AMENDMENTS TO GENERAL ORDERS

1. AMENDMENTS TO GENERAL ORDERS NO. 10, OFFICE OF THE MILITARY GOVERNOR, 10 MARCH 1943.

1.01. General Orders No. 10, Office of the Military Governor, 10 March 1943, as amended, hereby is amended to read as follows:

\*1. POLICY.

\*1.01. The following policies are announced for the information and guidance of the following employers and their employees in the Labor Shortage Area, City and County of Honolulu, Territory of Hawaii; (a) agencies of the United States under the War Department or the Navy Department; (b) employers engaged on construction or other projects under the War Department or the Navy Department; (c) employers engaged in stevedoring and other work on docks and dock facilities; and (d) public utilities.

"2. EMPLOYMENT STABILIZATION PROGRAM.

"2.01. The Employment Stabilization Program for the Labor Shortage Area, City and County of Honolulu, Territory of Hawaii, is hereby designated as the governing set of rules and regulations applicable to all employers and employees described in Paragraph 1.01.

"3. REGISTRATION AND EMPLOYMENT.

"3.01. Every employer described in Paragraph 1.01 shall notify the nearest office of the United States Employment Service, on such forms as may be prescribed by the United States Employment Service, of any employee added to or dropped from such employer's pay roll, within two (2) days thereafter. Any person, now or hereafter employed by any of the employers to whom reference is made in Paragraph 1.01 and who ceases to be so employed, shall, within two (2) days after ceasing to be so employed, register or re-register with the nearest office of the United States Employment Service. Any person now or hereafter employed by any employer described in Paragraph 1.01 hereof shall report regularly to the job to which he is assigned and shall observe the conditions of the Employment Stabilization Program."

2. AMENDMENTS TO GENERAL ORDERS NO. 14, OFFICE OF THE MILITARY GOVERNOR, 10 MARCH 1943.

2.01. Paragraph numbered 3.04, Title 3, General Orders No. 14, Office of the Military Governor, 10 March 1943, hereby is amended to read as follows:

"3.04. Labor Section. Under the direction of the Labor Director, this section shall administer all matters pertaining to labor, Office of Internal Security."
