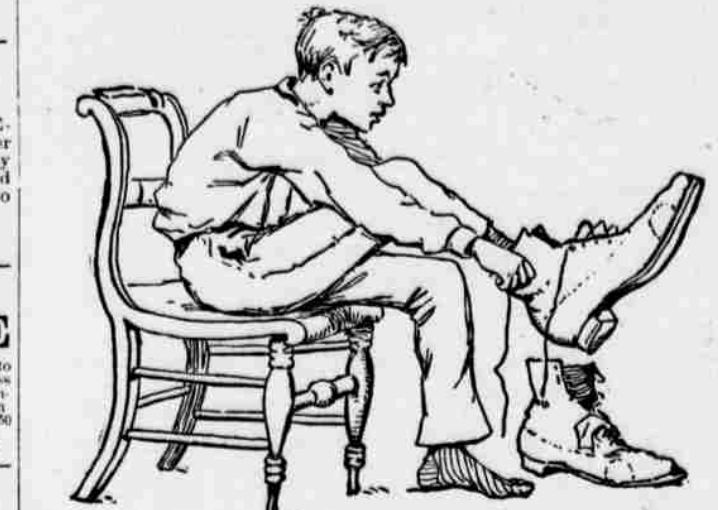

NEWS IN A NUTSHELL.

Miss Cahill announces "proper things" in millinery. The Alameda carried hence 3087 letters and 933 papers. Highest cash price paid for Hawaiian stamps. C. V. STURDEVANT. Henry Luning, keeper of the St. Louis House, died of dropsy Thursday. Two Japanese paid \$10 each in the Circuit Court today for gambling. E. A. Jones was elected treasurer of the Y. M. C. A. last evening. Five of the Hassinger tract lots were sold by the Safe Deposit Company today. The Hawaiian Safe Deposit Company now offers house lots from the Hassinger tract. Sacks potatoes and boxes of apples will be sold at Morgan's at 10 in the morning. The opening of a restaurant at the Sailors' Home on next Thursday is announced. Ah Koi, a Chinese merchant at Lahaina, has been adjudged a bankrupt. The Evangelical Association will visit Kamehameha school this afternoon. FOR MANSLAUGHTER.

ALBERT HERMANSEN DEFENDANT IN A SERIOUS CASE. Maia, an Aged Native, is the Dead Man—Father-in-Law of the Prisoner—An Inquest Held. Albert Hermansen had a difficulty with an old native named Maia Thursday evening as the result of which the latter died in a few minutes, Maia, who was Hermansen's father-in-law, was about 75 years of age and lived in a cottage in the same yard. The place is back from Queen street near South and opens on an alley-way leading seaward. Hermansen and wife occupy the main house, and the old man's cottage is about thirty feet in the rear. Early last evening Hermansen quarreled with his wife, and Maia interceded for peace. The old man was then assaulted by the son-in-law and struck several times on the head. Getting away, however, he trudged off toward the gate. Hermansen evidently thought he was going for a policeman, and ran after him. He reached Maia a few feet from the gate and shook him violently several times. When released the old fellow tumbled down on the gravel walk and in a few minutes was dead. Hermansen was arrested. The body of Maia was taken to the station house by Captain Scott. A post mortem examination was held today by Dr. C. B. Cooper as well as an inquest on the death of the man. The result was that Hermansen is held to answer the charge of manslaughter. Of the several witnesses examined all gave very damaging testimony against Hermansen except the prisoner's wife who endeavored in every way to shield her husband. Hermansen was at one time fireman on the W. G. Hall. He was later watchman at the Inter-Island dock, and finally watchman at the Pilot office. He was discharged from the latter position for reporting a vessel when such was not in sight.

TO GET A NEW COASTER.

