Important Report from the Hawaiian Commissioner at New Orleans.

The following extracts from a dispatch received by the Minister of Foreign Affairs, from Hon. Dr. J. Mott Smith, Special Commissioner for this Kingdom at the New Orleans Exposition,

"The Government of the United States has placed a chemist at this Exposition, mainly for the purpose of aiding planters in their manipulation of sugar. He (Dr. C. A. Crampton) kindly offered to analyze for me our specimens of Hawaiian sugars.

"I enclose also a list of the sugar canes which have been domesticated on the island of Jamaica. Professor Morris, who has charge of the Government Botanical Garden on that island,

DISCOURAGING TO PLANTERS. "I find in talking with the planters here, a discouragement and an unwillingness to branch out in improved methods,
