PUNCTUALITY.—I owe everything in the world to being always a quarter of an hour beforehand.—Lord Nelson.

What a lot of sorrow and misery would have been saved if Lord Nelson's practice had been carried out in Honolulu; had the disease breeding place known as Kapukolo and the Nuuanu stream both been looked after by the authorities some months ago, we might have spared the present visitation. We have always boasted of our climatic conditions, depending on the winds to sweep disease into the sea. Up to a few weeks ago, the Trades did their work nobly, but we now find that it requires more than a breeze to disinfect a tainted atmosphere. Every man, woman and child who has crossed the King street bridge at low tide will recall a very unpleasant odor; an odor that seemed to impregnate every thing in the vicinity. None would admit that such a condition was beneficial to the health of the community, but nothing was done. We depended on the winds and a water-flow from the mountains to accomplish what man neglected and we let it go at that. It is now proposed to do something in regard to the Nuuanu stream. One man wanted to disinfect it, another thought if it was walled in, danger would be reduced to a minimum. The latest scheme is to divert the course in the direction of Twi-lee. An engineer says the latter idea is not a good one for the reason that the water could be made to run over the course proposed on account of the bed of the stream being very low. Another objection has been made by some bright mind. Mr. Bright Mind states that the fresh water from the stream flows out into the ocean. This is not news, but the same man goes farther and claims that the said fresh water prevents the formation of coral at the entrance to the harbor. He does not state how the fresh water drops to the bottom and then flows out. Perhaps he has it all figured out in his own brilliant mind and we must be satisfied if he does not take us into his confidence.

BY AUTHORITY

OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH, HONOLULU, September 21, 1895. The following is the law relating to Regulations of the Board of Health and penalty for their violation:

Civil Code Section 254. "Notice shall be given by the Board of Health of all regulations made by it, by publishing the same in some newspaper of the district, or where there is no such newspaper, by causing them to be posted in three public places of the town or district; and such notices of such regulations shall be deemed legal notice to all persons.

Section 255. "Every person who shall violate any regulation of the Board of Health, after the same shall have been published, as provided in the last section, shall be fined not exceeding one hundred dollars."

Notice to Shippers of Freight.

OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH, HONOLULU, September 19, 1895. Until further notice, excepting upon special permit, no freight will be allowed to be shipped from Honolulu, to other parts of these islands, from any other wharf than the Pacific Mail wharf.

Freight shipped from the Pacific Mail wharf will be only merchandise from foreign ports which has been held in strict quarantine.

Regulations of the Board of Health

INFECTED DISTRICTS. The following portions of the Districts of Kona, Oahu, are declared infected districts:

First. All of the territory lying east of King street to the sea, and east of Kalia street to the harbor, excepting the Kamehameha Girls' School premises.

Second. All of the territory lying: 1. East of the line of the road running mauka from King street on the Waikiki side of the Kamehameha School premises.

2. Mauka of King street, and 3. West of Liliha street, and 4. Mauka of the line of extension of School street.

Third. All of the territory lying: 1. East of Liliha street.

2. Mauka of King street, from Liliha street to the King street bridge, and 3. West of the Nuuanu stream, from King street to Beretania street.

4. Mauka of Beretania street, from Smith's bridge to Nuuanu street.

5. West of Nuuanu street from Beretania street to Kuku street.

6. Mauka of the line of the extension of Kuku street, from Nuuanu street to the Nuuanu stream.

7. West of the Nuuanu stream, from the point of conjunction with the extension of Kuku street to School street.

8. Mauka of School street, from the Nuuanu stream to Liliha street, excepting the St. Louis College premises.

Fourth. All that territory lying between Beretania street and the sea, and from Nuuanu street west to the Nuuanu stream.

Fifth. All that territory lying: 1. Mauka of School street, from Fort street to Punchbowl's reef.

2. East of the line of the extension of Fort street.

3. West of Punchbowl street, from School street to Sylvia's nursery.

4. Mauka of a line drawn in extension of the line of Sylvia's nursery, from the point of intersection of the extension of Fort street.
