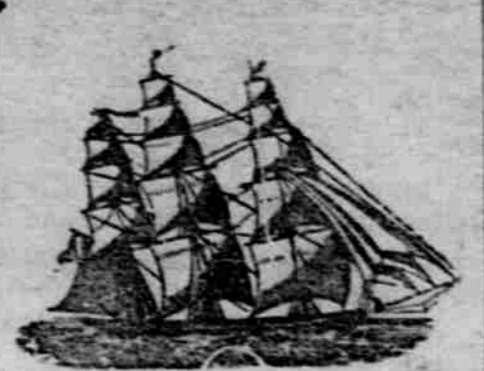

## MISREPRESENTATIONS.

The Advertiser has taken occasion to insinuate that Messrs. Widemann, Parker and Cummins were under everlasting obligations to Mr. Frank Hastings, and that the commissioners should place themselves on record as favoring an increase in the salary of Mr. Thurston's "major." It is insinuated by editor Armstrong that Mr. Hastings entertained the commissioners at the Metropolitan Club of Washington, and the Advertiser scribbler seems to believe that the commissioners are under considerable obligations to Franky and that they ought to assist in advocating public support for this boot-black of L. A. Thurston.

We hate to go into personalities. We dislike to show up the qualities of the man in question. The time has come though when we consider it proper to remind the editor of the Advertiser of a few facts connected with the "great" diplomat Mr. Hastings, the valuable substitute of Mr. Thurston.

When Samuel Parker became minister of foreign affairs, he appointed Frank Hastings as his secretary. He did so in the face of a determined opposition of his political party, but he did so. Mr. Hastings has been a welcome guest at the houses of Parker, Widemann and Cummins. He has always found as invitation to the entertainments of the gentlemen mentioned and none of them has asked for a return of hospitality.

The Advertiser now desires to throw glory around the head of Mr. Hastings by stating that he entertained the commissioners at the Metropolitan Club. Is there who believes that Widemann, Parker and Cummins ever accepted an invitation from a thing like Frank Hastings and did not furnish value received to their would-be host? The Advertiser is in bad form. The insinuations against the commissioners come with bad grace from Mr. Armstrong. Mr. Hastings is under everlasting obligations to the gentlemen who composed the commission and he will not thank anybody who makes him out a host or an entertainer of commissioners. We repeat that we hate to be personal. But we must state that while Mr. Hastings was a willing guest at a dinner given by Parker and Widemann he did not draw on the Hawaii treasury for the purpose of reciprocating. The three royalist commissioners, as a rule, are not "sponging." Mr. Armstrong may know that for a fact.

## YOU BET!

The Kaimiloa will probably be purchased by the government and used as a quarantine vessel. If the bargain is refused the reasons must be more than mysterious. The I. I. S. N. Co., owns the vessel. The people investigating it are composed of John Ena, vice president I. I. S. N. Co.; A. Keech, superintending engineer I. I. S. N. Co.; F. Johnson, head carpenter I. I. S. N. Co.; Dr. Day, (presumably) physician to the I. I. S. N. Co.; and J. T. Waterhouse Jr. (a disinterested party). The above mentioned gentlemen recommended that the government purchase the Kaimiloa and pay for the said vessel \$14,000.

The president of the board of health Mr. W. O. Smith, fully approves of the report but claims that a special appropriation is needed which he will call for and recommend. W. O. Smith represents the biggest stockholders in the I. I. S. N. Co.

Does anybody refuse to be a stockholder in the I. I. S. N. Co? Not much! You bet!!

## HOW IT IS DONE.

The government seems to be in a hurry in regard to the registration of voters. All possible means are now adopted and if W. O. Smith has his own way, martial law will be declared and everyone who refuses to obey the mandate of the republic will be shot down.

A correspondent from Maui informs us that Judge Hel-kunibi, one of Judd's pets, refuses to issue a warrant or a summons, even in a civil suit except the plaintiff takes an oath to the republic.

It is hardly possible to believe the truth of such an assertion, but we are ready to believe any accusations against Judd and Smith because we have had cause enough to know the unparalleled unscrupulousness of the two men. There is not a more distinctly brace of unpopular men in Hawaii to-day. The two gentlemen are playing with fire and they will find some day that their fingers, will be seriously burned.

The bulldozing by their tools went so far, that John Kalua dared tell his accidental clients that he could not take a case until the to be client had taken the oath! As a reward he was made Circuit Judge of Maui. Does Mr. W. O. Smith remember the reflections and statements made by him in the presence of the editor of this paper in regard to Kalua? Shall we publish the expressions indulged in by Judd, Smith and Castle in describing the Circuit Judge of Maui? Shades of Justice! They are running a high game and their reward will be there. Unrelenting and unmerciful.

## A HITCH.

There seems to be a hitch somewhere. Every paper in town advertised the official call of Mr. Dole on-board the Charleston which was supposed to have taken place yesterday. Mr. Dole was seen around town in his Sunday-go-to-meeting clothes and he may have gone on-board. No salute was fired though. Query: Did Dole go on-board? Was he saluted? Did he not go on-board? And if so, why not? Did he go on-board and was not saluted? We want to know.

## Our Smartey!

Joseph S. Niles, an advertising agent of 429 Montgomery street, was arrested yesterday afternoon on the charge of obtaining money under false pretenses. Niles claims that there has been a mistake. It came to the knowledge of Secretary Roberts of the Press Club yesterday that some person was collecting money from various sources as contributions to defray the expenses of the Press Club's outing next Saturday. Mr. Roberts found that the Selby Smelting Company. Major Hooper of the Occidental Hotel and ex-Consul Wilder of Hawaii had all paid money to the person in question, who had given the name of Joseph Niles, an advertising solicitor. After Niles had been placed under arrest Major Hooper went to the Old City Hall, but could not identify him as the man who had collected the money at the Occidental. Neither the Treasurer of the Selby Smelting Company nor ex-Consul Wilder has seen Niles since his arrest.