CRACK BOAT TO BE ORDERED FOR THE INTER-ISLAND. Will Be About 800 Tons—Larger Than the Hall—Same Builders—Replacing the Pele. Captain W. B. Godfrey, President of the I. S. N. Company, G. N. Wilcox and A. S. Wilcox, directors of the same concern, left for the Coast by the Alameda Thursday. One principal object of their visit is to further equip their fleet with commodious and suitable boats. They will go first to San Francisco and then to Port Blakely. The first thing they will do will be to purchase a small steamer to go on the Kauai route in place of the Pele, wrecked two weeks ago. One about the size of the Hawaii will be selected. It will be dispatched to the Islands as soon as possible and should arrive about the middle of May. The vessel will cost in the neighborhood of \$25,000. The second object of the visit to the Coast is to place a contract for a new steamer. Specifications were taken along by Captain Godfrey. The new boat will be about 800 tons, a great deal larger than the W. G. Hall which is only 380 tons. She will be fitted with all the latest improvements, such as electric lights, bells, etc., and will be put up to meet the requirements of the island trade. The new steamer will be built by Hall Bros. at Port Blakely. She will be turned over in time to reach the Islands by Christmas. Next year she will go on the Hall's route to Kauai. It is at present intended to transfer the Hall to the Kauai route, though this plan may be changed. In the new boat a special regard will be paid to the running qualities of her engines, it being desired to give her a fast schedule. Appropriation to Be Made. At the "High Jinks" some committee man of Company D lost the Sharpshooters' floor sprinkler. At the next meeting of the ex-battery company a resolution for an appropriation of thirty cents for a new sprinkler will go in.

THE NAME OF A VESSEL.

MAN WHO BOSSES THE GOLDEN SHORE NOW IN HONOLULU. Playing With the Title—How It Was Selected—Not Orthodox—A Schooner Captain. "Golden Shore" is the name of a stout schooner now in port. She is an American vessel and is owned in San Francisco. She is six years old. About once per year she comes around to Honolulu, from the Sound, from Frisco or from Newcastle. Captain Henderson is master of the schooner. He is a jolly, good fellow and can take a crack about as well as he can crack one. But Captain Henderson wants to change the name of his vessel. Too many peculiar conjectures grow out of the attractive gold letters on her side. The Captain is not an orthodox Christian and the terms he has to use at times in answer to questions are simply appalling. For instance, the lounge says: "Hey, Henderson, when are you going?" The Captain must reply, "I am going to the Golden Shore." The copper along the docks accosts him late at night and bluntly asks: "What's yer business?" Then the Captain must take all the consequences of the reply, "sir, I am master of the Golden Shore." Natives and denizens of this island readily acquiesce in Henderson's statement, that "The Golden Shore is just off Honolulu"; but the hardest conscience melts into either when Captain Henderson innocently proposes, "Come to the Golden Shore and have a drink with me." Really, however, the vessel in port is not named after the final part of all good sea captains. The man who named her is by no means a follower of General Booth. "Golden Shore" refers to the West coast of America and more particularly to California. In looking over the long list of American vessels for a name "Golden Gate," "Golden West," "Golden Rule," "Golden State" and in fact all of the "goldens" except "Golden Shore" were found. The Likelike will leave at 2 p. m. for ports on Hawaii. The Aloha moved alongside the Inter-Island wharf this morning. The W. G. Hall arrived this afternoon from Hawaii and Maui. The Likelike discharged a part of her sugar into the T. F. Oakes today. Bill Williams' schooner Sarah and Eliza came up from Pearl Harbor this morning. The Ke Au Hou arrived from Kauai this morning. She will return to Kauai, today, leaving at 5 p. m. H. T. Walker went out as engineer of the Mikahala Thursday in place of Chief Engineer Leech who is ill. The S. S. Alameda did not get away until after 5 o'clock Thursday owing to the large amount of fruit, etc., shipped by her. The flag ship will be thrown open to the public from 1 to 5 p. m. Saturday. The ship's boats will take visitors to and from the vessel. The James Makee arrived this morning with 2584 bags of sugar for the bark H. F. Glade. The Makee will sail again at 4 p. m. for Kapaa. The Kaala will arrive during the afternoon with 2025 bags of Kahuku sugar for the T. F. Oakes. The little steamer will not return to the West Side till Monday. PASSENGERS. ARRIVED. 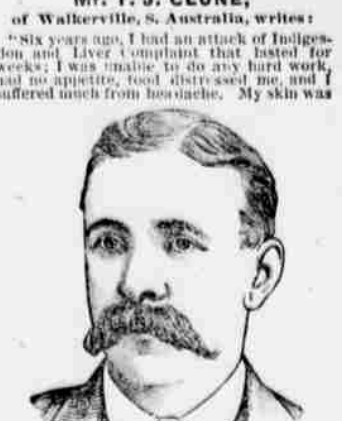
