NOTES AND COMMENTS.

During the early part of July the American Historical Association held a three days' convention in the city of Chicago.

EXTRA SESSIONS OF CONGRESS.

Today at noon the American congress convenes in the capitol at Washington, in extraordinary session, having been summoned by the proclamation of President Cleveland.

The Constitution gives the President power in section 3 of article II to convene both houses of congress or either of them on extraordinary occasions, but the power is one which has been exercised comparatively seldom.

The first President to convene an extra session of congress was John Adams, who called a session of congress in 1777 to consider the subject of relations with France.

Congress was next convened in extra session in 1861 to consider ways and means for prosecuting the civil war. It was not found necessary to convene an extra session from that time until 1877, when President Hayes called congress together to pass an appropriation for the army.

SHALL WE SEGREGATE?

Dr. Mouritz Gives Reasons for Enforcing the Law.

Mr. Editor:—I notice my name brought forward in the editor's column in your last issue, in connection with a report to the board of health in 1886.

Leprosy was endemic here in 1836 and is more so today. The report of the leprosy commission in India with Dr. Beavan Neave Rake, a previously avowed anti-contagionist, at its head, does not alter my opinion of the disease in Hawaii.

Leprosy is a direct menace to the health of every native Hawaiian; in a lesser degree no national domiciled here is safe from its ravages.

Those who live amongst lepers soon become impressed with the terrible nature of the disease, and the inability of man's efforts to check it when once established in the system.
