A MISSION PAPER.—HONOLULU, ETC. "Here goes a line to you at last, just to say that as in duty bound, and with much pleasure, I called on Bishop Willis and his wife, more than a month ago at Honolulu. I stayed to lunch, and then was driven to see the new Cathedral, a nice stone building, at present about 120 feet long, and say, 60 feet wide; but which has cost the enormous sum already of Rs. 150,000.

The natives just now are making a bit of an effort against this; but the Yankees have a pretty firm seat. It looks odd to see white men mending the roads and doing what little desultory manual labor goes on, whilst the natives, a most sensual, nasty-looking lot of blacks, loiter about their shanties and do nothing.

To improve things, then, the Yankees have succeeded in passing a law to exclude Chinese, with what result remains to be seen."

LOCAL AND GENERAL.

A mutton famine is reported on Oahu. Justice Dole is presiding at the Supreme Court chambers this week.

The Band will play at the departure of the S. S. Australia to-day at noon. See winning list of Wichman Watch Club numbers in another column.

Mr. H. S. Tregloan has been confined to his house for several days by illness. A number of tourists who have been going the Islands return to the States to-day.

The Australia takes nearly a hundred cabin passengers to San Francisco this trip. The Wailuku Sugar Mill has finished grinding; the year's crop was about 2,200 tons.

At 5 a. m. this morning there was a conjunction of Venus and Jupiter in the eastern sky. The old landmark, the tree on the corner of Fort and Merchant streets has been cut down.

The base ball season will open in Honolulu next Saturday. Honolulu vs. Kamehameha. The Hawaiian Hardware Company leave hardy a day go by but that they sell an Aerometer.

E. B. Friel will act under power of attorney for Hon. W. H. Cornwell during the latter's absence from the Kingdom. There will be a meeting of the Maile Social Club at their hall this evening at 7 o'clock, and after the meeting there will be a dance.

The S. S. Australia brought the remaining lot of rails for the completion of the railway on the peninsula branch of the Oahu railway. It is reported that Mr. E. Hoffman, of Wailuku, Maui, will be commissioned to-day as customs officer at Kahului, Maui.

He shipped the four men referred to simply because he was short-handed.

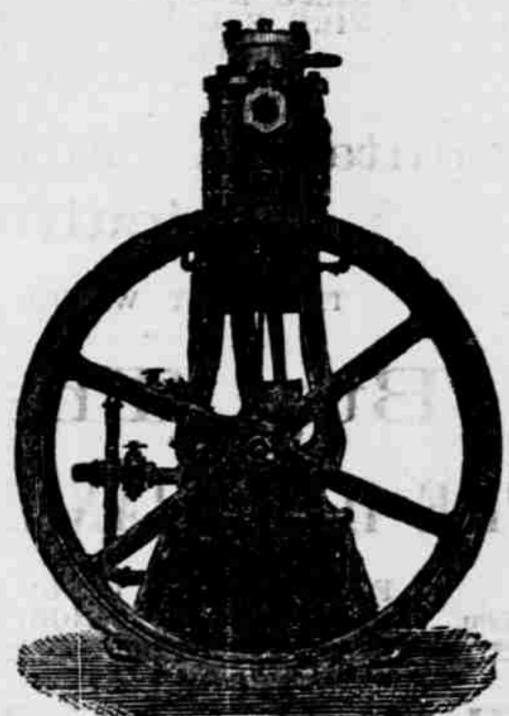
