Patients at a Public Dispensary.

If there is any more mournful sight afforded by the daily routine of the great town than the gathering at a public dispensary, I do not think that I care to be introduced to it. An hour in the dispensary of one of our hospitals the other morning was enough for me. It was a melancholy crowd that appealed to the ministrations of the place, but without exception a crowd made up of decent poverty. The couple of doctors were very business-like, but neither brusque nor inconsiderate, and in several specially pitiful cases exhibited decidedly unprofessional sympathy and feeling.

One of the physicians informed me that the greatest difficulty they have to contend with is to get their patients to take medicine intelligently. Their ignorance is almost as deplorable in most cases as their misery. Where dangerous medicines are to be administered the doctors are always afraid of the results till the patients are up again to prove conclusively that they have not overdone themselves. It is a custom in the dispensary to charge for medicines at their cost price—itsself the merest trifle, generally, if the patient can afford to pay it. The poorest people, says my doctor, will always and willingly pay for prescriptions if they can possibly scrape the money together; but there are others who can well afford the expense who try to wheedle help out of the dispensaries when they should be buying it at the drug stores.—Alfred Trumble in New York News.

Aniline Colors Unsuitable for Painting.

In a paper on the action of light upon pigments employed in painting, an Edinburgh artist states that his experiments have led him to the conclusion that Prussian blue is the most stable of colors. He asserts, however, that it would never do to employ the finest aniline pigments upon the same canvas with the stable Prussian blue—painting one portion of a picture with the latter.

In fact, the aniline colors are found to be, for the most part, quite unsuitable for painting purposes, and some of them, as is well known, are so changeable in the sunlight as to be used in the production of photographic images. They are also extensively employed for coloring photographs, their thin transparent character rendering them particularly suitable for the purpose, it being possible to see the shades and outlines of the image beneath the layer of color. Nevertheless, photographs tinted in this way soon lose their bloom, and the colors are often seen fading while the pictures are yet exposed for sale in the shop windows.—Boston Transcript.
