorced wife was ordered to pay the injured husband yearly the sum of £500 for the education and support of the children of the marriage. This says a contemporary, shows that while women are continually claiming "rights" which they never were wrongfully held from them, there are also responsibilities which the dissolution of the marriage tie will not free them. Though the children are just as much the mother's as the father's, it is the latter who has been forced to support them, however rich the woman might be. Men have acquiesced in this, but suppose that they should be-leave themselves to theoretical grumbling?