## Hawaiian Hardware Comp'y.

August 30, 1894.

The thousands and thousands of people who read the daily papers and get the news happenings from the four quarters of earth, do so with little thought of the expense attached to getting out paper and the trials and tribulations of the editor and frequent loss of money to the owners. The difficulties which he sets the paths of newspaper people vary according to locality; in the Northern States, where there are "nine months winter and three months very late fall," it frequently happens that the roads are blocked with snow, just about the time the paper supply is exhausted, so the editor has to fall back on his polished-surface book paper to get out his edition. In Vicksburg, Mississippi, away back in the sixties an entire stock of wall paper was used in getting out a weekly paper, newspaper was not obtainable.

In some places the people will demand a maximum of news, telegraphic and local at a minimum price, and then want to pay their subscription and advertising bills in wood or vegetables. But when Saturday night comes around the gentle and ungentle compositor rebels, when he is offered anything, but coin in payment for his services, and this accounts for the fact that half the editors in United States are troubled with insomnia. We have known compositors in country towns to actually refuse to live on a diet of roller composition and strike if the editor would not divide the contents of the paste pot.

In Honolulu, things are different; paper is manufactured in California, and the ocean never freezes so hard that the vessel can't run, so there is no delay there in getting a stock of paper; the "typos" usually meet the business Managers on Saturday with a broad smile which they give in exchange for good gold coin, and the editors who do not wear search lights in their shirt fronts leave them off, because they do not wish to be mistaken by tourists for capitalists. The compositors, too, are of a better class than you will find on the Pacific Coast; they dress better, live better and are better citizens than you will find in other places, even at twelve and a half cent beer is not indolence enough for them to take on "jag."

I second your motion and "I," and "me," and "me too," and "all of us." Thus cried these gentlemen.

E gets on a chair and thus addresses the assembly: "Gentlemen, let's form a Business Committee, I name myself as Boss you HEAD LUNA, H from far "Lamp House" SECRETARY.

After much fuss and noise, the Committee thus was formed. "You must consider this a Republican Committee with all powerful and absolute say Stentoriously says E. After having retired to an adjacent room they returned as solemn as a Jury when about to give a verdict. Up stands E: "Gentlemen here present, you know that to run this here "machinery" to suit ourselves, we have to run it ourselves. So we, the "Triumvirate Committee" as with absolute power in us invest—appoint "Myself" to be (?) Another Bit of American History.

After the election of November 1872, the good people of Louisiana had to witness the spectacle of inaugurating two governor for the same State at one and the same day. The republican governor William Pitt Kellogg was inaugurated at the St Louis Hotel, then used as a Statehouse, while the democratic governor John McEnery was inaugurated at the Lafayette Square, opposite the City Hall with Headquarters at the Oddfellows Hall—the State Legislature was about equally divided and consequently none of the opposing parties were able to muster a quorum, and so it happened that the affairs of government came to a stand still.

U. S. Grant, who for his reelection to his second term needed the electoral vote of the State of Louisiana, recognized the republican governor Kellogg and dispersed by force the McEnery government.

The people acquiesced for some time in the most extravagant and infamous reign of the Kellogg government until they resolved to put a speedy end to it; consequently on the 14th of September 1875 the New Orleans morning papers called for a Mass-meeting at 12 o'clock noon on Canal Street in front of the Clay Statue;—the people responded, and an hour appointed there were about 10000 people assembled Judge J. S. N. Smith addressed the assemblage from the balcony of the Crescent Hall opposite the Clay Statue—setting forth that the local press had already sufficiently discussed and explained the malpractice and misdeeds of the present Carpetbag-Government and believing that everyone present was well informed of all the facts, he thought it superfluous to go over the field again, therefore, he said: "now I want you to go home and take your dinner and be back here at 2 o'clock with your rifles—now go and do as I have told you."

The people went home for their dinner and at 2 o'clock they were in position and had turned out their mercenary forces—but nevertheless at 4 o'clock in the afternoon the City and State were in the hands and in full possession of the people, and of the former Carpetbag-government not the slightest trace could be found anywhere.—Two hours work of brave people had accomplished this.

The loss on the peoples side were eight dead—and on the opposite side—well their dead had to be carried away by the Cart-loads—big General Longstreet who had cast his lot with the Carpetbaggers, seceded from the field of battle as his horse could carry him—another worthy of the same sort General Badger who lay prostrate on the ground, shot through his legs, begged for his life in the moment that another rifle was leveled at him to give him the "coup-de grace"—the usurper Kellogg had sought refuge, at the U. S. Customhouse where he kept himself in hiding;—thus ended the affair on that memorable day. But however, the occurrence was witnessed at Washington and U. S. Grant

sent a very polite message to New Orleans, stating, that he would grant 48 hours to return the Government to Kellogg otherwise he will use his troops for that purpose etc.—and so the people had to acquiesce in the unavoidable and turned the government back to the usurper Kellogg, but telling him, that now he had to carry on the government for the balance of his term on his own expenses as the people of Louisiana would positively refuse to pay any taxes to any Usurper

A Tax resister-association was formed immediately and not a solitary dollar of taxes paid into the treasury during Kelloggs unexpired term.—Sic semper tyrannis. LOUISIANA.
